No specific pet restriction in Ohio state cottage food law.

HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED

Yes — Ohio cottage food law allows production of approved non-potentially-hazardous foods in a home kitchen with no sales cap and no registration. Products must be labeled per O.R.C. §3715.023. Sales within Ohio only. Direct and indirect (retail) sales both permitted. Ottawa County zoning may apply to home-based businesses in unincorporated areas.

PET RESTRICTIONS

No specific pet restriction in Ohio state cottage food law.

WATER SUPPLY

No specific water testing requirement in Ohio cottage food law.

HANDWASHING

No specific statutory handwashing mandate beyond good manufacturing practices.

FOOD STORAGE

Non-potentially hazardous, shelf-stable foods only per OAC 901:3-20-04 approved product list.

Inspection & permitting

INSPECTION REQUIRED

No — ODA has sampling authority; no routine inspection required.

HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT

Varies — No state-level permit required. Ottawa County zoning resolutions may require a home occupation permit for unincorporated areas. Contact Ottawa County Regional Planning Commission in Port Clinton for local requirements.

ON-SITE CUSTOMER PICKUP	Conditional
ON-SITE SIGNAGE	Conditional
DELIVERY / PICKUP RULES	Direct sales (home, farmers markets, events) and indirect sales to licensed retail food establishments permitted within Ohio. No out-of-state sales.
MAX EMPLOYEES IN HOME	Not specified in state statute.

Relevant county code

No county-specific cottage food ordinance identified. State law (O.R.C. §3715.025 and OAC Ch. 901:3-20) governs.

RESEARCH NOTES

Ottawa County is on Lake Erie in northwest Ohio, including Put-in-Bay area. Tourism-oriented economy may support cottage food farmers market sales. No county-specific cottage food or home occupation ordinance found. Defaulted to Ohio state baseline at medium confidence.

State context — Ohio cottage food law

Ottawa County's rules sit on top of Ohio's state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

Yes — Labeled cottage food products may be sold to or used by retail food establishments and food service operations licensed under Ohio Revised Code Chapter 3717. This enables indirect/wholesale sales within Ohio. Products may not be sold outside the state of Ohio.
