



## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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February 20, 2026, is defined by an atmosphere of imminent conflict in West Asia, as the Islamic Republic of Iran formalizes a shift in its security doctrine toward proactive deterrence. Tehran has issued a high-level warning to the United Nations, stating that any military aggression by the United States or Israel will result in a "decisive and proportionate" response targeting all hostile bases and assets in the region. This rhetorical escalation is backed by the formation of a "Jihad Council" and recent joint naval exercises with Russia, signaling that Iran no longer views its defense as purely reactive. The tension is underscored by memories of a "12-day war" in June 2025, which serves as a baseline for the current standoff. Analysts suggest a U.S. strike could occur within 24 to 36 hours, despite a public 10-day diplomatic window offered by President Donald Trump ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

Simultaneously, the Trump administration's efforts to bypass international institutions through a "Board of Peace" for Gaza have met with widespread skepticism and regional condemnation. While the U.S. claims significant fundraising for Gaza's reconstruction, Hamas and regional analysts dismiss the initiative as a "theatrical" attempt to sideline the United Nations and facilitate "greater Israel" expansionism. This skepticism is compounded by ongoing Israeli military operations in Gaza and the West Bank that violate current cease-fire agreements, as well as a new medical study suggesting the Palestinian death toll is significantly higher than previously reported ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

On the domestic front, both the U.S. and Iran are navigating major structural shifts. In the U.S., the Supreme Court has delivered a major blow to executive power by striking down global tariffs imposed under emergency acts, prompting an immediate and defiant retaliatory levy from the President. In Iran, the government is executing "major economic surgery" by removing the preferential currency exchange rate to curb rent-seeking and corruption, a move described as painful but necessary for long-term sovereignty. These internal pressures, combined with the release of the "Epstein files" used by state media to frame Western elites as morally compromised and blackmailed, suggest that both nations are leveraging external confrontations to manage domestic instability ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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- **Shift in Iranian Security Doctrine:** Tehran has transitioned from a purely defensive posture to a proactive/aggressive strategy. The newly discussed "Jihad Council," led by figures such as Ali Shamkhani, is intended to make independent military decisions during wartime. High-level officials warned that any strike on Iranian soil or leaders would lead to a regional war involving the closure of the Strait of Hormuz and strikes on U.S. bases in Bahrain, Jordan, and the UAE ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Collapse of U.S. Executive Tariff Authority:** The U.S. Supreme Court ruled that President Trump overstepped his authority by using the 1977 International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA) to impose global tariffs. In response, Trump announced a 10% levy using alternative legal mechanisms, further straining global trade relations ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Iran-Russia Strategic Naval Drills:** The two nations completed joint naval exercises in the Sea of Oman and Northern Indian Ocean. ## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Analysts anticipate a U.S./Israeli strike within 24-36 hours, potentially targeting nuclear sites or leadership. Iran is likely to respond with missile barrages on Tel Aviv and U.S. regional bases. **Medium Term (1-6 Months):** If war is avoided, Iran will struggle with inflationary pres-

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** Completion of the Rash-Astara rail link and full operationalization of the INSTC will cement a Russia-Iran-India trade axis, significantly reducing the efficacy of Western sanctions. 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### For International Policy:
