Pickles/acidified vegetables (pH 4.6 or lower) subject to separate \$9,000 annual cap.)

HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED	Yes — Non-TCS shelf-stable foods from private home. No registration, permit, or inspection. Direct sales only. Allowed: candies, jams/jellies (not acidified), dried fruits, dry herbs, dry seasonings, nuts, vinegars, popcorn, baked goods, and more. Pickles/acidified vegetables (pH 4.6 or lower) subject to separate \$9,000 annual cap.
SEPARATE DEDICATED KITCHEN	No
PET RESTRICTIONS	No specific VA or Franklin County restriction.
WATER SUPPLY	No specific requirement; primary residence kitchen.
HANDWASHING	No formal state requirement.
FOOD STORAGE	Non-TCS shelf-stable products. Mandatory label: 'NOT FOR RESALE — PROCESSED AND PREPARED WITHOUT STATE INSPECTION'.

INSPECTION REQUIRED	No — VDACS may inspect upon consumer complaint.
HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT	Varies — Franklin County is a rural Piedmont Virginia county. No specific Franklin County cottage food ordinance identified. County may have home occupation zoning provisions. Contact Franklin County government in Rocky Mount.

RESEARCH NOTES

Franklin County is in the Blue Ridge foothills of Virginia. No county-specific cottage food rules found. Virginia state baseline applies. Notable: very low \$9,000 annual cap for pickles/acidified vegetables.

State context — Virginia cottage food law

Franklin County's rules sit on top of Virginia's state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

INDIRECT SALES

No — Products must be sold in person in the Commonwealth to an individual for his own consumption and not for resale or consignment. They cannot be offered for sale to be used in or offered for consumption in retail food establishments. Sales venues are limited to: private home, temporary event (no more than 14 consecutive days), or farmers market. Internet advertising is explicitly permitted but sales must remain in-person and in-state.
