DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

The reporting for February 21, 2026, reveals a global landscape caught in a volatile transition, characterized by the defiance of the Trump administration against domestic judicial constraints and an increasingly complex web of internal and external pressures on Ukraine. On the eve of the fourth anniversary of the 2022 invasion, Ukraine faces a dual crisis: a deepening public rift between President Volodymyr Zelensky and former Commander-in-Chief Valerii Zaluzhny, and a coordinated energy ultimatum from Hungary and Slovakia. While Ukrainian forces have secured a morale-boosting tactical victory by liberating approximately 300 square kilometers in the Zaporizhzhia and Donetsk border regions, the strategic narrative is increasingly dominated by trilateral negotiations in Geneva involving the US, Russia, and Ukraine. Analysts remain skeptical of these talks, viewing them as a

"performance" for President Trump rather than a substantive path to peace, as Russia continues to use diplomacy as an instrument of attritional warfare.

Simultaneously, the United States has entered a constitutional and economic crisis. Following a landmark Supreme Court ruling that struck down the Trump administration's unilateral global tariffs as a violation of Congressional authority, the President immediately bypassed the court using alternative legal mechanisms to impose a temporary 10% global tariff. This move has triggered fears of a worldwide trade war and heightened global instability. In the Middle East, the administration is leveraging the threat of limited strikes on Iranian nuclear facilities to force a deal, a move some observers interpret as a maneuver to distract from domestic scandals, including the ongoing fallout from the "Epstein files." Amidst this turbulence, Japan has undergone a historic political shift with Sanae Takaichi's Liberal Democratic Party securing a constitutional majority, signaling a definitive move toward remilitarization and a more assertive role in the Pacific, albeit still tethered to the US alliance.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

• **US Supreme Court Overrules Trump Tariffs; President Escalates Trade War**

- The US Supreme Court ruled 6-3 that President Trump exceeded his authority by imposing unilateral tariffs under the guise of national emergency laws, marking a rare judicial defeat for the administration ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- In defiance, Trump signed an executive order for a new 10% global tariff on all imports, effective February 24, for a duration of 150 days, bypassing the immediate ruling ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- Market reactions were immediate, with stock indices rising upon the court's decision but stalling as the new tariff was announced ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

• **The Zaluzhny Rift: Former Commander Criticizes Zelensky**

- In a series of interviews with Associated Press and The Guardian, Ambassador Valerii Zaluzhny claimed the 2023 counter-offensive failed because political leadership dispersed resources against military advice ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- Zaluzhny revealed a September 2022 SBU raid on his headquarters as an "act of intimidation" and detailed his direct confrontation with Andriy Yermak over the incident ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

• **Energy Blackmail: Hungary and Slovakia Threaten Ukraine**

- Prime Ministers Viktor Orban and Robert Fico issued an ultimatum to Kyiv: restore the transit of Russian oil via the "Druzhba" pipeline by Monday, February 23, or face a complete cutoff of emergency electricity supplies ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- Transit was halted due to Russian strikes on infrastructure near Brody; Orban claims there are no technical reasons for the stoppage and links it to EU aid blockades ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

• **Geneva Trilateral Talks: Progress Claimed Amid Skepticism**

- Third round of talks between the US, Ukraine, and Russia in Geneva ended with the White House claiming "real progress," particularly on military monitoring and ceasefire mechanics ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- Substantial political disagreements remain regarding territorial control of the Donbas, with Russia demanding full withdrawal of Ukrainian troops from Donetsk ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

• **Operation Enigma 2.0: Assassination Plot Busted**

- Ukrainian and Moldovan authorities dismantled a Russian-backed hit squad targeting high-profile figures, including military officials and journalists ([Source](#)).
- Ten individuals were arrested across both countries; targets allegedly included GUR representative Andriy Yusov and journalist Dmitry Gordon ([Source](#)).

- **Japan Election: Constitutional Majority for Sanae Takaichi**

- The Liberal Democratic Party won 316 of 465 seats, granting PM Takaichi the power to bypass the upper house and potentially revise the pacifist constitution ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

LEGISLATION/POLICY

Legislation this week has been dominated by Ukraine's efforts to harmonize its legal framework with EU standards while managing the constraints of martial law. Significant focus

was placed on the 10 priority bills identified by human rights coalitions as essential for EU accession.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

- **The Weaponization of Transparency and Scandals**

 - The Geneva talks represent a form of attritional diplomacy. Russia is not seeking a peace deal but rather a diplomatic shield to continue its slow, "snail-paced" territorial advances while minimizing the risk of an American long-range weapon surge ([Source](#), [Source](#)). This creates a "horseshoe" of pressure on Zelensky: the US pushes for a deal to claim a "win," Russia demands territorial surrender, and European "allies" like Hungary/Slovakia use energy threats to extract concessions ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

- **Roboticized Warfare and the "Kill Zone"**

- On the front lines, the nature of combat has shifted toward total drone dominance. The "Kill Zone" has expanded to 40km behind the lines, where everything that moves is targeted by FPV drones ([Source](#), [Source](#)). - **The End of US Geopolitical Predictability**

- Trump's "Discombobulator" rhetoric and his open defiance of the Supreme Court signal the end of the US as a predictable guarantor of the rules-based order ([Source](#), [Source](#)). STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect a significant surge in Russian information operations targeting the Zelensky-Zaluzhny rift to destabilize domestic Ukrainian support ([Source](#), [Source](#)). Long Term (1-5 Years): The "European Nuclear Shield" initiative will likely gain traction if Trump remains erratic, leading to a permanent structural split in the Western security architecture ([Source](#), [Source](#)). Ukraine will emerge as a global hub for military technology export, particularly in drone and electronic warfare, regardless of the war's final territorial outcome ([Source](#), [Source](#)). The Russian economy faces a systemic "breaking point" between late 2026 and 2027 as oil revenues fail to sustain current mobilization levels ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
