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





DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

The reporting period of February 21, 2026, depicts a world and a nation in a state of high-stakes transition and geopolitical instability. Domestically, Portugal is grappling with the catastrophic aftermath of Storms Christine and Marta, which have decimated infrastructure, particularly in the central region (Leiria and Pombal). The government of Prime Minister Luís Montenegro has pivotally shifted from emergency response to a long-term political strategy, proposing the Program for Transformation, Recovery, and Resilience (PTRR). This 8-to-10-year plan has drawn sharp criticism from the opposition, who view it as a dilatory tactic to mask immediate administrative failures and a deteriorating fiscal position that may necessitate a return to deficit spending. The appointment of Luís Neves, the long-standing director of the Judiciary Police, as the new Minister of Internal Administration,

signals an attempt to restore confidence in state capacity after the collapse of his predecessors under the weight of the crisis ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

Globally, the United States is driving a dual-track escalation. In the economic sphere, President Donald Trump has effectively bypassed a Supreme Court ruling that declared his emergency tariffs illegal by immediately invoking Section 122 to impose a 15% global tariff. This move has triggered defensive positioning from the European Union and threatens a total breakdown of the established international trade order. Simultaneously, the military buildup at Lajes Base in the Azores—highlighted by the presence of C-5 Galaxy transports and KC-46 tankers—coupled with Trump's refusal to rule out a "limited" surgical strike on Iran, suggests that the 15-day deadline regarding the Iranian nuclear program has expired without a diplomatic resolution. MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

US-Iran Military Escalation and Azores Positioning

Portuguese Internal Administration Realignment

The PTRR and the Storm Recovery Crisis

In Portugal, the legislative agenda is also pivoting toward recognizing non-traditional emergency assets,

such as radio amateurs, following the total collapse of digital communication grids during Storm Christine.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Failure of State Capacity and the Rise of the "Technocratic Savior"
