

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DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 19, 2026, marks a pivotal shift in the global order as the United States, under President Donald Trump, formally inaugurated the "Board of Peace" in Washington DC. This body, which effectively functions as a transactional alternative to the United Nations, aims to oversee the reconstruction of Gaza and the deployment of an international stabilization force. While the U.S. pledged \$10 billion and several Arab and Muslim nations committed billions more, the board remains controversial for its lack of Palestinian representation and the exclusion of major European allies. The convergence of this summit with a renewed 10-day ultimatum to Iran over its nuclear program suggests a strategy of using centralized, personalist diplomacy to bypass traditional multilateral institutions while maintaining a high-risk military posture in the Middle East.

Simultaneously, the day was characterized by a historic legal reckoning for global elites. In the United Kingdom, Andrew Mountbatten-Windsor (formerly Prince Andrew) was arrest-

ed on suspicion of misconduct in public office, specifically for allegedly sharing confidential government trade information with the late sex offender Jeffrey Epstein. In South Korea, former President Yoon Suk-yeol was sentenced to life in prison for insurrection following his 2024 martial law attempt. These developments, alongside Meta CEO Mark Zuckerberg's testimony in a landmark trial regarding social media addiction in children, indicate a crumbling of the historical protections afforded to political, royal, and technological leaders. The era is increasingly defined by the collision of populist governance, the erosion of the "rule-based" international order, and a new global standard of legal accountability for high-profile figures.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Inauguration of the Board of Peace and Gaza Reconstruction Plan:** President Trump presided over the first meeting of the board, announcing \$17 billion in total pledges (\$10 billion from the US, \$7 billion from partners like Qatar, Saudi Arabia, and Kuwait) for Gaza. - **US Ultimatum to Iran Amid Military Buildup:** President Trump issued a verbal deadline of 10 to 15 days for Iran to reach a nuclear deal, warning that "bad things will happen" if they do not. - **Arrest of Andrew Mountbatten-Windsor:** The younger brother of King Charles was arrested and questioned for "misconduct in public office." Allegations based on unredacted Epstein files suggest he shared sensitive UK government trade memos with Jeffrey Epstein within minutes of receiving them. - **South Korean Insurrection Verdict:** Former President Yoon Suk-yeol received a life sentence for his failed 2024 martial law declaration. - **UN Findings of Genocide in Sudan:** An independent UN investigation concluded that atrocities committed by the Rapid Support Forces (RSF) in El Fasher, Sudan, bear the "hallmarks of genocide." - **Domestic Stability & Civil Unrest:** Argentina faced a massive nationwide strike against President Milei's labor reforms, which seek to abolish the minimum wage and ease dismissals. DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Fragmentation of the Post-WWII International Order: The Board of Peace represents a definitive break from the United Nations-led consensus. By creating a parallel structure where Trump acts as "Chairman for Life" and membership is "purchased" with \$1 billion contributions, the US is formalizing a "pay-to-play" model of global security. This has created a rift with traditional European allies who fear the erosion of international law, while attracting Global South and Middle Eastern nations eager for direct access to US power. Resource Conflict and "Disaster Capitalism": In Gaza, the reconstruction plan is heavily focused on real estate value, high-rises, and a "Mediterranean Riviera," which analysts describe as "disaster capitalism." This trend is mirrored in Bosnia, where a \$1.2 billion Canadian-owned mine is accused of poisoning a town with lead, and in Greenland, where the US is pushing for control of rare earth minerals. In these cases, large-scale investment is increasingly prioritized over local

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): The 10-to-15-day deadline given to Iran is the most critical window. If indirect talks in Geneva do not yield a breakthrough on uranium enrichment, the risk of a combined US-Israeli strike on Iranian nuclear facilities is high. Locally, South Korea may face unrest from pro-Yoon demonstrators, while the UK monarchy will face intensified calls for transparency following Andrew's arrest. Medium Term (1-6 Months): The Board of Peace will attempt to deploy the first elements of its stabilization force into the Rafah sector of Gaza.
