HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED?

Yes (Summers County has no county-level zoning ordinance. State law governs: nonpotentially hazardous cottage foods are fully exempt from licensing, permitting, and inspection. Potentially hazardous cottage foods require a WV Department of Agriculture permit. All sales must remain within West Virginia. No sales cap.)

RESEARCH NOTES

Summers County is a rural southern WV county with no comprehensive county zoning. WV enacted SB 44 (2026) creating §19-40-1 through §19-40-6 as the operative cottage food law. No county-specific cottage food or home occupation regulations identified. State baseline applies in full.

State context — West Virginia cottage food law

Summers County’s rules sit on top of West Virginia’s state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

INDIRECT SALES

No — Cottage food must be sold directly to consumers. The new Article 40 (effective June 12, 2026) establishes that potentially hazardous cottage food vendors need a statewide permit but nonpotentially hazardous food sellers are fully exempt from permit and inspection. Local health departments may invoke cessation of production only if an imminent health hazard exists, in consultation with the Department of Agriculture. The input batch cited §16-7-1 (a general adulteration statute), but the operative cottage food framework is now Article 40 (§19-40-1 through §19-40-6), signed March 27, 2026.
