QUICK VIEW FOR BAKERS IN THIS COUNTY

HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED?

Yes (Nonpotentially-hazardous baked goods, baked and stovetop candies, jams/jellies/preserves/fruit butters, and other nonpotentially hazardous foods identified by rule. No THC ingredients. Only permittee or persons under direct supervision may handle cottage food products or be in the kitchen during processing.)

SEPARATE KITCHEN REQUIRED?

No

PETS ALLOWED?

No persons other than permittee or directly supervised persons allowed in kitchen during processing. This effectively excludes pets from the preparation area.

HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT?

Yes (State-level biennial cottage food permit required from Washington State Department of Agriculture. Clallam County public health administers the inspection component. No Clallam County-specific additional cottage food ordinance found.)

ON-SITE / PORCH PICKUP?

Yes

INSPECTION REQUIRED?

Yes (Annual basic hygiene inspections required. Biennial permit with inspection (\$125 fee plus \$75 public health review + \$30 processing fee).)

Home kitchen rules

HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED	Yes — Nonpotentially-hazardous baked goods, baked and stovetop candies, jams/jellies/preserves/fruit butters, and other nonpotentially hazardous foods identified by rule. No THC ingredients. Only permittee or persons under direct supervision may handle cottage food products or be in the kitchen during processing.
SEPARATE DEDICATED KITCHEN	No
PET RESTRICTIONS	No persons other than permittee or directly supervised persons allowed in kitchen during processing. This effectively excludes pets from the preparation area.
WATER SUPPLY	Potable water required.
HANDWASHING	Food and beverage service worker’s permit required under chapter 69.06 RCW.
FOOD STORAGE	Non-potentially-hazardous shelf-stable products must be stored appropriately.

Inspection & permitting

INSPECTION REQUIRED	Yes — Annual basic hygiene inspections required. Biennial permit with inspection (\$125 fee plus \$75 public health review + \$30 processing fee).
HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT	Yes — State-level biennial cottage food permit required from Washington State Department of Agriculture. Clallam County public health administers the inspection component. No Clallam County-specific additional cottage food ordinance found.
LOCAL BUSINESS LICENSE	Varies

Customer-facing rules

ON-SITE CUSTOMER PICKUP	Yes
ON-SITE SIGNAGE	Conditional
DELIVERY / PICKUP RULES	Direct sales to end consumers only. No internet, mail order, or retail sales outside the state. Cannot sell to restaurants or grocery stores.
MAX EMPLOYEES IN HOME	Only permittee or persons under direct supervision of permittee may handle cottage food products or be in the kitchen during processing.

Relevant county code

RCW §69.22.010-.040; No Clallam County-specific code section found.

RESEARCH NOTES

Clallam County follows Washington State cottage food law (RCW §69.22). Annual inspections and biennial permit required. No county-specific overrides found. Confidence: medium (state law verified, no county-specific ordinance confirmed).

State context — Washington cottage food law

Clallam County's rules sit on top of Washington's state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

STATUTE RCW §69.22.010-.040	ANNUAL SALES CAP —
REGISTRATION REQUIRED Yes	FOOD HANDLER CERT Yes
KITCHEN INSPECTION Yes	DIRECT SALES ONLY Yes
INDIRECT SALES No — Cottage food products may only be sold directly to the consumer. Internet sales, mail order, and retail sale outside Washington state are explicitly prohibited. Products may not be repackaged, sold, or used as an ingredient by a food processing plant, or sold by a food service establishment.
