Dental Market Overview: Need For Care

Individuals Eligible for Medicare

- Majority (65%-71%) have no dental coverage
- Many (34%-49%) have not been to the dentist in the past year
- 19% of those using dental services spent \$1000+ out-of-pocket

Connections between oral health and overall health

- Dry mouth is side effect of many medications
- Many diseases interrelated with oral health (diabetes, osteoporosis)
- Higher rates of edentulism, untreated caries and periodontal disease among seniors

Medicare Limitations

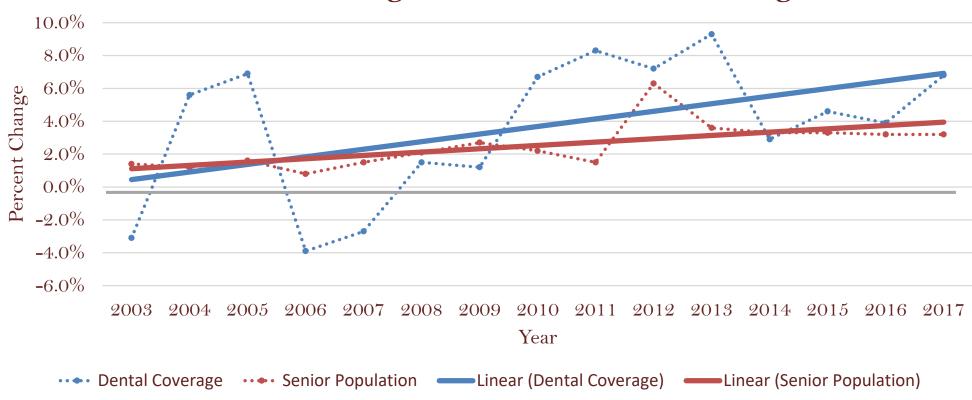
- Statutory exclusion of routine dental care, dental prostheses
- Very limited circumstances when dental services covered

Efforts to add Dental to Medicare

- Cardin January 2019 (S. 22)
- Roybal-Allard January 2019 (H.R. 576)
- Oral Health America ceased operations February 2019



Historical Changes in Senior Dental Coverage



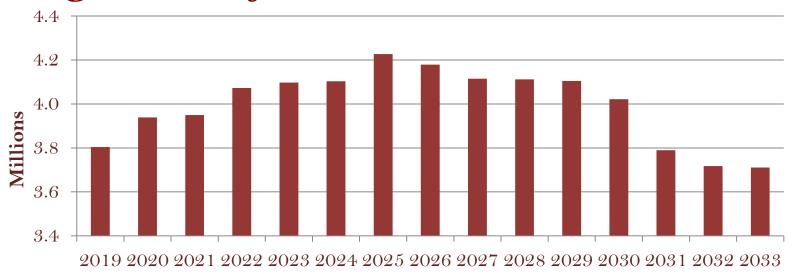

Turning 65 - Projected





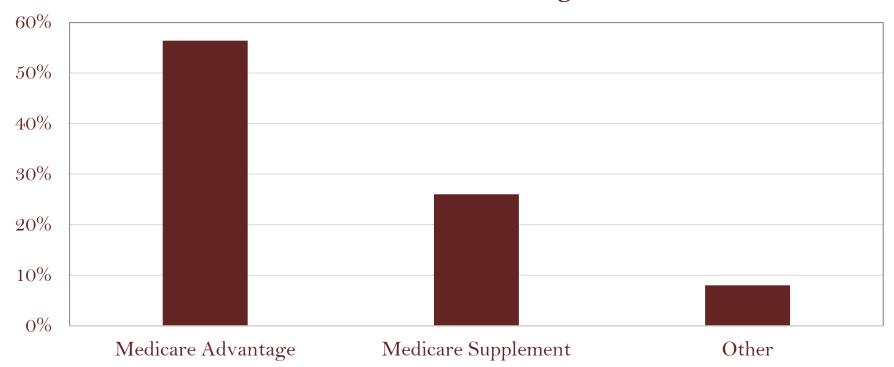
Public Programs

- Some Medicare Advantage plans embed dental coverage or offer as an option

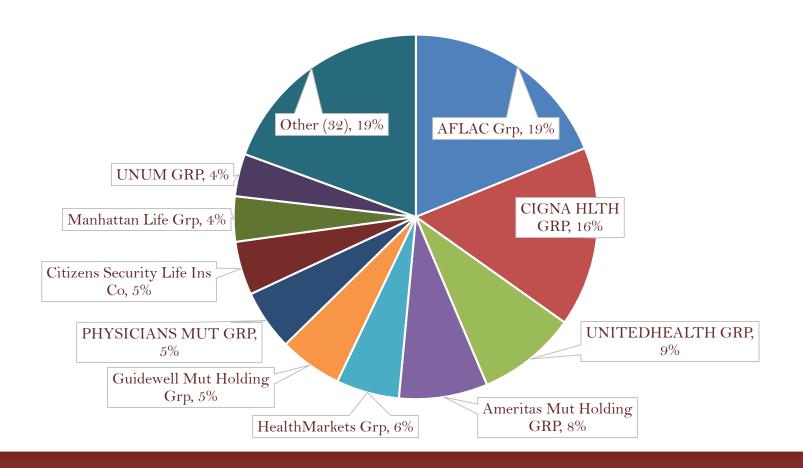

Dental Product Overview

- No standardized set of benefits
- Often utilize benefit structure similar to group coverage: annual deductible, annual maximum, waiting periods, coinsurance
- Dental services often divided into Preventive, Basic and Major categories

Other Design Considerations

- Networks
 - Lower fees charged for in-network providers
 - Higher coinsurance for in-network services
 - Payments for services at out-of-network providers may be capped at in-network levels
 - Estimate 55% of individual dental products include network, another 15% offer network as option



Other Design Considerations

- Age Considerations
 - About 40% of individual dental products available only through age 65
 - Two-thirds of products available to seniors have a higher premium rate above age 50 or 60

Dental Market Overview: Projections

Assumptions

- No material change in lapse and replacement rates
- No material change in dental cost, claim and rate increase trends
- Coverage provided will remain materially similar to current offerings
- No significant changes in delivery of dental care
- No significant changes in medical coverage
- No significant changes in the systems providing health care coverage



Dental Market Overview: Projections

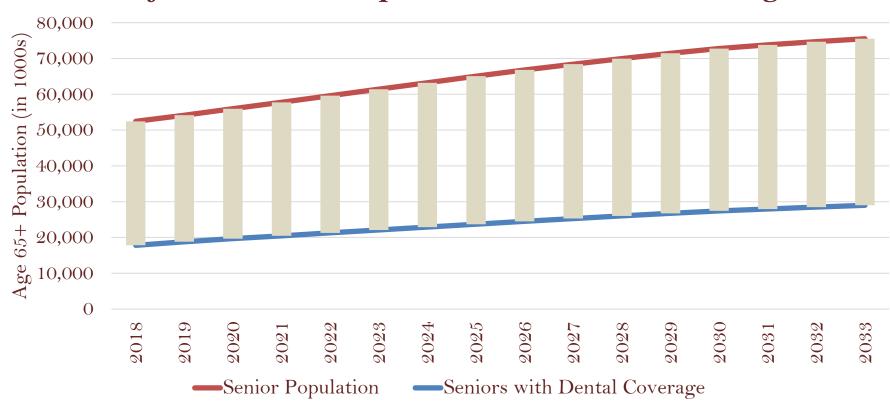
Data & Methodology

- Potential purchasers: only seniors with income exceeding 300% of Federal Poverty Level
- Average annual premium of \$520: typical for individual dental plans currently sold
- Product performance assumptions
 - Loss ratios: 55%-65%
 - Lifetime commissions: 15%-20%
 - Pre-tax profit: 4%-10% of premium
