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



HUNGARY LEVERAGES EU VETO
POWER AMID ENERGY BLACKMAIL
AND ELECTION KICKOFF

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 21, 2026, marks the official start of the Hungarian parliamentary election campaign, set against a backdrop of acute regional energy insecurity and heightened geopolitical maneuvering. The dominant narrative of the day centers on Ukraine's suspension of oil deliveries via the Friendship (Barátság) pipeline, which the Hungarian government characterizes as a coordinated act of political blackmail by Kyiv, Brussels, and the domestic opposition (Tisza Party) to destabilize the economy before the April 12 vote. In a significant escalation of economic statecraft, Hungary has officially blocked a 90 billion EUR EU loan package for Ukraine, asserting that no funds will flow until oil transit is restored. Concurrently, Prime Minister Viktor Orbán has threatened to terminate electricity exports to Ukraine, a move coordinated with Slovakia, which has issued its own 48-hour ultimatum to Kyiv. On the international stage, the administration is capitalizing on its "bridge-building" foreign

policy and strong ties with the Trump administration in the United States. Following Orbán's visit to the newly established Peace Council in Washington, D.C., and an endorsement from President Donald Trump, the government is framing itself as the sole guarantor of Hungarian sovereignty against "globalist large capital." Domestically, the campaign kickoff has been marked by a rapid mobilization effort, with Fidesz-KDNP claiming to have collected all necessary candidate signatures within hours, while state media aggressively promotes a narrative that the opposition Tisza Party is a "Brussels creation" planning a massive austerity program (the "Tisza Package") reminiscent of the 1995 Bokros and 2009 Bajnai packages. MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Energy Transit Crisis and EU Loan Veto:** Hungary has formally vetoed a 90 billion EUR EU loan intended for Ukraine in response to the three-week-long stoppage of oil through the Friendship pipeline. Foreign Minister Péter Szijjártó labeled the stoppage a "political hit job" aimed at forcing gas prices to 1,000 HUF per liter. ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#))
- **Official Start of Parliamentary Election Campaign:** The campaign for the April 12, 2026, elections officially opened. Fidesz-KDNP candidates reported collecting the required 500 signatures in all 106 districts within the first few hours. ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#))

- **Orbán-Trump Alignment in Washington:** Viktor Orbán participated as a founding member of the Washington Peace Council. President Trump provided a full endorsement of Orbán's reelection, praising his stance on migration and sovereignty. ([Source](#), [Source](#))
- **Slovak-Hungarian Joint Pressure on Ukraine:** Slovak PM Robert Fico issued a threat to disconnect Ukraine from the European power grid if oil transit to Slovakia and Hungary is not restored by Monday. ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#))
- **Strategic Oil Reserve Release:** The Hungarian government authorized the release of 25,000 tons of crude oil from strategic reserves to maintain supply at the Százhalombatta refinery during the transit outage. ([Source](#), [Source](#))
- **Presidential Audience with Pope Leo XIV:** President Tamás Sulyok met with Pope Leo XIV at the Vatican to discuss peace in Ukraine and the protection of Christian values, extending an invitation for a papal visit to Hungary. ([Source](#), [Source](#))

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security

- The Friendship pipeline remains dry despite technical repairs being completed on February 6.
- Croatia's Janaf is refusing to transit Russian-origin oil via the Adria pipeline to Hungary and Slovakia, despite EU exemptions allowing for sea-to-pipe transit during emergencies.
- Government experts warn that without Russian oil, fuel prices could destabilize, hitting 1,000 HUF per liter. ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#))

Geopolitics and International Relations

- Hungary is framing itself as a "bridge" between the West and the "Global Majority" (Global East/South).
- The Washington Peace Council is presented as a more effective alternative to the UN for resolving conflicts in Gaza and potentially Ukraine.
- Tensions with Poland and the Baltic states remain high as they militarize borders (mining and "Keleti Pajzs" program), while Hungary maintains a "peace-only" stance. ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#))

Domestic Stability and Social Order

- The government is heavily messaging the "Tisza Package," an alleged opposition plan to cut 13th and 14th-month pensions, raise the retirement age, and abolish utility cost reductions (rezsicsökkentés).

Corruption and Governance

- Authorities arrested a GP and assistant in Dunavarsány for selling fraudulent vaccine certifications for 400,000 HUF each.
- A "quack" in Érd was detained for producing fake cancer drugs in a garage, defrauding hundreds. ([Source](#), [Source](#))

Critical Infrastructure

- The foundation stone for Terminal 3 at Liszt Ferenc International Airport was laid. The 1 billion EUR project aims for 25 million passengers by 2030 and includes a new high-speed rail link to Budapest's Western Railway Station. ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#))

Legislation and Policy

- **EU Veto Policy:** Hungary is blocking the 90 billion EUR Ukraine loan facility. ([Source](#))
- **Government Decree:** Released 25,000 tons of strategic crude oil reserves. ([Source](#))
- **Election Laws:** Campaign rules came into effect Feb 21, including signature collection and poster placement regulations. ([Source](#))

LEGISLATION/POLICY

Policy action focused on defensive economic measures against the Ukrainian transit stoppage and the formalization of election campaign rules. Notable legislative shifts involve the deregulation of the housing loan market to accelerate new builds and the continued roll-out of the 14th-month pension system.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Strategic Reserve Release Decree:** Legally authorizes Mol to access national emergency oil stocks to prevent domestic fuel shortages. ([Source](#), [Source](#))

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of Energy Transit

The standoff over the Friendship pipeline has moved from a technical dispute to a full-scale

geopolitical confrontation. State media is consistently linking Ukraine's actions to a broader "Brussels-Berlin-Kyiv axis" intent on changing the Hungarian government. The simultaneous resistance from Croatia (Janaf) to transit oil suggests a coordinated regional effort to force Hungary to decouple from Russian energy ahead of the 2027 EU-wide deadline. Hungary's response—vetoing the 90 billion EUR loan and threatening to cut the power grid—indicates a willingness to risk Ukrainian infrastructure stability to preserve domestic price levels before the election. Election Narrative: Stability vs. Austerity

Fidesz is leveraging economic history to frame the Tisza Party as a return to the "failed" policies of the 1990s and 2000s. The "Tisza Package" is the center of this strategy, using fears of IMF-style austerity to shore up the core vote. By claiming Tisza will abolish the 13th-month pension and utility subsidies, the government is making the election a referendum on the welfare state. The rapid collection of signatures is used as a display of superior state and party capacity compared to the "digital bluffs" of the opposition. ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#))

The Vatican-Washington Axis

The government is diversifying its diplomatic support beyond the EU. PM Orbán's close alignment with Trump and the simultaneous high-profile meeting with the Pope serve to project a image of Hungary as a "sovereign powerhouse" that commands respect from global leaders. This "Bridge-building" policy is intended to show that Hungary is not isolated, but rather part of a "Global Majority" that favors negotiation over confrontation. STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks):

- Expect intense diplomatic friction within the EU as Hungary maintains its veto on the Ukraine loan.
- A potential blackout or power reduction in Ukraine if the Monday deadline for oil transit is not met.
- Fuel price volatility at Hungarian pumps as markets react to the extended pipeline outage and reliance on more expensive Adria transit or North African imports. ([Source](#), [Source](#))

Medium Term (1-6 Months):

- The April 12 election results will determine if Hungary continues its resistance to EU energy sanctions or pivots toward the "Brussels-Berlin" line.
- If Fidesz wins, expect a long-term legal battle with Croatia over Adria transit fees and with the EU over the 2027 Russian energy ban.

Long Term (1-5 Years):

- The expansion of Liszt Ferenc Airport and its rail link will cement Budapest as a regional transit hub, potentially shifting tourism patterns in Central Europe.
- Structural integration of Ukraine into the EU (targeted for 2027 by some) remains the primary friction point for Hungarian-EU relations.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- **Energy Diplomacy:** EU mediators must address the Croatia-Hungary-Slovakia transit fee and origin dispute immediately to prevent a total breakdown of energy solidarity.
- **Ukraine Funding:** The 90 billion EUR loan is now a hostage to energy transit; a "technical" solution for oil flow is required to unlock the aid.
- **Sovereignty Protection:** International observers should monitor the "Democracy Shield" rollout in Hungary to ensure it is not used as a pretext for election interference. ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#))

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Manufacturers reliant on Hungarian electricity or fuel should prepare for price spikes or temporary supply interruptions during the transit standoff.
- **Real Estate Opportunity:** The March 1 shift in housing loan disbursement creates a favorable environment for residential developers and construction firms.
