Allowed foods: non-potentially hazardous items. Local ordinances are not preempted; producers must verify Polk County and Crookston city zoning for home occupation rules.)

No specific state prohibition; standard food safety practices apply.

RESEARCH NOTES

Rural northwestern Minnesota county. State baseline governs; no Polk County-specific cottage food ordinance found. MDA administers registration. The 2025 amendment raised the cap to \$78,000 (CPI-indexed). Local zoning compliance required.

State context — Minnesota cottage food law

Polk County's rules sit on top of Minnesota's state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

INDIRECT SALES

No — Sales are limited to direct-to-consumer channels: community events, farmers markets, from the producer's home, online (in-state delivery by the producer personally or by mail/commercial delivery), and fundraising donations. Restaurants, retail stores, roadside stands, mail order wholesale, and catering are prohibited. All deliveries must be made by the producer personally unless shipped by mail or commercial delivery upon a prior online sale. Home-canned products in the pH/water-activity exemption category (Subd. 1(a)(2)) may not be sold outside of Minnesota.
