DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 16, 2026, marks Lithuania's State Restoration Day, a day intended for national unity that is instead characterized by profound strategic anxiety and domestic political turmoil. The geopolitical landscape has shifted dramatically as the U.S. Trump administration continues to pivot away from the post-WWII liberal order toward a transactional "Great Power" model. U.S. Secretary of State Marco Rubio's appearance at the Munich Security Conference provided a chilling clarification of this shift: while invoking "Western Civilization" and shared Christian roots, the U.S. is simultaneously excluding European allies from Ukraine peace negotiations in Geneva and maintaining pressure on Denmark over the acquisition of Greenland. This has forced Lithuanian leadership, specifically President Gitanas Nausėda, to emphasize that Lithuania's "choice of the West" is permanent, even

as the definition of "the West" is being rewritten by Washington ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

Domestically, the political elite is reeling from a massive corruption probe involving the State Plant Service. High-profile searches were conducted in the offices and homes of Democratic leader Saulius Skvernelis and Conservative Kazys Starkevičius. The investigation involves allegations of bribery for phytosanitary transit permits, potentially facilitating smuggling operations. This scandal is unfolding alongside a burgeoning migration crisis; the State Security Department (VSD) has warned that a 1,200% increase in migrants from Central Asia over the last few years has exhausted the department's vetting capacity, creating a "national security gap" that hostile intelligence services are already exploiting. The convergence of these events—U.S. isolationism, elite corruption, and an unmanaged migration surge—suggests a period of significant instability for the Lithuanian state ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Geopolitics & International Relations The core of Lithuania's foreign policy is being tested by a U.S. administration that views NATO through a transactional lens. Secretary Rubio's speech in Munich emphasized that "national interests" now supersede "shared values," a direct challenge to the European Union's foundational principles. The exclusion of Europe from the Geneva peace talks signals a potential U.S.-Russia-Ukraine deal that could leave the Baltic states in a precarious "buffer zone" ([Source](#), [Source](#)). Roberta Metsola, President of the European Parliament, attempted to counter this by asserting that there is "no old or new Europe," only a "Europe of equals," but the reality of U.S. bilateralism with "patriotic" governments in Hungary and Slovakia undermines this unity ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

Corruption & Elite Politics Governance capacity is threatened by a corruption scandal that cuts across party lines. The implication of Saulius Skvernelis, currently one of Lithuania's most popular politicians, and Kazys Starkevičius suggests a systemic issue within the State Plant Service where political "cover"

was allegedly provided for illegal transit operations. This has led to a "moralization vacuum" in the Seimas, as almost all major parties are now implicated in ongoing investigations ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

Migration & Domestic Stability The VSD is sounding the alarm on the "unmanaged" nature of recent migration. Beyond the sheer numbers, the department is concerned about the shift from Belarusian political refugees to Central Asian economic migrants. Director Bridikis noted that hostile actors like ISIS-K operate freely in the home regions of these migrants, and the lack of an integrated "screening to integration" pipeline leaves Lithuania vulnerable to "hybrid kinetic" threats, such as the recruitment of migrants for low-level sabotage or the creation of isolated "ghettos" ([Source](#)).

Legislation and Policy The day saw significant discussion on shifting regulatory frameworks to address both economic needs and security concerns.

- **Small Partnership (MB) Reform:** A proposal to eliminate "Small Partnerships" as a legal form to prevent "tax arbitrage" and unify the tax system. Business leaders warn this will push the small business sector into the shadow economy ([Source](#)).
- **Belarusian Travel Restrictions:** Debate continues over a bill to limit the number of times Belarusian residence permit holders can return home to once per year, citing recruitment risks by Belarusian intelligence ([Source](#)).

LEGISLATION/POLICY

Legislative activity focused on tax harmonization and national security-linked migration controls. Government officials are pushing to streamline business forms, while the security apparatus demands tighter controls on cross-border movement with hostile neighbors ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Review of Legal Business Forms:** A government initiative to reduce the 49 currently registered business forms (including Small Partnerships and Business Licenses) to just three: AB, UAB, and "Mini-enterprise." Proponents claim it ends the "Gvulių ūkis" (animal farm) of unfair taxation; critics call it a death blow to small business ([Source](#)).
- **Migration Control Amendment:** A proposed law to limit Belarusian travel back to Belarus to once per year. The bill was recently rejected but is being reconsidered as security risks rise ([Source](#)).

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Crisis of the "Liberal West" The most significant meta-narrative of the day is the fracturing of the Western alliance. The U.S. has moved beyond mere isolationism to an active redefinition of the West. By invoking "Christianity" and "Culture" over "Democracy" and "Rule of Law," the Rubio/Trump doctrine creates a space where the U.S. can negotiate with Putin over the heads of the EU. Migration as a Proxy for Hybrid War Migration is no longer discussed as a humanitarian or purely economic issue. The VSD's admission that it cannot vet the current volume of arrivals indicates that the "sanitary cordon"

has effectively failed. The concern is that Russia and Belarus are using the "work visa" system as a massive Trojan horse. The recruitment of non-European migrants for domestic sabotage (like the "Flamingo" missile infrastructure or partisan monuments) suggests that Russia is looking for "disposable" agents who do not trigger the same immediate suspicion as Russian nationals ([Source](#)).

The Weaponization of History The release of the Russian "History of Lithuania" book is not an academic exercise but a soft-power offensive designed to demoralize the Lithuanian public. By framing the 1940s resistance as "banditry" and the 1990s independence movement as a "Western plot," Moscow is attempting to erode the internal legitimacy of the Lithuanian state. STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): The STT corruption probe will likely lead to formal charges against high-ranking figures, potentially triggering a collapse of the current coalition if Paluckas or Starkevičius are further implicated. Expect an increase in "anti-migrant" rhetoric in the Seimas as the VSD data enters the public discourse. The Geneva talks will conclude, likely with a U.S.-backed ceasefire proposal that may include territorial concessions for Ukraine, leading to massive diplomatic tension between Vilnius and Washington ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

Medium Term (1-6 Months): A significant tightening of migration laws is inevitable, including mandatory "loyalty" or language exams within one year of arrival. The proposed business tax reforms (MB elimination) will

likely be passed in a modified form to fund increased VSD and military spending, leading to a temporary economic contraction in the startup and small-service sectors. U.S. troops in Lithuania may see their status become a bargaining chip in wider U.S.-EU trade disputes ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

Long Term (1-5 Years): Lithuania will likely lead a "Northern Fortress" bloc (Baltics, Poland, Scandinavia) focused on self-reliance as U.S. reliability continues to fluctuate. The energy sector will see a permanent shift toward localized quantum-secured grids.
