Wyoming's cottage food rules are set by Wyo. Stat. §11-49-101 through §11-49-104 (Wyoming Food Freedom Act). The summary below is drawn from Crosodo's verified statute research and official agency guidance. Always confirm current requirements on the state agency website before you sell.

## Program basics

### What law governs cottage food in Wyoming?

- Wyoming Statutes Title 11 Agriculture, Livestock and Horticulture, Chapter 49 Marketing Homemade Foods, §§11-49-101 through 11-49-104 (Wyoming Food Freedom Act)

### What is the annual sales cap?

- None

## Allowed products and sales channels

### What foods are allowed?

- Extraordinarily broad: all homemade foods including TCS (potentially hazardous) foods such as dairy, eggs, quiches, pizzas, cooked vegetables, and baked goods with dairy/meat fillings — as long as transactions comply with the Act.
- Non-potentially hazardous foods (jams, pickled vegetables, baked goods without hazardous fillings, candies, granola, etc.) may even be sold through third-party vendors and retail shops.
- Potentially hazardous homemade foods (except eggs and dairy) must be sold by the producer or designated agent directly to the informed end consumer.

### What foods are prohibited?

- Meat products are generally excluded with specific exceptions (poultry up to 1,000 birds/year, live animals, rabbit meat, farm-raised non-cattfish fish, animal shares under §11-49-104). Homemade or uninspected food cannot be served or used as an ingredient in a commercial food establishment.
- Interstate commerce is prohibited. Producers must not exceed 250,000 individual products or \$250,000 gross revenue annually.

### Can I sell to retailers or restaurants (indirect sales)?

- Wyoming's Food Freedom Act allows considerably broader indirect sales than most states. Non-potentially hazardous foods, eggs, and dairy products may be sold through third-party vendors (retail shops, grocery stores) as long as the sale complies with the Act.
- The third-party seller must inform consumers that the food is not certified, licensed, or inspected, and non-potentially hazardous foods must be displayed separately from licensed products with a label stating 'this food was made in a home kitchen, is not regulated or inspected and may contain allergens.' Potentially hazardous homemade foods (except eggs/dairy) must be sold by the producer or designated agent only.

- A 'designated agent' may also facilitate transactions including marketing, transport, storage, and delivery without taking ownership of the product.

## Labeling

### What labeling is required?

- Homemade foods are broadly exempt from labeling requirements (§11-49-103(b)). However, the producer must inform the end consumer (verbally or by sign) that the food is not certified, labeled, licensed, packaged, regulated, or inspected.
- For retail/grocery store sales: non-potentially hazardous foods must be labeled 'this food was made in a home kitchen, is not regulated or inspected and may contain allergens.' Retail spaces selling homemade food must display a sign indicating it has not been inspected.
- Potentially hazardous homemade foods at retail locations adjacent to commercial food establishments require physical separation per §11-49-103(d).

## Statute excerpt

Wyo. Stat. §11-49-101 through §11-49-104 (Wyoming Food Freedom Act)

### What does the Wyoming cottage food statute say?

- 11-49-101. Short title. This act is known and may be cited as the "Wyoming Food Freedom Act." 11-49-102. Definitions.
- (iv) "Homemade" means food that is prepared or processed in a private home kitchen, that is not licensed, inspected or regulated; (v) "Informed end consumer" means a person who is the last person to purchase any product, who does not resell the product and who has been informed that the product is not licensed, regulated or inspected; (vi) "Producer" means any person who grows, harvests, prepares or processes any food or drink products on the person's owned or leased property, does not produce more than two hundred fifty thousand (250,000) individual food or drink products annually and does not exceed two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00) in gross revenue annually from the food and drink products; (x) "Non-potentially hazardous food" means food that does not require time or temperature control for safety including limiting pathogenic microorganism growth or toxin formation.
- "Non-potentially hazardous food" includes, but is not limited to, jams, uncut fruits and vegetables, pickled vegetables, hard candies, fudge, nut mixes, granola, dry soup mixes excluding meat based soup mixes, coffee beans, popcorn and baked goods that do not include dairy or meat frosting or filling or other potentially hazardous frosting or filling; (xi) "Potentially hazardous food" means food that requires time or temperature control for safety including limiting pathogenic microorganism growth or toxin formation.
- "Potentially hazardous food" includes, but is not limited to, foods requiring refrigeration, dairy products, quiches, pizzas, frozen doughs, meat and cooked vegetables and beans. 11-49-103(b). Unless otherwise provided in this section, homemade food products produced, sold and consumed in compliance with the Wyoming Food Freedom Act shall be exempt from state licensure, permitting, inspection, packaging and labeling requirements. 11-49-103(c)(i).
- Transactions shall be directly between the producer and the informed end consumer, except as otherwise provided by this act. A producer may utilize a designated agent to facilitate a transaction. The seller of eggs, dairy products or a homemade food product consisting of non-potentially hazardous food may be the producer of the item, a designated agent of the producer or a third party vendor including a retail shop or grocery store as long as the sale is made in compliance with this act.

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## Executive summary

This report covers the Wyoming cottage food framework — the state statute, the regulatory body administering it, what producers can and cannot sell, and county-level rules layered on top of state law for the 23 Wyoming counties included in this dataset.

### RESEARCH NOTES

Wyoming pioneered the modern food freedom movement when it enacted the original Food Freedom Act in 2015 (coded at W.S. 11-49-101 et seq., NOT 35-7-1701 as stated in the input batch — the correct citation is Title 11, Chapter 49). The Act has been amended several times: 2017 (HB0129, extended to home-processed food and authorized sales at producers’ homes), 2020 (§11-49-103(c)(ii) repealed), and subsequently expanded to allow retail/third-party sales of non-TCS foods. The 2025 version from Teton County WY confirms the current text including the \$250,000 revenue cap and 250,000-unit production cap for producers. Wyoming is the only state that explicitly allows sale of TCS (potentially hazardous) homemade foods including dairy, quiches, cooked vegetables, and eggs without any license or permit. This is the key distinction IJ recognizes with its A rating. The excerpt source URL is from Teton County WY Health Department providing the current codified statute text (2025 version).

3. Prepare labels with the required home-kitchen disclosure (wording varies by state/county).
4. Register with the state if your projected sales or product type requires it (check the registration field).
5. Start with direct sales at farmers markets or on-site — often the easiest path in Wyoming.

### Allowed foods

Extraordinarily broad: all homemade foods including TCS (potentially hazardous) foods such as dairy, eggs, quiches, pizzas, cooked vegetables, and baked goods with dairy/meat fillings — as long as transactions comply with the Act. Non-potentially hazardous foods (jams, pickled vegetables, baked goods without hazardous fillings, candies, granola, etc.) may even be sold through third-party vendors and retail shops. Potentially hazardous homemade foods (except eggs and dairy) must be sold by the producer or designated agent directly to the informed end consumer.

### Prohibited foods

Meat products are generally excluded with specific exceptions (poultry up to 1,000 birds/year, live animals, rabbit meat, farm-raised non-cattfish fish, animal shares under §11-49-104). Homemade or uninspected food cannot be served or used as an ingredient in a commercial food establishment. Interstate commerce is prohibited. Producers must not exceed 250,000 individual products or \$250,000 gross revenue annually.

### Labeling requirements

Homemade foods are broadly exempt from labeling requirements (§11-49-103(b)). However, the producer must inform the end consumer (verbally or by sign) that the food is not certified, labeled, licensed, packaged, regulated, or inspected. For retail/grocery store sales: non-potentially hazardous foods must be labeled 'this food was made in a home kitchen, is not regulated or inspected and may contain allergens.' Retail spaces selling homemade food must display a sign indicating it has not been inspected. Potentially hazardous homemade foods at retail locations adjacent to commercial food establishments require physical separation per §11-49-103(d).

## Statutory text – verbatim excerpt

### STATUTE EXCERPT – VERBATIM

11-49-101. Short title. This act is known and may be cited as the "Wyoming Food Freedom Act."

11-49-102. Definitions. (iv) "Homemade" means food that is prepared or processed in a private home kitchen, that is not licensed, inspected or regulated; (v) "Informed end consumer" means a person who is the last person to purchase any product, who does not resell the product and who has been informed that the product is not licensed, regulated or inspected; (vi) "Producer" means any person who grows, harvests, prepares or processes any food or drink products on the person's owned or leased property, does not produce more than two hundred fifty thousand (250,000) individual food or drink products annually and does not exceed two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00) in gross revenue annually from the food and drink products; (x) "Non-potentially hazardous food" means food that does not require time or temperature control for safety including limiting pathogenic microorganism growth or toxin formation. "Non-potentially hazardous food" includes, but is not limited to, jams, uncut fruits and vegetables, pickled vegetables, hard candies, fudge, nut mixes, granola, dry soup mixes excluding meat based soup mixes, coffee beans, popcorn and baked goods that do not include dairy or meat frosting or filling or other potentially hazardous frosting or filling; (xi) "Potentially hazardous food" means food that requires time or temperature control for safety including limiting pathogenic microorganism growth or toxin formation. "Potentially hazardous food" includes, but is not limited to, foods requiring refrigeration, dairy products, quiches, pizzas, frozen doughs, meat and cooked vegetables and beans. 11-49-103(b). Unless otherwise provided in this section, homemade food products produced, sold and consumed in compliance with the Wyoming Food Freedom Act shall be exempt from state licensure, permitting, inspection, packaging and labeling requirements. 11-49-103(c)(i). Transactions shall be directly between the producer and the informed end consumer, except as otherwise provided by this act. A producer may utilize a designated agent to facilitate a transaction. The seller of eggs, dairy products or a homemade food product consisting of non-potentially hazardous food may be the producer of the item, a designated agent of the producer or a third party vendor including a retail shop or grocery store as long as the sale is made in compliance with this act.

The state statute above sets the floor. Each county may add a home-occupation permit, business license, or zoning rule on top of state law. The 23 Wyoming counties below are listed alphabetically (Crosodo Index\* shown for reference — see methodology at end of report). The Crosodo Index is our internal ranking of U.S. counties by how permissive the combined state + county rules are for home cottage food operations.

#### RESEARCH NOTES

Albany County has a county zoning resolution that includes a Home Business Permit requirement. The City of Laramie (county seat) has more detailed home occupation standards in its UDC. Wyoming Food Freedom Act is the operative state law — no license, inspection, or cap for homemade foods sold within Wyoming to informed consumers. Revenue cap of \$250,000/year and production cap of 250,000 units applies.
