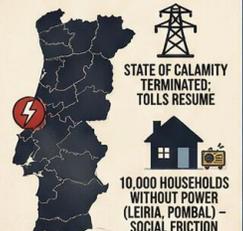

COLLAPSE AND A SHIFTING US-LED
GEOPOLITICAL ORDER

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 15, 2026, marks a critical inflection point for Portugal, defined by the convergence of a decisive national election, a lingering environmental catastrophe, and a redefined role within a volatile international landscape. Domestically, the conclusion of the delayed presidential run-off in storm-ravaged parishes saw António José Seguro secure a commanding victory with 66.83% of the vote, defeating populist challenger André Ventura ([Source](#)). However, this political resolution contrasts sharply with a mounting social crisis in the central regions. The government's decision to terminate the "State of Calamity" and toll exemptions on the same day that 10,000 households remain without power in Leiria has triggered significant friction between central authorities and municipal leaders, who argue that the recovery is far from over ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

Internationally, the Munich Security Conference (MSC) reveals a Europe grappling with a new American paradigm. US Secretary of State Marco Rubio, representing a second Trump administration, has proposed a "new geopolitical order" based on mutual defense among "friends," a move that has met with deep skepticism from European allies concerned about protectionism and the reliability of traditional security guarantees ([Source](#), [Source](#)). Simultaneously, the unveiling of scientific evidence by a five-country coalition regarding the poisoning of Alexei Navalny with a lethal neurotoxin, alongside Trump's "Council of Peace" initiative for Gaza, suggests an erratic but aggressive US approach to global hotspots. In Portugal, the Iranian diaspora has leveraged this climate to demand direct US and Israeli military intervention to topple the regime in Tehran, following reported mass casualties during internal repressions ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Conclusion of the 2026 Presidential Election:** António José Seguro wins the presidency with 66.83% of the total vote (approximately 3.5 million votes), while André Ventura finishes with 33.17% (1.7 million). The final tally was completed after supplemental voting in 20 parishes where the election had been delayed due to severe weather ([Source](#)).

- **Termination of State of Calamity Amidst Infrastructure Failures:** The Portuguese government ended the "State of Calamity" for 68 municipalities affected by Depression Christine. This move terminates toll exemptions on major motorways (A8, A17, A14, A19) despite local protests. In Leiria and Pombal, over 10,000 homes remain without electricity 19 days after the initial storm, forcing reliance on expensive, privately-funded generators ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Munich Security Conference and the "Rubio Doctrine":** US Secretary of State Marco Rubio signaled a shift toward a "mutual defense" model exclusively for US "friends," while Portuguese Foreign Minister Paulo Rangel proposed a massive common market spanning the EU and the Americas to counter Chinese economic dominance ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Navalny Poisoning Investigation Results:** A joint investigation by the UK, France, Germany, Sweden, and the Netherlands concluded that Alexei Navalny was murdered in prison using a neurotoxin. The findings are being submitted to the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Trump's "Council of Peace" for Gaza:** President Donald Trump announced a \$5 billion fund for the reconstruction of Gaza through a newly formed "Council of Peace," contingent on the immediate demilitarization of Hamas ([Source](#)).
- **Iranian Diaspora Demands Military Intervention:** Protests in Lisbon and Porto saw the Iranian community calling for US and Israeli military strikes to destroy the "repressive machine" of the Islamic Republic, citing 40,000 deaths and 200,000 political prisoners during recent unrest ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

- **Geopolitics & International Relations:** The US shift toward transactional alliances is forcing a European rethink of security. DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of Environmental Crisis: The storm Depression Christine has become a political battleground. While the central government is eager to signal a "return to normalcy" by ending the State of Calamity, local mayors are portraying this as an abandonment. This creates a narrative of a "two-speed Portugal": a functional urban core vs. an abandoned, dark (literally and figuratively) rural interior. The mention of "war-like scenarios"

in Montemor-o-Velho and the 75% abstention rate in Bidoeira de Cima suggests that environmental disasters are now primary drivers of political alienation ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

Transactional Geopolitics and the "Council of Peace": The "Rubio Doctrine" presented in Munich reinforces a global trend toward transactionalism. Security is no longer a blanket guarantee but a service for "friends." Trump's "Council of Peace" for Gaza reconstruction bypasses traditional UN frameworks, emphasizing a coalition of ideologically aligned partners (Israel, Argentina, etc.). This mirrors the shift in Portugal's own foreign policy talk of a "Transatlantic Common Market" to hedge against both China and potential US protectionism ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

The Sustainability-AI Nexus: A surprising trend is the integration of high technology into traditional Portuguese industries to drive sustainability. The cork industry (Sufalca) is now using Artificial Intelligence for generative design while achieving 95% energy self-sufficiency via biomass. This indicates that Portugal's path to economic resilience may lie in high-tech refinements of its traditional raw materials (cork, agriculture) rather than strictly new sectors ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect significant civil friction in Leiria and Pombal as toll charges resume while power remains out. Localized protests against E-Redes and the government are likely. Presidential transition ceremonies for António José Seguro will be dominated by his first major test: the storm recovery budget ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The proposed "Calamity Fund" will likely face legislative debate in the Assembly. If reoriented from PRR

funds, it may trigger a conflict with the European Commission over the permitted use of recovery funds. The agricultural sector in the Douro and Mondego will face a liquidity crisis as insurance payouts (currently 75% processed but many contested) fail to cover the 10-million-euro loss ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

Long Term (1-5 Years): A structural shift in the tourism industry is projected, with a possible 10% decline in Southern European visitors due to extreme heat, forcing Portugal to pivot toward "Winter Tourism" (like the current high-occupancy Carnival) and high-value sustainable manufacturing ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

• For International Policy:

- Security: Re-evaluate reliance on US-integrated systems; Rubio's "mutual defense" comments suggest that NATO Article 5 may be interpreted more transactionally in the future ([Source](#)).
- Diplomacy: Engage with the "Council of Peace" framework for Middle East reconstruction, as it appears to be the primary vehicle for US funding in the region ([Source](#)).
- Human Rights: Brace for increased tension with Russia as the Navalny neurotoxin report moves to the OPCW for formal international sanction consideration ([Source](#)).

• For Private Sector/Investors:

- Insurance/Risk: The high volume of contested "total loss" claims from the 2026 storms suggests a need for tighter regulatory compliance and updated risk modeling for climate-related property damage ([Source](#)).
- Energy Infrastructure: Opportunity for investment in micro-grids and residential solar/storage in Central Portugal, as the national grid has proven incapable of rapid recovery from localized disasters ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
