HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED?

Yes (Oklahoma Homemade Food Freedom Act (2 O.S. §5-4.1 through §5-4.6): \$75,000 annual sales cap. No registration, no inspection required. Non-TCS foods (pH ≤4.6 or aw ≤0.85) fully exempt from licensing. TCS foods allowed with food safety training completion. Prohibited: alcoholic beverages, unpasteurized milk, cannabis/marijuana products.)

PETS ALLOWED?

No specific restriction under Oklahoma Homemade Food Freedom Act.

HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT?

Varies (Rogers County (Claremore) may have local home occupation zoning requirements. Oklahoma state law does not preempt local zoning for cottage food. Operators should check with Rogers County planning.)

PET RESTRICTIONS	No specific restriction under Oklahoma Homemade Food Freedom Act.

HANDWASHING	No specific statutory requirement; food safety training covers food safety practices.
FOOD STORAGE	Non-TCS foods are broadly allowed; TCS foods require food safety training before sale.

Customer-facing rules

ON-SITE CUSTOMER PICKUP	Yes
ON-SITE SIGNAGE	Conditional
DELIVERY / PICKUP RULES	Direct and indirect sales allowed per Oklahoma Homemade Food Freedom Act. Retail, online, farmers markets, events all permitted for non-TCS foods. TCS foods require food safety training and direct sale to informed end consumer.
MAX EMPLOYEES IN HOME	No limit specified in Oklahoma Homemade Food Freedom Act.

Relevant county code

No Rogers County-specific cottage food code identified.

RESEARCH NOTES

No Rogers County-specific cottage food rules found. Oklahoma’s Homemade Food Freedom Act (2021, HB 1032) is among the most permissive state laws. Rogers County is in the Tulsa metro area. State tier ‘Freedom’ reflects very permissive baseline. The state dept URL returned 404 during research; the enrolled bill PDF and OSDH policy letter were used as primary sources.

State context — Oklahoma cottage food law

Rogers County's rules sit on top of Oklahoma's state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

INDIRECT SALES

Limited (see notes) — Sales are permitted on site, by delivery, at farmers markets, through cooperatives, and through membership-based buying clubs. The Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry may promulgate rules to allow sales at other locations or by other means. County ordinances may regulate but may not conflict with or impede the Act. For TCS foods, the producer must complete an approved food safety training (e.g., ServSafe Food Handler Training, max 8 hours, available online) before selling.
