## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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February 20, 2026, marks a pivotal moment of divergence between American unilateralism and European collective security efforts. In the United States, President Donald Trump faces a significant constitutional crisis as the Supreme Court ruled his unilaterally imposed global tariffs illegal, stripping him of a primary tool for foreign economic pressure. Concurrently, Trump inaugurated his "Peace Board" in Washington—a proposed alternative to the United Nations—focused on Gaza's reconstruction, while simultaneously issuing a two-week ultimatum to Iran regarding its nuclear program, with military strikes reportedly prepared for as early as the coming weekend. This aggressive US stance contrasts with a new initiative by five major European powers (Poland, UK, Germany, France, and Italy) to develop autonomous NATO drones, signaling a move toward strategic autonomy as they prepare for a future where European defense may lack primary US involvement.

In Lithuania, the domestic political landscape is dominated by a widening scandal involving the "Nemuno Aušra" party. Investigations by the Central Election Commission (VRK) and independent journalists suggest illegal cash financing through party members, leading to accusations of political pressure on the VRK. Meanwhile, Lithuanian security services have issued urgent warnings regarding intensified Russian recruitment of citizens via social media to perform acts of sabotage and vandalism. Environmentally, the region is bracing for severe spring flooding in the Kaunas district, while the Lithuanian coast witnessed the rare arrival of "marine ice" for the first time in 15 years, a byproduct of recent extreme cold snaps followed by rapid temperature shifts.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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- **US Supreme Court Strikes Down Trump's Global Tariffs:** In a 6-3 ruling, the court determined that the President exceeded his authority by using emergency powers to bypass Congress for tariff imposition. This is viewed as the most significant judicial blow to the administration's "America First" economic platform, creating immediate market uncertainty ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **European "Big Five" Drone Pact:** Poland, the UK, Germany, France, and Italy have committed to the joint development of low-cost, AI-driven autonomous drones for NATO air defense. The initiative aims to reconcile the cost of defense with the low cost of modern threats, such as those seen in the Ukraine conflict ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

- **US-Iran Military Brinkmanship:** Reports indicate the US military is positioned to strike Iranian nuclear or governmental sites if a deal is not reached within a 10-15 day window. - **Arrest of Prince Andrew (Andrew Mountbatten-Windsor):** The former British prince was detained and his residence searched by UK police regarding allegations of misconduct in public office and the illegal transfer of confidential reports to convicted sex offender Jeffrey Epstein. - **Nemuno Aušra Financing Scandal:** Lithuanian authorities are investigating claims that the party funneled over €100,000 in illegal cash contributions. - **Russian Hybrid Recruitment via Social Media:** Lithuanian military intelligence (AOTD) and the VSD report that Russian services are actively recruiting locals through messaging platforms to desecrate monuments, spread ethnic discord, and monitor NATO infrastructure for cash rewards ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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- **International Relations & Geopolitics:**
  - The "Peace Board" (Taikos valdyba) led by Trump is drawing minimal support from traditional EU allies, with most sending only observers. Only Hungary's Viktor Orban participated as a full representative. The US has stopped UN funding, threatening the organization with financial collapse by July ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
  - Lithuania is attempting to "gradually restore" diplomatic ties with China to the level of charge d'affaires, despite continued tensions over Taiwan ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

## • **State Capacity & Critical Infrastructure:**

- Lithuanian municipalities report that snow removal and road maintenance budgets for the entire year have already been exhausted due to extreme winter conditions ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- Dubai is integrating autonomous fire-fighting robots and AI patrol robots to manage public safety in high-risk zones ([Source](#)).
- Lithuanian Engineering College and the Riflemen's Union opened a new center for drone assembly and pilot training to bolster civil defense ([Source](#)).

## • **Corruption & Governance:**

- The Lithuanian Journalists' Union is facing a transparency crisis involving over €239,000 in debt and unpaid taxes, leading to high-profile resignations ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- The appointment of Žaneta Rudaitienė as the new head of the Lithuanian Customs Department was marred by the dismissal of the Finance Ministry Chancellor just a day prior ([Source](#)).

## **LEGISLATION/POLICY**

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Legislative activity this period is centered on restrictive social measures and the formalization of defensive border measures. Policy discussions are heavily influenced by the "safe" mechanism for EU-funded military loans and new transparency rules for public broadcasting governance.

## **BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:**

- **Social Media Ban for Minors:** A proposal to restrict social media access for those under 16, with fines for platforms ranging from €500 to €4,000. Critics argue national legislation is insufficient and requires an EU-wide response ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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- **The Fragmentation of Global Institutions:**

The creation of the "Peace Board" by the Trump administration and the cessation of US payments to the UN represent a deliberate dismantling of the post-WWII multi-lateral order. The fact that EU nations (except Hungary) are refusing to participate suggests a deepening rift in the Western alliance. - **Strategic "Drone-ification" of European Defense:**

- **The weaponization of Social Media for Hybrid Warfare:**

Social media is no longer just a platform for influence but a recruitment tool for kinetic sabotage. The reports of Russian "remote-controlled" vandalism in Lithuania indicate that intelligence services are bypassing traditional spy networks in favor of "gig-economy" sabotage, where individuals are hired for small, anonymous tasks that aggregate into national instability ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

- **Environmental Anomalies as Infrastructure Stress-Testers:**

Rare events like "marine ice" and the exhaustion of year-long maintenance budgets in February highlight that European infrastructure is not currently built for the volatility of 2026's climate. ## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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- **Short Term (1-4 Weeks):**

- High probability of localized US airstrikes in Iran if diplomatic stalling continues.
- Lithuanian political crisis may deepen as the "Nemuno Aušra" party faces potential loss of state subsidies, possibly destabilizing the current coalition.
- Immediate volatility in US import markets as the Supreme Court ruling forces a reset of tariff structures.

- **Medium Term (1-6 Months):**

- UN financial crisis will peak in July, likely forcing a massive restructuring or the rise of competing regional organizations like the "Peace Board."
- Fortification of the Polish-Belarusian border with landmines will commence, likely increasing migrant fatalities and geopolitical tensions.
- Lithuania likely to formalize a "two-tier" China policy, separating economic Charge d'Affaires relations from political Taiwan support.

- **Long Term (1-5 Years):**
  - Full transition of NATO air defense to autonomous AI systems, reducing reliance on manned fighter jet deployments for border incursions.
  - The shift of US foreign policy away from institutional multilateralism toward a series of transactional "Grand Bargains."
  - The total regulation of social media for minors in the EU, following the Lithuanian and Australian models.

- **Defense Technology Opportunities:** Massive investment opportunities exist in autonomous systems and anti-drone technology as the EU seeks to build its own sovereign defense tech stack. ([Source](#))
- **Energy Transition Costs:** Investors in the agricultural sector (specifically greenhouse/shiltnamis operations) should expect a 2-3x increase in winter energy costs as standard, necessitating a shift toward more resilient biokuras (biofuel) or solar integration. ([Source](#), [Source](#))

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- **Security Interoperability:** EU nations must accelerate the development of the "Big Five" drone pact to ensure defense readiness if US support continues to be tied to transactional demands. ([Source](#))
- **UN Contingency Planning:** Diplomatic missions should prepare for a "post-UN" landscape or a period where the organization is paralyzed by US funding withdrawal. ([Source](#))
