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VENEZUELA PURSUES A STRATEGIC PIVOT TOWARD ECONOMIC RE-OCCIDENTALIZATION AND DOMESTIC RECONCILIATION UNDER THE RODRÍGUEZ ADMINISTRATION AMID SHIFTING GEOPOLITICAL ALIGNMENTS WITH THE TRUMP-LED UNITED STATES.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 24, 2026, marks a critical juncture for Venezuela as the administration of Acting President Delcy Rodríguez aggressively pursues a policy of "democratic coexistence" and economic "re-occidentalization." Following the seismic events of January 3, 2026—characterized by the administration as a foreign military aggression that resulted in the "sequestration" of former President Nicolás Maduro—the Venezuelan state is currently navigating a fragile transition. This pivot is defined by a massive legislative push for amnesty, intended to de-escalate decades of civil and political friction, and a strategic rapprochement with the Donald Trump administration in the United States. Analysts describe an influx of expectations for \$100 billion in investments over the next decade,

primarily centered on the energy sector, signaling a departure from previous anti-Western alignments toward a pragmatic, interest-based relationship with Washington.

Domestically, the "Law of Amnesty for Democratic Coexistence" has become the central pillar of statecraft, with over 3,000 requests for evaluation already processed to facilitate the release of political prisoners and "re-institutionalize" the nation. However, this transition is fraught with internal contradictions; while the government signals openness to the private sector and foreign capital, it remains hyper-vigilant against "radical" sectors in exile. Concurrently, the global landscape is defined by the four-year anniversary of the Russia-Ukraine war and significant security developments in Mexico following the death of cartel leader "El Mencho." In the technology sphere, the day's discourse highlights a global trend toward digital sovereignty, with European nations imposing strict age limits on social media and South Korea leading in AI regulation, reflecting a growing skepticism of unregulated "Big Tech."

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **The Amnesty and Reconciliation Initiative:** The Venezuelan government is accelerating the implementation of the Law of Amnesty, which has already seen [179 people liberated](#) and thousands more granted precautionary measures to foster a climate of "peace and coexistence" [following the Jan 3 crisis](#).

- **Strategic Rapprochement with the United States:** Under the banner of "Making the Americas Great Again," the Trump administration is engaging with the Rodríguez government to [ensure energy security](#) and facilitate a massive [\\$100 billion investment](#) into the Venezuelan oil industry.
- **Security Crisis in Mexico:** The death of Nemesio Oseguera Cervantes, alias "El Mencho," has triggered a [wave of violence](#) across 20 Mexican states, leading to the deployment of 10,000 soldiers and threatening the stability of a 2026 World Cup host city [due to cartel retaliation](#).
- **Ukraine War Four-Year Milestone:** The conflict in Ukraine reaches its fourth anniversary with [over 15,000 civilians dead](#) and a stalemate that has shifted European defense policy toward [increased military spending](#) and a re-evaluation of the Transatlantic alliance.
- **Global AI and Digital Sovereignty Shifts:** South Korea has implemented the world's first comprehensive [AI regulation law](#), while Spain and France are moving to [ban social media](#) for minors under 15/16 years old to protect cognitive development and mental health.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

AI, Technology Policy & Digital Sovereignty

- South Korea has established a legal framework requiring the [labeling of deepfakes](#) and advance notice of generative AI use, backed by fines of up to \$20,400 [for non-compliance](#).

- Spain and France are leading a European movement to restrict minor access to social media, citing risks of [anxiety and depression](#) caused by algorithms designed for "compulsive use" [and infinite scrolling](#).
- The UN General Assembly has appointed 40 experts to an [independent scientific panel](#) on AI to establish a global governance model similar to the IPCC for climate change [to ensure human oversight](#).

Domestic Stability & Social Order

- The Rodríguez administration is leveraging the Law of Amnesty to [re-incorporate political dissidents](#) into the national fabric, though officials warn of "radical sectors" in the U.S. and Europe [planning to destabilize](#) the process.
- Public services in Venezuela remain a point of friction, with reports of [water shortages](#) in Miranda and a [lack of transportation](#) in the Cementerio sector of Caracas [stalling daily activity](#).

Economic Security & Investment Climate

- Venezuela's stock market index (IBC) grew by [1,616% in 2025](#), with a further [38% expansion](#) in early 2026, reflecting high investor optimism regarding the US-Venezuela rapprochement [and market normalization](#).
- The reintegration of Venezuela into the [Andean Community and Mercosur](#) is being discussed as a vital step to [attract foreign investment](#) and restore administrative law [standards](#).

Energy Security & International Relations

- The Trump administration's "Make the Americas Great Again" policy is interpreted by Venezuelan analysts as a move toward a [hemispheric energy bloc](#), prioritizing Venezuelan crude over [extra-regional dependencies](#).
- The EU is considering [lifting sanctions](#) on Delcy Rodríguez, as requested by Spain, in response to the [release of European political prisoners](#) in Venezuela [as a sign of goodwill](#).

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity is focused on the stabilization of the country through legal instruments that facilitate political reconciliation and the modernization of the energy sector to align with new international partnerships.

- **Law of Amnesty for Democratic Coexistence:** A broad law enacted to extinguish criminal actions for political crimes [between 2014 and 2026](#). It excludes crimes against humanity, [corruption, and drug trafficking](#). The law allows exiles to process their [requests via consulates](#).
- **Reform of the Hydrocarbons Law:** Legislation being debated to facilitate [greater private participation](#) and investment from US-based firms in the [oil and gas sectors](#).
- **Partial Agreement No. 28:** A regulatory update of [tariffs and trade norms](#) to facilitate reciprocal protection of investments [between Venezuela and its new partners](#).

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS

- **Delcy Rodríguez Address:** The Acting President warned that certain sectors have an ["incorrect reading"](#) of the Amnesty Law and announced she would present evidence of [plots against the peace](#) orchestrated from abroad.
- **Minister Ricardo Sánchez Launch:** Initiated a 141-day [National Consultation for University Academic Quality](#) to align higher education with the [country's new productive needs](#).
- **Juan José Rendón Interview:** The political strategist argued that [80% of Venezuelans](#) support the current [process of transition](#), urging the derogation of the "Law Against Hate" to [further normalize the political climate](#).

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Transition Paradox: Sovereignty vs. Necessity

The Venezuelan state is managing a profound paradox: maintaining the rhetoric of "Bolivarian Sovereignty" while becoming increasingly reliant on a strategic partnership with the Trump administration. The January 3 event—described as an "aggression" where "everyone lost"—has paradoxically cleared the way for a ["reset" of the political system](#). Digital Iron Curtains

This reflects a broader shift where technology is no longer viewed as an unalloyed good but as a ["defective product"](#) that requires strict state intervention [and age-gating](#).

Neo-Protectionism and the End of Globalism

The discourse in Davos 2026 highlights the official end of the era of global cooperation. Trump's "Universal Tariff" base of [up to 20%](#) and the imposition of [25% tariffs](#) on non-compliant partners signals a move toward a ["neoprotectionist"](#) era. This trend is forcing countries like Venezuela to seek [regional "blocks" or "salvage juntas"](#) to navigate a world where free trade is [no longer the norm](#).

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): The focus will remain on the [execution of the Amnesty Law](#). As more high-profile prisoners are released, expect a surge in political activity and potential friction between newly freed actors and the state. In Mexico, the power vacuum left by "El Mencho" will likely result in [heightened urban warfare](#) as internal factions compete for control [of the Jalisco cartel](#).

Medium Term (1-6 Months): Economic normalization with the U.S. will begin to manifest in [increased oil exports](#) and the formalization of joint ventures between PDVSA and US firms. The [reopening of consulates](#) (e.g., Colombia in Margarita) will facilitate regional trade and migration regularization [for thousands of citizens](#).

Long Term (1-5 Years): Venezuela may undergo a structural shift toward a ["re-occidentalized" capitalistic model](#), where political power remains concentrated but the economy is integrated into the US sphere. Globally, the [Space Race](#) between SpaceX/xAI and Blue Origin will accelerate, with Starlink's [40,000-satellite constellation](#) redefining global connectivity [standards and debris risks](#).

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The shift in Venezuelan leadership and its rapprochement with the US suggests a [weakening of the Russia-Iran-Venezuela axis](#), offering a diplomatic window to stabilize the Caribbean [through economic incentives](#).
- The European "minor bans" on social media could create a [regulatory blueprint](#) for the US, potentially leading to a [clash with Big Tech platforms](#) regarding federal protections (Section 230).

For Private Sector/Investors:

- Venezuela's energy sector presents a [high-risk, high-reward opportunity](#) for firms capable of navigating the complex [sanctions-relief environment](#) and local infrastructure decay.
- Cybersecurity remains a critical risk; the massive leak in the [Moldbook AI forum](#) underscores the dangers of ["coding with vibes"](#)—delegating security to AI without human oversight [is a liability](#).

- Investors should monitor the Mexico security situation closely, as cartel instability could [disrupt supply chains](#) and increase logistical costs [for North American trade](#).
