

### DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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February 16, 2026, marks a critical stabilization phase for Venezuela following the US military intervention on January 3, 2026, which resulted in the removal and detention of Nicolás Maduro. The interim administration, led by "Presidenta Encargada" Delcy Rodríguez, is aggressively leveraging the Carnival holiday season to project a narrative of "normalization" and "peace" to the domestic population and international observers. This strategic use of spectacle aims to mask the profound and rapid dismantling of the previous "Bolivarian" state apparatus in favor of a technocratic, market-oriented model aligned with US interests. The rhetoric has shifted from revolutionary resistance to "Bolivarian Peace Diplomacy" and "Geopolitical Judo," where the administration attempts to use the force of the US intervention to its advantage by securing massive infrastructure investments. The day's events highlight a total reconfiguration of the Venezuelan state. While the population is encouraged to celebrate at record-capacity beaches and festivals, the National Assembly is finalizing deep legal reforms, including the Hydrocarbons Law and a controversial Amnesty Law intended to foster "national reconciliation." Behind the scenes, Rodríguez has begun a systematic liquidation of ideological state organs, such as the Misión Robert Serra, signifying an end to the era of grassroots radicalization. Internationally, the US-Venezuela thaw is accelerating, with US Secretary of State Marco Rubio and Secretary of Energy Dan Brouillette signaling a potential \$100 billion investment in the energy sector, even as US rhetoric occasionally floats the provocative idea of Venezuela as a "53rd state." ### MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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- **US Military Intervention Aftermath and the Detention of Maduro:** Official confirmation and continued discussion of the January 3rd "military aggression" and the detention (described by the current administration as "secuestro") of Nicolás Maduro and Cilia Flores. ## Technocratic De-Radicalization
