- ☐ **1. Menu** — Confirm each product under North Carolina cottage food rules (county cannot expand a state ban).
- ☐ **2. Pickup & zoning** — Home occupation and porch pickup cells above; HOA/lease may still block customer traffic.
- ☐ **3. Local tax / license** — Business license or sales tax certificate if your city/parish requires it (common even with no state food permit).
- ☐ **4. Training** — Food handler or state registration before market day.
- ☐ **5. Labels** — Disclaimer, allergens, ingredients, net quantity, producer info.
- ☐ **6. Call if unclear** — County health and planning for your exact address.

LABEL FIELDS TO INCLUDE

- ☐ Product name · producer name · address (or allowed alternative)
- ☐ Ingredients by weight · major allergens · net weight/quantity
- ☐ North Carolina home-kitchen disclaimer (see live label one-pager)

HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED

Yes — Home kitchen must pass annual inspection by NCDA&CS. Pets in the home disqualify the applicant entirely. Products must be shelf-stable; no refrigerated or frozen products allowed.

SEPARATE DEDICATED KITCHEN

PET RESTRICTIONS

No pets allowed in the home at all — any pets in the home disqualify the applicant from the NC home processor program.

WATER SUPPLY

Potable water supply required. Private well users must verify water safety.

HANDWASHING

Required per NCDA&CS home kitchen inspection standards and 21 CFR 117 Subpart B (GMP).

FOOD STORAGE

All products must be shelf-stable. No refrigeration required for finished products. Ingredients and products stored per good manufacturing practices.

Inspection & permitting

INSPECTION REQUIRED

Yes — Annual inspection by NCDA&CS Division of Food and Drug Protection required before registration is issued and annually thereafter.

HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT

Varies — NC state program requires checking with local county planning/zoning department before starting. Bladen County is a rural southeastern NC county. Zoning ordinance governs unincorporated areas; Town of Elizabethtown may have additional requirements. No Bladen County-specific cottage food ordinances found via research.

State context — North Carolina cottage food law

Bladen County's rules sit on top of North Carolina's state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

Yes — Home processors may sell to retail stores, restaurants, and directly to consumers. Sales at farmers markets are permitted. Labels are required for wholesale and packaged self-service retail; direct hand-to-consumer sales (e.g., from home or at events) may be exempt from affixed labels if ingredient info is available on request. NC requires annual home kitchen inspection, which is unusual among no-cap states.
