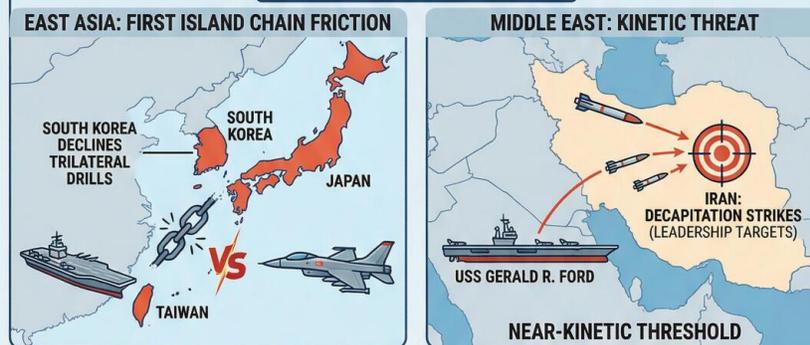

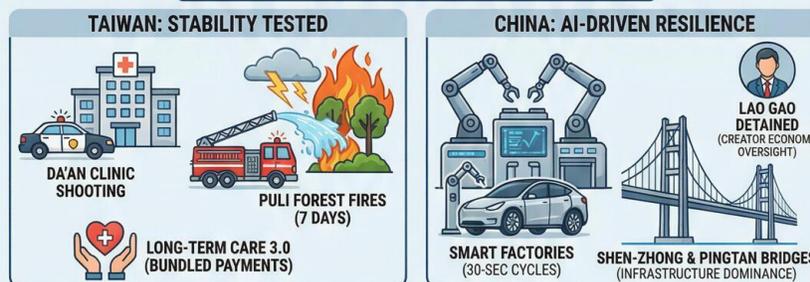

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 22, 2026, marks a critical pivot in global trade and regional security. The **United States Supreme Court** has ruled President Trump's "reciprocal tariff" policy illegal, prompting an immediate and more aggressive retaliatory measure: a global 15% tariff under **Section 122 of the Trade Act**. This development has placed Taiwan in a precarious "storm center," as previous diplomatic concessions—including a \$500 billion investment pledge and TSMC's manufacturing shifts—were predicated on a legal framework that has now been circumvented. There is significant domestic concern in Taiwan that the nation has been "swindled," sacrificing core industrial assets for a trade advantage that has evaporated into a universal tariff ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

Simultaneously, military tensions between the **U.S. and Iran** have escalated to a near-kinetic threshold. The **USS Gerald R. Ford** has en-

tered the Mediterranean, with reports suggesting the Trump administration is considering "decapitation strikes" against Iranian supreme leadership. In East Asia, the "First Island Chain" alliance is showing signs of friction; **South Korea** has notably declined participation in trilateral air exercises with the U.S. and Japan, signaling a potential realignment or a desire to avoid being drawn into a direct U.S.-China confrontation ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

Domestically in Taiwan, the conclusion of the Lunar New Year holiday has been marred by a surge in violent crime, including a targeted shooting at a **Da'an District medical clinic** and a series of taxi hijackings. State capacity is being tested by environmental disasters, specifically the **Puli forest fires**, which burned for seven days. On the governance front, the administration is moving forward with **Long-term Care 3.0**, a massive 100-billion TWD budget initiative set to pilot new "bundled payment" models in March ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **The Trump Tariff Pivot:** Following a 6-3 Supreme Court ruling against reciprocal tariffs, the U.S. executive branch invoked Section 122 of the 1974 Trade Act to impose a 15% global tariff for an initial 150-day period. This move sidesteps judicial constraints and targets "balance of payment" issues, effectively nullifying specific trade advantages previously negotiated by allies like Taiwan ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

- **U.S.-Iran Kinetic Threat:** Intelligence reports and media leaks suggest the U.S. is finalizing plans for first-wave attacks on Iranian nuclear facilities and senior leadership, including Ayatollah Khamenei and his son. The deployment of the world's largest aircraft carrier to the region mirrors the buildup prior to the 2003 invasion of Iraq ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Taiwan's Long-term Care 3.0 Launch:** The Ministry of Health and Welfare announced a pilot "bundled payment" program for home care services starting in March. With a budget exceeding 100 billion TWD, the program aims to shift from "volume-based" to "value-based" care, though civic groups express skepticism regarding regional integration ([Source](#)).
- **High-Profile Shooting and Social Order:** A gunman conducted a premeditated shooting at an aesthetic clinic in Taipei's Da'an District during a New Year event, wounding several people. The suspect engaged in multiple costume changes to evade police, highlighting a sophisticated level of criminal planning ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Cracking the Creator Economy:** Reports indicate that "Lao Gao," the world's most influential Chinese-speaking YouTuber, may have been detained in Dalian, China, for alleged tax evasion totaling 1.8 billion TWD. This signals a tightening of state oversight on digital influencers and cross-border income ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Geopolitics and Regional Security

- **Alliance Friction:** South Korea's refusal to join the U.S. and Japan in trilateral exercises indicates a growing rift in the Northern Pacific security architecture. - **Currency and Capital:** Gold prices are projected to reach \$6,600 USD as investors flee volatility in the U.S. dollar and trade-exposed equities ([Source](#)).

State Capacity and Infrastructure

- **Chinese Infrastructure Dominance:** Reports highlight the completion of the **Shen-Zhong Bridge** and the **Pingtian Cross-Strait Bridge**, showcasing China's ability to execute high-difficulty engineering projects despite global economic pressures. These projects utilize massive amounts of steel and concrete, exceeding the scale of the Burj Khalifa ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

- **Smart Manufacturing:** China's "Smart Factories" in Chongqing and Hangzhou are achieving 30-second production cycles for EVs using AI and 9,800-ton die-casting machines, significantly lowering production costs and offsetting tariff impacts ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

Domestic Stability & Social Order

- **Post-Holiday Violence:** Beyond the Da'an shooting, multiple instances of taxi hijackings and "random" attacks on elderly citizens were reported in Tainan and Chiayi ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).
- **Environmental Hazards:** The Puli forest fire consumed 29 hectares over seven days, requiring 540 tons of water drops, highlighting vulnerabilities in rural disaster management ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

LEGISLATION/POLICY

Legislative focus centers on the **Long-term Care 3.0** rollout and the fallout of **U.S. Trade Act** invocations. DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of Trade Law

The shift from "Reciprocal Tariffs" to "Section 122" represents a strategic move from specific targeting to broad-spectrum economic warfare. By using Section 122, the U.S. executive branch exploits a legal loophole that allows for 150-day tariff cycles that can be renewed indefinitely without congressional or judicial interference. The Fragility of the "First Island Chain"

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The 150-day tariff clock under Section 122 will lead to a series of renegotiations. Military tensions in the Middle East may lead to oil price

Long Term (1-5 Years): China's massive infrastructure projects (bridges, smart factories) suggest a multi-decade plan to integrate regional economies through physical and digital connectivity, bypassing U.S.-led maritime trade routes. RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- **Reassess Trade Pledges:** Allies must recognize that bilateral concessions to the current U.S. administration may not provide protection from unilateral executive actions under Section 122.
- **Monitor Middle East Escalation:** The risk of a "decapitation strike" against Iran remains high; contingency plans for a Strait of Hormuz closure are essential.
- **Security Trilateralism:** Diplomatic efforts are needed to bridge the widening gap between the U.S., Japan, and South Korea, particularly regarding "China-neutral" postures.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Diversification:** The universal 15% tariff makes "near-shoring" to the U.S. market more attractive, but also increases the cost of components sourced from the First Island Chain.

- **AI and Industrial Tech:** China's smart manufacturing sector is achieving unprecedented efficiencies; investors should monitor the scalability of Chongqing's automated factories.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** The "Lao Gao" detention indicates that cross-border digital income will be a primary target for tax enforcement in Greater China; influencers and digital platforms must audit their tax compliance immediately.
