

AND A SYSTEMIC JUDICIAL
CRACKDOWN ON PROTESTERS.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 20, 2026, marks a pivotal convergence of external existential threats and internal social fragmentation for the Islamic Republic of Iran. US President Donald Trump has issued a 10-to-15-day "meaningful agreement" ultimatum, backed by the mobilization of two aircraft carrier strike groups (the **USS Gerald Ford** and **USS Abraham Lincoln**) and reports that the US military is prepared for a "limited" kinetic strike as early as February 21 ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)). While Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi claims diplomatic progress in Geneva, the White House maintains that Tehran has yet to accept "red line" demands regarding zero uranium enrichment and the cessation of regional proxy support ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

Domestically, the regime is struggling to contain the "Chehelom" (40th-day) memorial cy-

cle for protesters killed during the mid-January (Dey) unrest. These memorials have evolved into a new form of cultural resistance, characterized by the "Dance of Grief" and public defiance of traditional mourning norms ([Source](#), [Source](#)). Concurrently, the state is accelerating its "Digital Suppression" infrastructure, with the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) assuming direct operational control over the internet through the National Information Network (NIN) to prevent further organized unrest ([Source](#), [Source](#)). The judicial system has responded with extreme measures, sentencing at least 26 to 30 individuals to death, including minors, as a deterrent against continued civil disobedience ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **US Strategic Ultimatum and Military Readiness:** President Trump has publicly set a 10-15 day deadline for a "meaningful agreement," failing which "bad things will happen." The Pentagon has reportedly presented options for "limited" strikes aimed at forcing Iran back to the negotiating table, though these could escalate into a campaign for regime change ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **40th-Day Protest Cycle and Cultural Resistance:** Memorials for the victims of the "Dey" (January) protests have become flashpoints for renewed anti-government slogans. - **IRGC Operational Control of National Internet:** The IRGC Intelligence Organization has been tasked with completing the National Information Network. Control is shifting from technical ministries to military-security entities, resulting in a "whitelist" internet model that severely restricts access to the global web ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Judicial Escalation and Execution Threats:** Human rights organizations report at least 30 protesters, including teenagers as young as 17, are in the immediate "danger zone" for execution following summary trials lacking due process ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Silicon Valley Corporate Espionage:** Three Iranian engineers (Samaneh Ghandali, Mohammad Javad Khosravi, and Sorour Ghandali) were arrested in California for allegedly stealing trade secrets from Google and other tech firms to send to Iran ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Wikipedia Information Warfare:** Pro-government actors are reportedly flooding Wikimedia Commons with over 10,000 images from state-run agencies (Tansim, Mehr, Khamenei.ir) to dominate the visual narrative of the protests and influence future AI training datasets ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Domestic Stability & Civil Unrest:** The regime is caught in a "Chehelom" protest loop. Despite heavy suppression in January, the 40th-day cycle suggests that social anger has moved beyond economic grievances to an existential rejection of the ruling order ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Economic Statecraft:** Iran is reportedly offering "economic packages" involving oil and mineral concessions to the US to bypass political concessions, while Trump's domestic economic agenda faced a setback as the US Supreme Court ruled his broad import tariffs illegal ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Critical Infrastructure & Cyber Security:** The transition to the National Information Network (NIN) represents a total decoupling attempt from the global internet, utilizing "Military-Technical" methods to "paralyze" VPNs and circumvention tools ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Energy Security:** Analysts warn that any strike could jeopardize 20-25 million barrels of oil per day passing through the Strait of Hormuz, though markets have currently only priced in a \$5-\$10 "risk premium" ([Source](#)).
- **AI and Technology:** While the US rejects global AI regulation in Delhi to maintain its competitive edge, Iran is being accused of "digital authoritarianism" through collaboration with China and Russia to perfect anti-satellite and jamming technologies ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

- **Geopolitics:** The US is leveraging a "Board of Peace" for Gaza, committing \$17 billion to regional reconstruction, while simultaneously isolating Iran. Israel has warned of an "unimaginable" response if Iran targets it following any US strike ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

LEGISLATION/POLICY

The primary legislative focus remains on the "Cyber Protection Bill" (Tarh-e Sianat), also known as the "Regulation of Cyberspace" bill. This legislation formalizes the handover of internet infrastructure to security and military

bodies, moving the country toward a mandatory "whitelist" model where the default is no connection to the global web ([Source](#)). Additionally, US policy is being challenged by a congressional resolution (introduced by Reps. Khanna and Massie) aimed at preventing the President from striking Iran without a formal declaration of war ([Source](#)).

- **Cyber Protection/Cyberspace Regulation Bill (Tarh-e Sianat):** Mandates the IRGC and the Supreme Council of Cyberspace to "render circumvention tools (VPNs) ineffective" and establishes the National Information Network as the primary infrastructure ([Source](#)).
- **US Congressional War Powers Resolution:** A bipartisan attempt to restrict Trump's ability to initiate kinetic operations against Iran without legislative approval ([Source](#)).
- **US Supreme Court Tariff Ruling:** Struck down Trump's use of "national emergency" laws to bypass Congress on trade tariffs, impacting \$200 billion in trade ([Source](#)).

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

- **The "Limited Strike" Trap:** There is a visible strategic tension between Trump's desire for a "limited strike" to coerce a deal and the risk of a "fragile" theater where any response from Iran or Israel could spark a 2-3 month regional conflict. - **Generational Rupture and the "New Iranian Self":** Analysts describe a "Renaissance" where the younger generation has moved past the revolutionary ideology of 1979 toward a "modern Iranian self" that prioritizes individual dignity (Karamat) and digital connectivity over state-defined religious identity ([Source](#)).
- **The "Digital Intranet" and Intelligentsia Isolation:** By shifting internet control to the military, the regime is moving from "censorship" (blocking specific sites) to "isolation" (a whitelist of allowed sites). This creates a "digital apartheid" where only those with high technical knowledge or state-granted privileges can access the global information sphere ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

- **Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Extremely high risk of a US kinetic event if the 15-day ultimatum expires without a signed "pre-agreement." Internal unrest will likely peak as the remaining 40th-day memorials coincide with the military deadline. Expect the first of the 30 death sentences to be carried out as the regime attempts to secure the "internal front" before a potential external conflict ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

- **Medium Term (1-6 Months):** If a strike occurs, Iran may attempt to obstruct the Strait of Hormuz or target US bases in Qatar/UAE, triggering a spike in oil prices toward \$100+. If a deal is reached, it will likely be a "narrow" agreement focused on enrichment that ignores the deepening domestic legitimacy crisis ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Long Term (1-5 Years):** Structural shift toward a total "China-model" digital sovereignty in Iran. Regime stability will increasingly rely on the IRGC's ability to manage a "sanctioned economy" and an "isolated internet" against a population that has culturally decoupled from the state ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **For Private Sector/Investors:**
 - **Energy:** Firms should prepare for volatility in the Persian Gulf; a 15-day window for a supply-chain-disrupting event is now the baseline scenario ([Source](#)).
 - **Tech/Compliance:** The Silicon Valley arrests signal a heightened risk for Iranian nationals working in sensitive US R&D; firms should review IP protection protocols ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
 - **Investment:** Any "economic package" offered by Tehran involving mineral or energy concessions should be viewed with extreme skepticism given the lack of domestic stability and the pending US military ultimatum ([Source](#)).

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

- **For International Policy:**
 - **Security:** Diplomatic channels must prioritize de-escalation between Iran and Israel to prevent a "limited" US strike from expanding into a multi-front regional war ([Source](#)).
 - **Human Rights:** Immediate pressure on Tehran regarding the 30 individuals facing imminent execution is required, as the regime is using these lives as leverage against domestic and foreign observers ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
 - **Digital Liberty:** Support for "Mesh-networking" and "Bluetooth-based" communication tools (like Berachain/Beechat) is critical for the Iranian civil society to maintain coordination during total internet shutdowns ([Source](#)).
