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



THE POLISH STATE FACES SYSTEMIC PARALYSIS AMID PRESIDENTIAL VETOES AND AN IMMINENT GLOBAL SECURITY CRISIS IN IRAN

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 20, 2026, marks a day of profound institutional friction in Poland, as the domestic "cohabitation" between President Karol Nawrocki and the government of Prime Minister Donald Tusk reaches a breaking point. The President's double veto of the National Council of the Judiciary (KRS) reform and the "Active Farmer" bill has effectively stalled the government's efforts to "restore the rule of law" and redirect agricultural subsidies. In a retaliatory move, Speaker of the Sejm Włodzimierz Czarzasty sent the President's own counter-proposal to the Venice Commission, labeling it a "legal dud" that would impose draconian prison sentences on judges. This domestic deadlock is occurring precisely as the national security environment deteriorates, with Poland officially withdrawing from the Ottawa Convention to resume the production of anti-personnel mines—a move driven by the escalating threat from the Russian Fed-

eration and the "Shield East" initiative ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

On the international stage, the "Trump Effect" is the dominant variable. While the newly formed Trump Peace Council inaugurated its operations in Washington, focusing on a developer-centric reconstruction of Gaza without Palestinian representation, the President of the United States has simultaneously issued a 10-to-15-day ultimatum to Iran. The potential for a "hot conflict" is being treated as highly probable by Polish analysts, as the US military achieves its highest concentration of force in the region since the 2003 invasion of Iraq. Domestically, the government is leveraging this instability to push for the "SAFE" (Security Action for Europe's Defense) program, an €44 billion loan that the opposition labels a "toxic" debt trap under German control, further deepening the polarization of the Polish electorate ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Judicial Reform Stalemate and Presidential "Veto-Mania":** President Karol Nawrocki vetoed the amendment to the KRS, which intended to allow judges to elect their own members rather than have them appointed by parliament. Nawrocki argued the law would create "chaos" and *podważanie* (undermining) thousands of existing sentences. In response, the government has launched "Plan B"—grassroots elections within the judiciary to bypass the veto, while the President has threatened a national referendum ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

- **Imminent US-Iran Conflict and Regional Destabilization:** Donald Trump has warned that "bad things" will happen to Iran if a nuclear deal is not reached within 15 days. The US has deployed two carrier strike groups (USS Abraham Lincoln and USS Gerald Ford) and a record number of aircraft to the Persian Gulf. - **Poland's Strategic Pivot to Landmines (Ottawa Convention Withdrawal):** Poland has officially left the Ottawa Convention, allowing for the legal production, storage, and export of anti-personnel mines. This is a critical component of "Shield East," with the government claiming the ability to mine the eastern border within 48 hours in the event of an active Russian aggression ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Modern Slavery Ring Dismantled:** The Polish Border Guard broke up an international human trafficking syndicate that forced approximately 2,000 citizens from Latin America (primarily Colombia) into "modern slavery" in Poland. The group laundered millions through front companies while forcing victims to work in sub-zero temperatures for negligible pay ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Trump Tariffs Declared Illegal:** The US Supreme Court ruled 6-3 that Donald Trump exceeded his authority by imposing broad tariffs without Congressional approval. Trump responded with a combative press conference, calling the judges "unpatriotic fools" and vowing to implement a 10% global tariff via executive order ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

- **The Arrest of Prince Andrew:** In a historic move, the former Duke of York was questioned for 11 hours and arrested by British police for "abuse of public office" related to his ties with Jeffrey Epstein. KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

- **Geopolitics:** Poland is integrating more deeply into the "E5" group (Poland, UK, France, Germany, Italy) to coordinate European defense autonomous of shifting US policy. - **Legislation:**

- **KRS Amendment (Vetoed):** Aimed at democratizing the election of judges to the National Council of the Judiciary ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

LEGISLATION/POLICY

Governance in Poland is currently a battle of vetoes and procedural bypasses. The President has leveraged his veto power 27 times, a near-record, focusing on blocking the government's attempts to dismantle the judicial framework established by Law and Justice (PiS). Outside of Poland, the US executive is facing its own legislative and judicial limits regarding trade policy.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **KRS Reform Bill:** Proposed to return the selection of 15 judge-members of the KRS to the judges themselves. Vetoed by Nawrocki on grounds of unconstitutionality and risk to sentence stability ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Active Farmer Bill:** Targeted "Marszałkowska farmers" (absentee landowners) to ensure subsidies only reach active producers. Vetoed by Nawrocki who claimed it hurt small family farms ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Nawrocki's Judicial Counter-Bill:** Includes penalties up to 10 years in prison for judges who refuse to sit with "Neo-judges." Sent to the Venice Commission for review ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of the Veto and the "Plan B" Doctrine: The Polish political system has shifted from cohabitation to a state of total administrative obstruction. President Nawrocki's use of the veto is no longer selective; it is systemic. The government's response—launching "Plan B" (informal elections and Sejm resolutions)—suggests a move toward "extra-legislative" governance. This creates a dangerous precedent where the formal legislative process is bypassed by both sides, potentially leading to a dual legal reality where the legitimacy of every judge and civil servant is contingent on which executive branch they recognize ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

Conventional Deterrence and the Death of Liberal Internationalism: The withdrawal from the Ottawa Convention is a symbolic and practical death knell for the post-Cold War liberal order in Eastern Europe. Poland is prioritizing physical barrier defenses (Shield East) and "brute" deterrence over international treaty obligations. This mirrors the US shift toward "private diplomacy" under Trump's Peace Council, which prioritizes real estate and sports (FIFA) over traditional UN-led multi-lateralism. The transition from "Smart Defense" to "Hard Defense" (mines, drone swarms, 5% GDP spending) is now the irreversible regional consensus ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

The Emerging "New Slavery" and Economic Vulnerability: The discovery of a 2,000-person "modern slavery" ring indicates a severe gap in state capacity. While Poland has transitioned into a major destination for migrant labor from Latin America and Asia, the regulatory and policing framework has not kept pace. This creates a shadow economy that not only harms victims but creates massive money laundering opportunities (7.5 million PLN seized in one raid) that can fund other criminal or extremist activities ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect extreme volatility in energy and oil markets as the 15-day US-Iran deadline approaches. Poland will likely see a surge in judges participating in "Plan B" elections, followed by immediate disciplinary actions or "jail time" threats from the Presidential office. A "Gołolec" (glaze ice) weather "armageddon" predicted for the weekend will likely cause severe infrastructure disruptions across central Poland ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

Medium Term (1-6 Months): Internal PiS power struggles will intensify as Kaczyński's "Prime Minister candidate" is revealed, potentially leading to a splintering of the party if the Morawiecki or Sasin factions feel marginalized. The SAFE program will likely pass the Sejm, but face a Presidential veto, leading to a constitutional crisis over defense funding during a period of potential Middle East war ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

Long Term (1-5 Years): Poland's withdrawal from the Ottawa Convention and the buildup of the "Shield East" will lead to a heavily militarized and mined border zone, changing the ecological and social landscape of the frontier.

The "Port Polska" project, funded by new credit lines, will either become the central hub of a resurgent Polish economy or a massive "white elephant" if European air travel patterns shift due to climate regulations ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- **Security:** NATO and EU partners must prepare for a "fragmented" Polish legal system. Contracts and military agreements signed with the government may be challenged by the President's office as "illegal" ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Diplomatic:** The withdrawal from the Ottawa Convention by Poland and the Baltics signals a need for a new European conventional arms control framework that accounts for the "Russian reality" ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Economic:** Be prepared for US executive bypasses of Supreme Court rulings on trade. Trump's "License" strategy suggests he will find new ways to extract fees from foreign companies regardless of court rulings ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Regulatory Risk:** Companies employing foreign labor in Poland must conduct deep-dive audits of their recruitment agencies to avoid entanglement in "modern slavery" investigations, which are becoming a high-priority for the Border Guard ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

- **Supply Chain:** The 3.3 billion PLN investment in Chopin Airport and Port Polska suggests significant opportunities in construction, aviation tech, and logistics infrastructure, but these are high-risk due to political polarization ([Source](#)).
- **Legal Stability:** Avoid using Polish courts for major international disputes until the KRS/Judicial crisis is resolved, as the "Plan B" judges may have their rulings contested by future administrations ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
