




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## STRATEGIC DEFIANCE AND HYBRID DIPLOMACY: IRAN NAVIGATES NUCLEAR TALKS AMIDST REGIONAL ESCALATION AND MILITARY POSTURING

### DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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On February 17, 2026, the Islamic Republic of Iran executed a high-stakes balancing act, engaging in the second round of indirect nuclear negotiations with the United States in Geneva while simultaneously conducting significant naval exercises in the Strait of Hormuz. The diplomatic efforts, mediated by Oman, were described by Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Arakchi as "constructive," yielding a general agreement on "guiding principles." However, this diplomatic path is heavily overshadowed by a climate of "utmost distrust" fueled by the legacy of the "12-day war" in June 2025 and ongoing U.S. military build-ups in the Persian Gulf. Iran remains steadfast in its refusal to negotiate on its ballistic missile program or regional alliances, insisting that talks remain "laser-focused" on uranium enrichment and the comprehensive lifting of economic sanctions.

The day was also marked by a sharp escalation in regional tensions following the Israeli cabinet's approval of a plan to register vast tracts of the occupied West Bank (Area C) as "state property." This move, condemned by over 80 countries and international organizations, is being framed by Tehran and its allies as a de facto annexation and a "continuous declaration of war." Domestically, Iran held nationwide ceremonies to commemorate the "martyrs" of foreign-backed terrorist attacks from January, utilizing the events to project national unity and resilience. The convergence of these events—diplomatic engagement in Europe, military drills at home, and escalating conflict in the Levant—indicates a strategy of "hybrid diplomacy," where Iran uses its military readiness and social cohesion as leverage to extract economic concessions from a Trump administration perceived as erratic and beholden to Israeli interests.

### MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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- **Conclusion of the Second Round of Indirect Nuclear Talks in Geneva:** Iranian and U.S. delegations concluded a brief, two-hour session mediated by Oman. While no final deal was reached, both sides agreed to a set of guiding principles for future drafting. Iran maintains a strict "nuclear-only" agenda, refusing to discuss its defensive capabilities or regional proxies. ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#))

- **IRGC Navy "Smart Control" Drills in the Strait of Hormuz:** For the second consecutive day, the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) conducted naval exercises involving rapid reaction units. The drills aimed to showcase "24-hour intelligence dominance" over the strategic waterway, through which 20% of the world's oil passes, serving as a direct counter-signal to U.S. naval presence. - **Supreme Leader Khamenei Projects Military Defiance:** In a major address, Ayatollah Sayyid Ali Khamenei asserted that the U.S. has failed to defeat Iran for 47 years and warned that even the "strongest military" can be crippled. - **International Condemnation of Israeli West Bank Land Registration:** The Israeli cabinet's plan to register land in Area C was widely denounced as illegal annexation. 80 nations and the UN warned that this would lead to the dispossession of Palestinians and further destabilize the region. ## Legislation and Policy

## LEGISLATION/POLICY

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Legislative discussions centered on the expansion of state control over disputed territories and the tightening of migration controls in the West. Regional policies continue to be defined by the erosion of previous international frameworks, such as the Oslo Accords and the JCPOA, in favor of unilateral actions and "coercive" maneuvering.

## BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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### The Logic of "Positive" Short-Term Diplomacy

A recurring theme is the characterization of the Geneva talks as "positive" and "serious" despite the profound lack of trust between the primary actors. This suggests a tactical pause. Both Tehran and Washington appear to see utility in \*appearing\* to negotiate: Trump to satisfy an anti-war domestic base and stabilize oil markets, and Iran to stave off immediate military aggression while its "resistance economy" attempts to manage internal inflation. The establishment of "guiding principles" is a low-stakes win that allows both sides to return to their capitals without admitting failure,

### Deterrence Through Asymmetric Threat

Iran's strategic narrative has shifted from "strategic patience" to "active deterrence." The emphasis on the ability to sink aircraft carriers and close the Strait of Hormuz is no longer just rhetorical; it is backed by the deployment of hypersonic missiles and drone swarms. The Iranian leadership is betting that the economic cost of a war—estimated to potentially collapse the U.S. dollar and spike global inflation—is a more effective shield than any international treaty. ### The "Real Estate" Approach to Conflict Resolution

The "New Gaza" plan and the West Bank land registration represent a "tycoon's approach" to geopolitics, where territorial disputes are treated as real estate ventures. Critics argue this ignores the civilizational and religious identity of the land, viewing it instead as a "playground for the wealthy" built on the ruins of a destroyed society. This theme highlights a fundamental disconnect between the "transactional" nature of current U.S. policy and the "ideological" resistance of the regional axis. ### Fracturing of the Western Alliance

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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### Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- **Diplomatic Continuity:** Expect a third round of indirect talks to be announced shortly. Both sides will exchange draft texts, though actual concessions will be minimal. ([Source](#))
- **Regional Volatility:** As Ramadan approaches, expect heightened tensions in the West Bank and at Al-Aqsa Mosque due to increased Israeli security measures and settler provocations. ([Source](#), [Source](#))

### Medium Term (1-6 Months)

### Long Term (1-5 Years)

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy

- **Security:** The risk of "accidental" escalation in the Strait of Hormuz is extremely high. International maritime monitoring must be prioritized to avoid a localized incident triggering a regional war. ([Source](#), [Source](#))
- **Diplomacy:** Mediators (Oman/Turkey) should focus on "compartmentalization"—keeping the nuclear file strictly separate from regional issues—as this is the only path currently acceptable to Tehran. ([Source](#), [Source](#))
