- ☐ **1. Menu** — Confirm each product under South Carolina cottage food rules (county cannot expand a state ban).
- ☐ **2. Pickup & zoning** — Home occupation and porch pickup cells above; HOA/lease may still block customer traffic.
- ☐ **3. Local tax / license** — Business license or sales tax certificate if your city/parish requires it (common even with no state food permit).
- ☐ **4. Training** — Food handler or state registration before market day.
- ☐ **5. Labels** — Disclaimer, allergens, ingredients, net quantity, producer info.
- ☐ **6. Call if unclear** — County health and planning for your exact address.

LABEL FIELDS TO INCLUDE

- ☐ Product name · producer name · address (or allowed alternative)
- ☐ Ingredients by weight · major allergens · net weight/quantity
- ☐ South Carolina home-kitchen disclaimer (see live label one-pager)

HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED?

Yes (South Carolina allows cottage food from the kitchen of a primary domestic residence (S.C. Code §44-1-145). No registration, permit, or inspection required. The 2022 amendment (Act No. 208) expanded to allow retail store and grocery store sales, online/mail order, and added option to use department-issued ID number in lieu of home address on labels. No sales cap. Operations with net earnings below \$1,500 are exempt from the section entirely. Must label products 'Homemade food, not inspected by the South Carolina Department of Agriculture.')

Home kitchen rules

HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED

Yes — South Carolina allows cottage food from the kitchen of a primary domestic residence (S.C. Code §44-1-145). No registration, permit, or inspection required. The 2022 amendment (Act No. 208) expanded to allow retail store and grocery store sales, online/mail order, and added option to use department-issued ID number in lieu of home address on labels. No sales cap. Operations with net earnings below \$1,500 are exempt from the section entirely. Must label products 'Homemade food, not inspected by the South Carolina Department of Agriculture.'

WATER SUPPLY

No specific requirement under SC cottage food law.

HANDWASHING

Good manufacturing practices apply; adequate handwashing expected.

FOOD STORAGE

Non-potentially hazardous (non-TCS) foods only. Products must be stored safely.

Inspection & permitting

INSPECTION REQUIRED

No — Complaint-based only. SC Dept. of Agriculture (formerly DHEC, transferred July 1, 2024) may inspect upon complaint.

HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT

Varies — No county-specific cottage food overlay identified. Lee County may require a home occupation permit under local zoning for commercial activity in residential zones. Operators should check with county planning or zoning office.

RESEARCH NOTES

State cottage food law (S.C. Code §44-1-145) provides baseline with no sales cap, no registration required, and no inspection required. Food safety oversight transferred from DHEC to SC Dept. of Agriculture effective July 1, 2024 (Act No. 60). Rural SC county in the Pee Dee/Midlands region. SC §44-1-145 governs. No county-specific cottage food restrictions found. County-specific zoning rules not researched at ordinance level. Confidence medium: state rules well-documented; local home occupation rules not confirmed.

State context — South Carolina cottage food law

Lee County's rules sit on top of South Carolina's state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

INDIRECT SALES

Yes — Since the 2022 amendment, home-based food operations may sell to retail stores and grocery stores in addition to direct-to-consumer sales including online and mail order. Retail stores that sell home-based food products must post clearly visible signage indicating the products are not subject to commercial food regulations.
