QUICK VIEW FOR BAKERS IN THIS COUNTY

HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED?

Yes (Virginia state cottage food exemption (Va. Code §3.2-5130) applies. Scott County is a rural far southwest Virginia county. No county-specific cottage food ordinance identified beyond standard Virginia home occupation zoning requirements. For the VDACS Home Food Processing permit pathway, written zoning approval from the county is required.)

PETS ALLOWED?

VDACS home food processing permit pathway requires pets excluded from food prep, storage, packaging, and equipment cleaning areas at all times via solid latching doors.

HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT?

Conditional (Scott County likely has standard Virginia home occupation zoning provisions. Contact Scott County Planning (Gate City, VA) for specific requirements. For VDACS home food processing permit, written zoning approval is required.)

HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED	Yes — Virginia state cottage food exemption (Va. Code §3.2-5130) applies. Scott County is a rural far southwest Virginia county. For the VDACS Home Food Processing permit pathway, written zoning approval from the county is required.
SEPARATE DEDICATED KITCHEN	No
PET RESTRICTIONS	VDACS home food processing permit pathway requires pets excluded from food prep, storage, packaging, and equipment cleaning areas at all times via solid latching doors.
WATER SUPPLY	Private water supply requires coliform-free water test results for VDACS home food processing permit pathway.
HANDWASHING	Standard handwashing per GMP for VDACS permit pathway.
FOOD STORAGE	Proper storage to prevent contamination; pet exclusion required for VDACS permit pathway.

Inspection & permitting

INSPECTION REQUIRED	Conditional — VDACS home food processing permit: initial inspection required. Cottage food exemption: no routine inspection; complaint-based only.
HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT	Conditional — Scott County likely has standard Virginia home occupation zoning provisions. Contact Scott County Planning (Gate City, VA) for specific requirements. For VDACS home food processing permit, written zoning approval is required.
LOCAL BUSINESS LICENSE	Conditional

Customer-facing rules

ON-SITE CUSTOMER PICKUP	Conditional
ON-SITE SIGNAGE	Conditional
DELIVERY / PICKUP RULES	Virginia cottage food exemption: direct sales only. Home pickup and local delivery permitted for non-TCS shelf-stable items. Online sales allowed.
MAX EMPLOYEES IN HOME	Virginia state law does not specify a home-based food employee limit. Local zoning may restrict non-resident employee presence.

Scott County Zoning Ordinance (home occupation provisions); Va. Code §3.2-5130 (cottage food exemption); VDACS Home Food Processing regulations

RESEARCH NOTES

State context — Virginia cottage food law

Scott County's rules sit on top of Virginia's state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

INDIRECT SALES

No — Products must be sold in person in the Commonwealth to an individual for his own consumption and not for resale or consignment. They cannot be offered for sale to be used in or offered for consumption in retail food establishments. Sales venues are limited to: private home, temporary event (no more than 14 consecutive days), or farmers market. Internet advertising is explicitly permitted but sales must remain in-person and in-state.
