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### MEXICO DEPLOYS DOMESTIC STRENGTHENING STRATEGIES AMID REGIONAL POLITICAL COLLAPSE AND TRANSNATIONAL HEALTH RISKS

#### DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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The reporting for February 17, 2026, reveals a Mexican administration under President Claudia Sheinbaum focused on proactive domestic stabilization through a series of "integral policies" aimed at public health, social order, and cultural sovereignty. This occurs against a backdrop of severe regional instability, most notably the legislative destitution of Peru's interim president and the intensification of aggressive US policies regarding migration and energy security. The Mexican government is attempting to project an image of "State Capacity" by addressing a growing measles (Sarampión) outbreak with a massive vaccination target of 2.5 million doses per week, while simultaneously launching "Boxeando por la Paz," a program that integrates sports into the national labor framework to combat organized crime recruitment ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

On the international front, Mexico is navigating a highly volatile relationship with the United States. While the Secretary of Economy, Marcelo Ebrard, highlights a deepening commercial bond with Canada through a "Plan of Action," the US administration under Donald Trump has shifted to a "War Department" footing, utilizing Big Data to monitor social media critics and maintaining a strict oil blockade on Cuba that has triggered a "national emergency" in the island's healthcare sector ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)). Domestically, the Sheinbaum administration is also dealing with high-profile corruption cases, such as the UK asylum granted to Karime Macías, and internal friction within the Secretariat of Public Education (SEP) following the removal of Marx Arriaga ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

#### MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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- **National Measles Crisis and Mass Vaccination Mobilization:** Mexico has registered 9,487 cases and 29 deaths from measles since February 2025. The government has announced a goal to reach 2.5 million vaccines per week, focusing on Jalisco, Colima, and Mexico City. Authorities emphasize that the outbreak began in communities with low vaccination rates due to religious beliefs ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Political Collapse in Peru:** The Peruvian Congress destituted interim President José Jerí via a motion of censure following scandals over "clandestine meetings" with Chinese contractors and improper hirings. Peru faces a leadership vacuum just two months before scheduled elections, with the legislature now seeking its eighth president in ten years ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

- **Mexican Film Industry Economic Incentives:** The government launched a major fiscal stimulus package for the cinema sector, offering a 30% ISR (Income Tax) reduction for projects filmed in Mexico, capped at 40 million pesos. The policy requires 70% of procurement to be national, aiming to attract international production while securing local jobs ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **US "Big Data" Surveillance and ICE Tactics:** Reports indicate the US Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has intensified data collection from platforms like Google, Meta, and Reddit to identify critics of immigration policy. In Minnesota, ICE agents are reportedly using social media traps, posing as customers to lure and arrest migrant workers ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Crisis in Cuba and Mexico's Humanitarian Response:** A US oil blockade has forced Cuban hospitals to operate at minimum capacity, threatening 32,000 pregnant women. Mexico has responded by sending over 800 tons of humanitarian aid via the ships *Papan* and *Isla Holbox*, though Mexico clarifies it is not currently sending fuel ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Economic Statecraft:** China announced a zero-tariff treatment for imports from 53 African nations starting May 1, 2026. This is analyzed as a strategic move to deepen ties with the continent and counter US/EU commercial pressure ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Corruption and Governance:** Mexico is filing a formal "nota de extrañamiento" (diplomatic protest) to the United Kingdom for granting political asylum to Karime Macías, ex-wife of Javier Duarte, who is accused of defrauding the Veracruz DIF of 112 million pesos ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Domestic Stability & Social Order:** The "Boxeando por la Paz" program will recruit 5,000 professional boxers as instructors for 100,000 youth. Instructors will receive a minimum wage (approx. 9,500 pesos/month) and social security, functioning as a labor-sports hybrid to prevent gang recruitment ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Biosurveillance:** New details on the October 7, 2023, attacks in Israel suggest Hamas used Israeli SIM cards and specific emojis to coordinate troop positions, showcasing the use of civilian technology for tactical military operations ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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- **Geopolitics:** Mexico declined an invitation to join Donald Trump's "Peace Board" for Gaza as a full member, opting for "observer" status through Ambassador Héctor Vasconcelos. The refusal stems from Mexico's formal recognition of Palestine as a state and the board's lack of Palestinian participation ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

- **Legislation:**
  - **Cinema Incentive Decree:** Establishes a 30% ISR reduction for domestic and international film projects in Mexico ([Source](#)).
  - **Electoral Reform Proposal (Mexico):** Scheduled for presentation next week; aims to eliminate proportional representation (plurinominales) lists chosen by party elites and reduce the overall cost of elections ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
  - **Guatemala State of Prevention:** President Bernardo Arévalo replaced a 30-day "State of Siege" with a 15-day "State of Prevention" to continue anti-gang operations without requiring congressional approval ([Source](#)).
  - **40-Hour Work Week (Mexico):** Government officials denied rumors that the reform would lead to lower pay or reduced rest, affirming it as a priority for the "Fourth Transformation" ([Source](#)).

## LEGISLATION/POLICY

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Governance in Mexico is currently defined by a "New Mexican School" (NEM) pedagogical pivot and aggressive fiscal interventions in the cultural and labor sectors. Legislative debates are dominated by upcoming electoral reforms intended to centralize power in popular votes and decentralize it from party leadership.

### BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Electoral Reform Bill (Mexico):** Proposes reducing election costs (described as the "most expensive in the world"), modifying "plurinominal" (proportional representation) lists so that citizens, not parties, choose representatives, and increasing representation for Mexicans living abroad ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

- **National Health Briefing (Mexico):** Sub-secretary Eduardo Clark confirmed 27 million measles doses are currently available, with 20 million more expected by May. He reiterated that vaccination is universal and free, regardless of social security status ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Epstein Files Congressional Hearing (US):** Attorney General Pam Bondi faced intense questioning from Representative Pramila Jayapal regarding the administration's failure to compensate Epstein's victims. - **PROFECO Concert Regulation Briefing:** Authorities announced new rules for concert ticket sales following the "BTS case" (gandalla/unfair sales tactics). ## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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- **The Re-Nationalization of Narrative:** A consistent theme across Mexican health, education, and culture is "Sovereignty." Whether it is the inclusion of more women in history textbooks or the 30% tax break for local film production, the Sheinbaum administration is systematically purging "neoliberal" frameworks in favor of "Humanism." This is framed as "reclaiming the narrative of who we are" ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **The Weaponization of Energy and Big Data:** US policies under Trump are portrayed as increasingly coercive. - **The Death of "The Center" in Latin American Politics:** The total collapse of the Jerí government in Peru, following the falls of Castillo and Boluarte, signals a regional trend where legislative "vacancia" has been normalized as a political weapon. Mexico's own impending electoral reform to weaken party elites reflects a similar distrust of traditional political intermediation ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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- **Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect diplomatic friction between Mexico and the UK over the Karime Macías case. In Peru, the transition to an 8th interim president will likely trigger further civil unrest as public trust in the legislature has evaporated. Vaccination queues in Mexico will grow as Jalisco and Colima reach peak infection rates ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Medium Term (1-6 Months):** The 2026 Midterm elections in the US will be heavily influenced by the fallout from the "Epstein Files" and aggressive ICE tactics, potentially alienating moderate voters. In Mexico, the success of "Boxeando por la Paz" will be measured by the reduction in youth crime indices in participating municipalities ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Long Term (1-5 Years):** China's zero-tariff policy in Africa could structurally realign global trade, forcing the US and EU to reconsider arancelary barriers or lose African market access entirely. Mexico's pivot to "bi-directional" investment with Canada (e.g., Mexican mining in Quebec) may signal a future "North American" alliance that bypasses US isolationist trends ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

- **Humanitarian:** The crisis in Cuba requires an urgent international medical intervention to prevent maternal mortality due to energy shortages ([Source](#)).

- **Film & Tech:** Mexico is now a "Strong Buy" for international film production studios due to the 30% ISR credit and localized infrastructure investments ([Source](#)).
- **Mining:** The bi-directional investment announcement between Mexico and Canada (Quebec) suggests a stabilization of the mining sector and new opportunities for Mexican firms to expand into the Canadian North ([Source](#)).
