## QUICK VIEW FOR BAKERS IN THIS COUNTY

**HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED?**

Yes (Virginia Home Kitchen Food Processing Exemption (Va. Code §3.2-5130) permits direct-to-consumer sale of non-TCS shelf-stable foods from a private home. No state permit, registration, or inspection required. No general sales cap; pickles and acidified vegetables (pH 4.6 or lower) capped at \$9,000/year. Sales must be direct to consumers at home, farmers markets, or temporary events (14 consecutive days or fewer). Online sales/ordering prohibited. All products must bear required label including 'NOT FOR RESALE — PROCESSED AND PREPARED WITHOUT STATE INSPECTION.')

**SEPARATE KITCHEN REQUIRED?**

**PETS ALLOWED?**

No specific state cottage food pet restriction.

**HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT?**

Varies (Virginia state cottage food law requires no permit. Greene County may require a local business license. Contact Greene County administrator for local requirements.)

**INSPECTION REQUIRED?**

No (VDACS may inspect upon consumer complaint.)

## Home kitchen rules

<b>HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED</b>	Yes — Virginia Home Kitchen Food Processing Exemption (Va. Code §3.2-5130) permits direct-to-consumer sale of non-TCS shelf-stable foods from a private home. No state permit, registration, or inspection required. No general sales cap; pickles and acidified vegetables (pH 4.6 or lower) capped at \$9,000/year. Sales must be direct to consumers at home, farmers markets, or temporary events (14 consecutive days or fewer). Online sales/ordering prohibited. All products must bear required label including 'NOT FOR RESALE — PROCESSED AND PREPARED WITHOUT STATE INSPECTION.'
<b>SEPARATE DEDICATED KITCHEN</b>	No
<b>PET RESTRICTIONS</b>	No specific state cottage food pet restriction.
<b>WATER SUPPLY</b>	No specific state cottage food water testing requirement.
<b>HANDWASHING</b>	No specific state cottage food handwashing mandate.
<b>FOOD STORAGE</b>	Non-TCS shelf-stable foods only.

## Inspection & permitting

<b>INSPECTION REQUIRED</b>	No — VDACS may inspect upon consumer complaint.
<b>HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT</b>	Varies — Virginia state cottage food law requires no permit. Greene County may require a local business license. Contact Greene County administrator for local requirements.
<b>LOCAL BUSINESS LICENSE</b>	Likely

### Customer-facing rules

ON-SITE CUSTOMER PICKUP	Yes
ON-SITE SIGNAGE	Conditional
DELIVERY / PICKUP RULES	Direct sales only at home, farmers markets, or temporary events (up to 14 consecutive days). No online ordering, no shipping, no wholesale.
MAX EMPLOYEES IN HOME	Not specified in state statute.

### Relevant county code

No Greene County-specific cottage food ordinance identified. State law governs.

#### RESEARCH NOTES

Greene County is a rural Shenandoah Valley foothills county near Charlottesville. State cottage food law governs. No county-specific cottage food ordinance found.

## State context — Virginia cottage food law

Greene County's rules sit on top of Virginia's state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

Va. Code §3.2-5130

### INDIRECT SALES

No — Products must be sold in person in the Commonwealth to an individual for his own consumption and not for resale or consignment. They cannot be offered for sale to be used in or offered for consumption in retail food establishments. Sales venues are limited to: private home, temporary event (no more than 14 consecutive days), or farmers market. Internet advertising is explicitly permitted but sales must remain in-person and in-state.
