POLAND FACES A SYSTEMIC CROSSROADS AS EXECUTIVE-PRESIDENTIAL PARALYSIS COINCIDES WITH AN IMMINENT REGIONAL WAR THREAT IN THE MIDDLE EAST AND A RADICAL SHIFT IN NATIONAL DEFENSE POLICY.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 19, 2026, marked a day of extreme domestic and international volatility for Poland. Domestically, the "cohabitation" crisis between Prime Minister Donald Tusk's government and President Karol Nawrocki reached a fever pitch following the President's veto of the National Council of the Judiciary (KRS) reform. This move effectively solidifies the legal chaos within the Polish justice system, with the government now threatening a "Plan B" to bypass presidential obstruction. Simultaneously, the governing coalition faces internal fragmentation as the "Polska 2050" party suffered a major split, leading to the creation of a new "Centrum" parliamentary club and triggering a battle over ministerial portfolios. These domestic distractions occur against a backdrop of a massive overhaul

in defense policy, as the government moves to withdraw from the Ottawa Convention to facilitate rapid border mining under the "Shield East" project, funded by the controversial but high-stakes European "Safe" loan program ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

On the global stage, the inauguration of Donald Trump's "Peace Council" in Washington revealed a deepening rift between the U.S. administration and traditional European allies. While Trump touted the council as a superior alternative to the UN, major Western powers—including Poland—maintained only observer status, reflecting skepticism regarding the council's legitimacy and its exclusion of Palestinian representatives. Most critically, the threat of a "hot" conflict in Iran has reached a state of extreme urgency. Prime Minister Tusk issued a rare, direct appeal for all Polish citizens to evacuate Iran immediately, citing intelligence that an attack may be imminent within hours, while joint naval exercises by Iran, Russia, and China in the Strait of Hormuz signal a hardening of the opposing axis ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Presidential Veto of KRS Reform and "Active Farmer" Bill:** President Karol Nawrocki vetoed the legislation intended to restore judge-led elections to the KRS, claiming it would "politicize" the judiciary and create "segregation" among judges. The government viewed this as a deliberate attempt to sabotage the restoration of the rule of law ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

Geopolitics and National Defense

Economic Statecraft and Infrastructure

LEGISLATION/POLICY

Legislative activity was characterized by a sharp divide between the parliamentary majority and the President. While the Senate moved forward with critical defense funding, the President utilized his veto power to block

structural reforms in the judiciary and agricultural sectors.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Collapse of Institutional Cooperation

The relationship between the Prime Ministry and the Presidency has transitioned from friction to open systemic sabotage. President Nawrocki's dual veto of the KRS and "Active Farmer" bills suggests a strategy of "total veto," intended to prevent the Tusk administration from fulfilling campaign promises regarding the "Rule of Law." The "Defense-First" National Economy

A significant narrative shift is occurring where national security is being framed as the primary driver of economic growth. The "Project Safe" loan and the "Shield East" fortifications are not merely military projects but are being marketed as massive industrial

stimuli. By promising that 80% of the €44 billion will stay in the Polish and European economies, the government is attempting to build a "Win-Win" strategy that links survival against Russia with industrial modernization. However, the decision to withdraw from the Ottawa Convention signals a grim realism: the government is prioritizing tactical survival over international humanitarian norms, a move that would have been unthinkable five years ago ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

The End of "Working Royal" Immunity

The arrest of Prince Andrew in the UK is being treated in Poland as a landmark moment for global governance and the principle of equality before the law. Analyst commentary suggests that this arrest, specifically on trade-related charges rather than just the well-known sexual abuse allegations, demonstrates that the "Epstein network" had deep state-level implications involving trade secrets and corporate espionage. The Transactional Nature of the "New World Order"

Donald Trump's Peace Council is described by analysts not as a diplomatic forum, but as a "personal project" and "show" designed to bypass international law and the UN. The council's focus on the "Gaza Riviera" and hotel construction, led by developers like Steve Witkoff, highlights a shift toward "transactional diplomacy" where peace is a byproduct of real estate and investment deals. Poland's decision to send only a lower-level observer (Marcin Przydacz) despite the President's desire to go shows the Polish government's

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT
