Home kitchen rules

HOME KITCHEN ALLOWED Yes — Wyoming Food Freedom Act (§11-49-101 et seq.) permits broad home kitchen sales statewide with no license, permit, or inspection required. Platte County is a rural agricultural county; no county-specific cottage food or home occupation zoning regulations identified. Producer caps: 250,000 units or \$250,000 gross revenue per year.

PET RESTRICTIONS No specific pet restriction in state Food Freedom Act.

WATER SUPPLY No specific state cottage food water testing requirement.

HANDWASHING No specific state Food Freedom Act handwashing mandate.

FOOD STORAGE No licensing, inspection, or packaging requirements under the Food Freedom Act for homemade foods sold to informed end consumers.

INSPECTION REQUIRED No — No routine inspection under Wyoming Food Freedom Act.

HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT No — No county-specific home occupation permit identified for Platte County. Wyoming Food Freedom Act exempts home-based food operations from licensing and permitting.

ON-SITE CUSTOMER PICKUP	Yes
ON-SITE SIGNAGE	Yes
DELIVERY / PICKUP RULES	Sales permitted at farmers markets, farms, ranches, producer’s homes, or any location agreed upon by producer and informed end consumer. Non-potentially hazardous foods may also be sold through third-party retailers. No interstate commerce.
MAX EMPLOYEES IN HOME	Not specified in state statute.

Relevant county code

No county-specific cottage food or home occupation ordinance identified. Wyoming Food Freedom Act Wyo. Stat. §11-49-101 et seq. applies.

RESEARCH NOTES

Platte County is a small rural southeastern Wyoming county. No county-specific home occupation permit or cottage food zoning regulations identified. State Food Freedom Act is the operative law.

State context — Wyoming cottage food law

Platte County’s rules sit on top of Wyoming’s state cottage food framework. The state law sets the floor — counties can add but cannot remove protections.

INDIRECT SALES

Yes — Wyoming’s Food Freedom Act allows considerably broader indirect sales than most states. Non-potentially hazardous foods, eggs, and dairy products may be sold through third-party vendors (retail shops, grocery stores) as long as the sale complies with the Act. The third-party seller must inform consumers that the food is not certified, licensed, or inspected, and non-potentially hazardous foods must be displayed separately from licensed products with a label stating ‘this food was made in a home kitchen, is not regulated or inspected and may contain allergens.’ Potentially hazardous homemade foods (except eggs/dairy) must be sold by the producer or designated agent only. A ‘designated agent’ may also facilitate transactions including marketing, transport, storage, and delivery without taking ownership of the product.
