DAY OF THE JANUARY CRACKDOWN

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

On February 18, 2026, the Iranian state finds itself at a critical juncture, attempting to synchronize a desperate diplomatic overture in Geneva with a persistent, violent crackdown on domestic dissent. The "two-track" strategy is evident as Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi engages in indirect negotiations with the Trump administration's envoys, including Steve Witkoff and Jared Kushner, offering significant nuclear concessions—reportedly a 3-to-5-year enrichment freeze—in exchange for immediate sanctions relief. This diplomatic flexibility is sharply contrasted by Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei's bellicose rhetoric, in which he threatened to sink US aircraft carriers and insisted that missile programs remain non-negotiable, a posture likely intended to pacify hardline domestic elements and maintain a position of "asymmetric" strength ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

Domestically, the regime is struggling to contain the "Chehellum" (40th-day) memorials for the thousands killed during the "Dey month" (January 2026) protests. Despite heavy security presence, renewed demonstrations broke out in Mashhad, Abadan, and Tehran, with security forces reportedly firing on mourners. Khamenei's attempt to bifurcate the victims—classifying some as "martyrs" and others as "seditionists"—reveals a sophisticated narrative-capture strategy designed to erode the unity of the protest movement. Simultaneously, the state is accelerating its "National Internet" project, utilizing Chinese and Russian technology to create "white lists" and produce "synthetic traffic" to mask digital suppression and maintain control over the flow of information during periods of unrest ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

LEGISLATION/POLICY

Recent policy shifts in Iran focus heavily on digital isolation and the formalization of repressive measures under the guise of "national security."
