

TAIWAN: STRATEGIC VULNERABILITY & DOMESTIC FRICTION AMIDST US-CHINA RAPPROCHEMENT

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

The lunar new year period of 2026 is characterized by a profound sense of strategic anxiety and domestic friction in Taiwan. Central to the day's discourse is the stall of a 1.25 trillion TWD defense special budget, exacerbated by reports that US President Trump is actively consulting with Chinese leader Xi Jinping regarding arms sales to Taiwan. This development suggests a potential shift in the US-Taiwan-China triangular relationship, with critics fearing that Taiwan's defense needs are being subordinated to US-China trade negotiations. Domestically, the "Year of the Horse" holiday has exacerbated systemic weaknesses in pub-

lic health and civil order. A widespread Norovirus outbreak and rising flu cases have pushed the emergency medical system to a breaking point, leading to a public feud between frontline physicians and Ministry of Health and Welfare (MOHW) officials regarding ICU bed shortages. Political maneuvering for the 2026 local elections is already visible, with President Lai Ching-te and other key figures like Han Kuo-yu and Lu Shiow-yen leveraging holiday appearances to consolidate support, even as the President himself was involved in a highly publicized incident involving a sick temple official ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

- **Erosion of Strategic Autonomy in Defense Procurement:** The 1.25 trillion TWD defense special budget remains deadlocked in the legislature. Reports indicate President Trump is coordinating with Xi Jinping on "sensitive" arms sales, potentially violating the Six Assurances. - **Regional Infrastructure Dominance:** Completion and progress on the Shenzhong Link (trans-oceanic bridge), the Motuo Hydroelectric Station (planned to be three times the size of Three Gorges), and high-speed rail integration in Henan demonstrate the PRC's continued focus on critical infrastructure as a pillar of national power ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **2026 Local Election Pre-positioning:** Key political actors are using the Lunar New Year to test narratives. The friction between President Lai and local candidates during temple visits, and the "Ma-bu-ting-ti" (non-stop) schedule of Mayor Lu Shiow-yen, indicates that the 2026 municipal elections are the primary driver of current domestic political activity ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

- **Geopolitics:** The US-China-Taiwan relationship is in a state of flux. LEGISLATION/POLICY

Legislative activity is currently dominated by the massive defense procurement bill and the fallout from healthcare management policies during the Lunar New Year. There is a clear tension between the executive's desire for rapid military modernization and the legislative opposition's skepticism regarding the terms of US support.

- **1.25 Trillion TWD Defense Special Budget:** A proposed massive expenditure for military hardware, currently stalled due to concerns over US-China back-channel negotiations and the quality of equipment being offered ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **UCC (Urgent Care Center) Policy:** A newly implemented medical triage system criticized by healthcare professionals for increasing administrative burdens during the Norovirus outbreak without providing additional resources ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **South Korean Aviation Safety Regulation:** New airport regulations in South Korea (Incheon, Gimhae, Jeju) regarding the transport of disposable hand warmers, requiring them to be in carry-on luggage only ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Malta Residency-by-Investment Policy:** Updated investment criteria requiring a 5-year rental at 500,000 TWD/year plus government donations to obtain residency rights ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Transactionalization of Taiwan's Security: The most critical trend is the apparent shift in US foreign policy. Meanwhile, Taiwan's transcripts focus more on the human and political friction resulting from technology, such as the "Norovirus" spread and "exploding" restaurant equipment ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

- **Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Continued political fallout from the medical bed shortage; potential for a legislative showdown over the defense budget once the holiday period ends. Norovirus cases likely to peak as people return to urban centers from holiday travel ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Medium Term (1-6 Months):** Possible diplomatic formalization of a US-China "understanding" on Taiwan arms sales, which could lead to significant social unrest or a political realignment in Taipei. The 2026 election campaigns will shift from holiday optics to policy attacks ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Long Term (1-5 Years):** China's massive infrastructure projects (Shenzhong Link, Motuo Station) will alter regional energy and logistics dynamics, further integrating the Greater Bay Area and increasing the PRC's strategic depth. Taiwan will face persistent challenges in maintaining its technological edge as China's AI commercialization accelerates ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

- **For International Policy:** The US-China dialogue on Taiwan's defense budget suggests that traditional allies must prepare for a more transactional US foreign policy.
