## QUICK VIEW FOR BAKERS IN THIS COUNTY

**HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED?**

Yes (No license, registration, or inspection required from health department. \$150,000 annual gross sales cap (SB 541, 2025). Almost all non-TCS foods allowed. Label must state 'made in a home kitchen' and include producer's name/address. Jefferson County/Beaumont may require home occupation permit.)

**SEPARATE KITCHEN REQUIRED?**

**PETS ALLOWED?**

Not specified in state statute

**HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT?**

Conditional (Jefferson County and City of Beaumont may require home occupation permit or business license. No county-specific information found. Check with City of Beaumont Planning Division.)

No (Health department may only act to prevent immediate/serious threat to human life)

## Home kitchen rules

<b>HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED</b>	Yes — No license, registration, or inspection required from health department. \$150,000 annual gross sales cap (SB 541, 2025). Almost all non-TCS foods allowed. Label must state 'made in a home kitchen' and include producer's name/address. Jefferson County/Beaumont may require home occupation permit.
<b>SEPARATE DEDICATED KITCHEN</b>	No
<b>PET RESTRICTIONS</b>	Not specified in state statute
<b>WATER SUPPLY</b>	Potable water; no formal testing requirement for cottage food
<b>HANDWASHING</b>	No formal certification required by state
<b>FOOD STORAGE</b>	Non-TCS shelf-stable foods; prohibited: meat, poultry, seafood, ice products, low-acid canned goods, CBD/THC products

## Inspection & permitting

<b>INSPECTION REQUIRED</b>	No — Health department may only act to prevent immediate/serious threat to human life
<b>HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT</b>	Conditional — Jefferson County and City of Beaumont may require home occupation permit or business license. No county-specific information found. Check with City of Beaumont Planning Division.
<b>LOCAL BUSINESS LICENSE</b>	Varies

<b>ON-SITE CUSTOMER PICKUP</b>	Yes
<b>ON-SITE SIGNAGE</b>	Conditional
<b>DELIVERY / PICKUP RULES</b>	Direct and limited indirect sales; farmers markets, online, home delivery, third-party delivery platforms allowed.
<b>MAX EMPLOYEES IN HOME</b>	Not specified in state statute

**RESEARCH NOTES**

Jefferson County TX follows the Texas state baseline. \$150,000 cap from SB 541 (2025). No county URLs provided in input and no county-specific cottage food ordinance found in research. Confidence medium — Texas state law confirmed but no specific Jefferson County .gov source retrieved.

## State context — Texas cottage food law

Jefferson County’s rules sit on top of Texas’s state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

**INDIRECT SALES**  
 Limited (see notes) — Sales must be made directly to consumers or to a 'cottage food vendor' (a new category created by SB 541 in 2025 – a person with a contractual relationship who sells on behalf of the cottage food operation to consumers in-state). Cottage food products may not be sold as ingredients to a food service establishment. No retail grocery store or wholesale sales permitted under the pre-2025 framework; SB 541 (2025) adds the cottage food vendor intermediary option. Products must be delivered to consumer or vendor at point of sale or consumer-designated location.
