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POLISH GOVERNANCE PARALYZED BY JUDICIAL ESCALATION AND DEFENSE FUNDING DEADLOCKS AMIDST RUSSIAN-LINKED TERRORISM IN LVIV

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

The reporting period of February 22, 2026, reveals a Polish government grappling with profound internal fracturing and heightening external security threats. Domestically, President Karol Nawrocki has moved to a "totalitarian" footing regarding the judiciary, vetoing government reforms and proposing a counter-bill that threatens judges with up to 10 years in prison for questioning the legitimacy of "neo-judges." This escalation is compounded by a metadata scandal revealing that the President's judicial bill was drafted or edited by Bartosz Lewandowski, an attorney for former Justice Minister Zbigniew Ziobro, signaling that the "Suwerenna Polska" faction continues to exert significant influence over the executive branch. Simultaneously, the governing coalition is facing the collapse of a junior partner, Poland 2050, which has split into two rival parliamentary clubs amidst "clinical ha-

tred" between leadership, threatening the stability of the 15th of October Coalition.

On the international front, a sophisticated terrorist attack in Lviv, Ukraine—blamed on a Russian-recruited operative—resulted in the death of a policewoman and dozens of injuries, prompting Poland to scramble fighter jets and close regional airports. This surge in hybrid warfare coincides with a bitter debate over the EU's "SAFE" defense program. The Law and Justice (PiS) party, led by Jarosław Kaczyński, has executed a 180-degree turn to oppose the €43 billion program, framing it as "German servitude" to consolidate its nationalist base and appease the re-elected Trump administration in the U.S. This occurs as U.S. President Donald Trump initiates an erratic "Peace Council" and orders a hospital ship to Greenland despite no local medical crisis, a move viewed by analysts as "chaotic global piracy" intended to disrupt NATO cohesion.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Russian-Linked Terrorist Attack in Lviv and Polish Military Response**
 - A dual-explosion terrorist attack at a shoe store in Lviv killed a 23-year-old policewoman and injured 25 others. A 33-year-old woman from the Rivne region was arrested, allegedly acting on orders from Russian special services. ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#))

- **Judicial Warfare: The Nawrocki "Kaganiec" Bill and Metadata Scandal**

- President Karol Nawrocki vetoed the government's National Council of the Judiciary (KRS) reform and proposed a counter-measure imposing 5 to 10-year prison sentences for judges who question the status of judges appointed under the previous PiS administration. ([Source](#), [Source](#))
- A political scandal erupted when metadata in the President's bill revealed the author as Bartosz Lewandowski, a lawyer for the embattled Zbigniew Ziobro, suggesting the bill was drafted by outside political interests rather than non-partisan experts. ([Source](#), [Source](#))

- **The "SAFE" Defense Program Deadlock**

- The Polish Parliament approved the EU SAFE program (providing over €43B in defense support), but PiS and Confederation voted against it. Kaczyński has labeled it a "German boot," despite previous support from former Defense Minister Błaszczak. ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#))
- Analysts suggest PiS opposes the program because its "conditionality" clause would prevent a future PiS government from dismantling the judiciary while receiving funds. ([Source](#))

- **Trump's "Peace Council" and Greenland Naval Diplomacy**

- President Trump inaugurated a "Peace Council" in Washington, described by critics as a "Council of Pokemons" including autocrats from Kazakhstan, Belarus, and Gulf states, aimed at bypassing the UN. ([Source](#), [Source](#))
- Trump ordered a hospital ship to Greenland following the medical evacuation of a U.S. submariner, a move Greenlandic and Danish authorities dismissed as unnecessary, viewing it as a provocative "instinct of a developer" seeking to fortify the island. ([Source](#), [Source](#))

- **Disintegration of the Poland 2050 Party**

- The party has effectively split, with a group of "defectors" forming a new "Center" club. Leadership accused the splitters of "clinical hatred" and failing the "test of democracy," while the defectors claim they can no longer work under the current regime. ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#))

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

International Relations and Geopolitics

The Polish security strategy is now split between a government seeking integration into European defense structures (SAFE) and a President/Opposition aligning exclusively with the "Trumpian" U.S. model. This has created a "two pianos" strategy that threatens procurement consistency. ([Source](#), [Source](#)) Meanwhile, Iranian students have resumed anti-regime protests, as satellite imagery shows Tehran reinforcing nuclear sites in anticipation of potential U.S. strikes. Domestic Stability and Terrorism The Lviv attack marks a shift toward Russian-sponsored domestic terrorism in Western Ukraine, directly impacting Polish border security and

civil aviation. ([Source](#), [Source](#)) Locally, Polish police are struggling with "multi-criminality" in football hooligan groups, which have evolved into organized crime syndicates involved in narcotics, human trafficking, and "waste mafias." ([Source](#))

AI and Disinformation in Statecraft Political parties are increasingly using AI to generate propaganda. PiS politicians used AI-generated graphics with language errors to attack the SAFE program, a tactic experts say is "deliberate" to increase viral spread through correction and mockery. State Capacity and Judiciary The "KRS" impasse has moved from a procedural dispute to an existential threat to the legal order. The President's proposal to imprison judges for their rulings could effectively force Poland to exit the EU (Polexit) due to incompatibility with the European legal order. ([Source](#), [Source](#))

LEGISLATION/POLICY

Polish legislative activity is currently defined by a "veto war" between the Nawrocki presidency and the Tusk government, with major defense, judicial, and agricultural reforms stalled in the transition between chambers or at the executive signing stage.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of the "German Threat" A recurring theme is the Law and Justice party's total reliance on "Germanophobia" to frame all EU-integrated policy. By labeling the SAFE program and judicial reforms as "German boots," PiS is attempting to create a nationalist litmus test for President Nawrocki. This trend suggests a strategic decision to

The Collapse of Center-Right Nuance The split in Poland 2050 and the radicalization of the Nawrocki presidency indicate that the "middle ground" in Polish politics is evaporating. The President's willingness to use 10-year prison threats against the judiciary marks a shift from "obstruction" to "authoritarianism." AI as a Tool for Political "Agitation" The use of AI is shifting from deepfakes to "low-quality agitation." Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Increased security measures at Polish shopping malls and public spaces following the Lviv "copycat" threat of Russian-linked domestic terror. ([Source](#))

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- The termination of the KRS term in May will lead to a constitutional "vacuum" if no agreement is reached, potentially delegitimizing thousands of future court rulings. ([Source](#))
- PiS will announce a "young" candidate for Prime Minister in March, triggering an internal leadership battle between the "Maślarze" (Morawiecki faction) and "Harcerze" (Macierewicz/Bocheński faction). ([Source](#))

Long Term (1-5 Years)

- The shift of global economic power toward Asia (India and China) is discussed as an inevitable decline of Western influence, requiring Poland to rethink its "exclusive" reliance on the U.S. ([Source](#))

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- **Security:** Allied air defense must account for "hybrid terror" in Western Ukraine, which now involves recruited civilians using IEDs rather than just missiles. ([Source](#))
- **Diplomacy:** The metadata leak in the Polish President's office suggests that foreign diplomats should treat Presidential legislative initiatives as factional political documents rather than official state papers. ([Source](#))
