

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 24, 2026, marks the fourth anniversary of the full-scale Russian invasion of Ukraine, a milestone characterized by a profound shift in the nature of the conflict and the stability of its supporting coalitions. On the front lines, the war has transitioned into a "robotic attrition" phase where unmanned ground vehicles (UGVs) and drones are now the [primary combat actors](#), utilized to offset critical personnel shortages on both sides. While Ukraine has successfully stabilized the front and limited Russian territorial gains to roughly 1% of the country over the past year, the strategic environment is increasingly clouded by the cessation of direct American military aid under the Trump administration and internal European fissures caused by Hungary and Slovakia's [blockage of aid packages](#).

Domestic Lithuanian affairs are dominated by a dual narrative of intense civic solidarity and high-level political instability. The "Radarom" fundraising telemarathon has successfully raised nearly 5 million euros to purchase [robotic combat squads](#) for Ukraine, demonstrating a persistent public commitment to regional security. However, this is contrasted by a significant corruption probe initiated by the Special Investigation Service (STT) involving prominent political figures Saulius Skvernelis and Kazys Starkevičius, which has shaken the [Lithuanian governance landscape](#). Internationally, a widening legal scandal involving the late Jeffrey Epstein has led to the arrest of high-ranking British officials, further distracting key allies from the Ukrainian theater.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

The Evolution of Robotic and Unmanned Warfare

- Military operations have moved almost entirely underground or into bunkers, with [robotic operators](#) controlling assets from tens of kilometers away to avoid omnipresent aerial surveillance.
- Unmanned ground systems have evolved from simple "toys" to [armored logistical platforms](#) capable of traveling over 40km to deliver food, ammunition, and medical evacuation services.
- Lithuania's "Radarom" campaign specifically targets the acquisition of "robot squads" to mitigate the [personnel deficit](#) currently hampering Ukrainian defensive maneuvers.

Fragmentation of the Western Support Coalition

- The United States has shifted its policy from providing military aid to [selling weapons](#) to Ukraine, with European nations now bearing the full financial burden of these purchases.
- Hungary and Slovakia are actively blocking a 90-billion-euro macro-financial loan and a new sanctions package, citing a [dispute over Russian oil](#) transit via Ukraine.
- Internal Ukrainian fatigue is rising as derybos (peace talks) remain stalled due to Russian [maximalist demands](#) and a perceived lack of clear security guarantees from NATO.

High-Level Corruption and Legal Warfare in Lithuania

- The Special Investigation Service (STT) conducted searches and questioned former Prime Minister Saulius Skvernelis and MP Kazys Starkevičius as [special witnesses](#) in a corruption probe.
- The investigation has triggered a debate over "legal warfare" (lawfare), with some political analysts suggesting the probe could be a [premeditated strike](#) against opposition leadership.
- Public trust in the Seimas and political parties remains at historic lows, exacerbated by the timing of these [high-profile investigations](#).

Global Elite Legal Crisis: The Epstein Fallout

- Former UK Ambassador to the US, Peter Mandelson, was arrested for [misconduct in public office](#) related to the sharing of government secrets with Jeffrey Epstein 17 years ago.

- Andrew Mountbatten-Windsor (formerly Prince Andrew) was also detained for questioning regarding [leaking confidential information](#) to Epstein's network.

Mexican Internal Security Collapse

- Approximately 10,000 troops have been deployed to maintain order after the killing of [cartel leader El Mencho](#).
- Retaliatory violence has resulted in the deaths of 25 National Guard members, with the US government advising citizens to [remain indoors](#) as flights and services are disrupted.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Economic Security and Sanctions Resilience

- Russian economic strategy has shifted to "cannibalizing" the [civilian economy](#) to fuel the war machine, resulting in stagnation in non-military sectors and rising inflation.
- EU Sanctions Envoy David O'Sullivan reports that Russia has lost approximately [450 billion euros](#) due to sanctions, though the "shadow fleet" and third-party evasion (China, India, Brazil) continue to provide a financial lifeline.
- The Russian VAT has been increased to 22% to cover [budget deficits](#), while small businesses face the elimination of fixed-tax benefits.

Technology Policy and Robotic Sovereignty

- Lithuania is emerging as a hub for military tech innovation, with the "Radaron" campaign focusing on [frontline robots](#) to reduce human casualties.

- The Ukrainian War Archive is grappling with a massive [data challenge](#), processing over 26 million files from open sources to document war crimes, requiring the development of bespoke AI sorting tools.

Energy Security and Diplomatic Frictions

- The "Druzhba" pipeline remains a flashpoint; Hungary and Slovakia accuse Ukraine of [deliberately stopping](#) the flow of Russian oil to exert political pressure.
- Russian strikes continue to target Ukraine's [energy infrastructure](#), with large cities like Kyiv facing total power outages that threaten the survival of vulnerable populations, including newborns in hospitals.

Corruption and Rule of Law

- The Lithuanian "Corruption Map" indicates that the Seimas and political parties are viewed as the [most corrupt institutions](#), a sentiment likely to be deepened by the current investigations into Skvernelis and Starkevičius.
- The Polish authorities arrested a Montenegrin citizen suspected of [spying for China](#) within Lithuania, highlighting the persistent threat of foreign intelligence operations in the Baltic region.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity in Lithuania is currently focused on national security restrictions and the formalization of international justice mechanisms for the Ukraine conflict.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED

- **Property Restrictions for Russian and Belarusian Citizens:** Proposed legislation would limit the ability of temporary residents from Russia and Belarus to [purchase real estate](#) near military polygons or critical infrastructure.
- **Special Tribunal for Aggression:** The Council of Europe is expected to adopt a resolution in the spring to establish a [special tribunal](#) to prosecute the crime of aggression against Ukraine.
- **Seimas Emergency Protocols:** The Seimas Board is holding closed-door meetings to establish a [parliamentary continuity plan](#) for use during extreme situations or military conflict.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS

- **Metropolitan Eustratius Briefing:** The head of the Orthodox Church of Ukraine visited the Seimas to advocate for [religious independence](#) from the Moscow Patriarchate, which he characterized as a tool of the Russian state.
- **LRT Forum on Political Corruption:** A heated debate regarding the STT probe into [political figures](#), questioning whether the investigation is a legitimate pursuit of justice or political theater.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Depersonalization of Combat

The conflict has reached a stage where human presence on the battlefield is increasingly synonymous with certain death. Both sides have reached a "transparency" equilibrium where nothing moves on the surface without being detected. Consequently, the [robotic](#)

[revolution](#) is not merely a technological upgrade but a mandatory adaptation to personnel exhaustion. Ukraine's reliance on volunteer-funded robotic squads indicates a shift toward a decentralized, crowd-sourced defense model, while Russia continues to rely on [coerced recruitment](#) and the pardoning of violent criminals to maintain its mass.

The "New Normal" of Russian Economic Stagnation

Despite Western hopes for a collapse, the Russian economy has proven resilient through extreme measures. The Kremlin is effectively "eating its future" by diverting all capital toward [military production](#), leading to a hollowing out of civilian services and infrastructure. The closure of airports over 3,000 times in a year and the rising cost of recruiting "rekrutai" (recruits) suggest that while the state can maintain the war, the [social contract](#) is fraying. The reliance on China and India for energy exports has created a new dependency that limits Russia's long-term strategic autonomy.

The Crisis of Global Institutional Credibility

The arrests of Mandelson and the investigation into Prince Andrew, coupled with the corruption probes in Lithuania and the gridlock in Brussels, suggest a broader crisis of institutional trust. In the West, retrospective justice regarding the Epstein network is [destabilizing political hierarchies](#). In the Baltics, the perception that anti-corruption tools are being used for [political maneuvering](#) threatens to undermine the unity needed to face Russian aggression.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Expected escalation of Russian strikes on the [Kyiv energy grid](#) as winter temperatures remain low, potentially forcing further evacuations or civilian casualties.
- Initial court appearances and potential immunity-stripping votes in the Seimas for [Skvernelis and Starkevičius](#), leading to domestic political protests or coalition instability.
- Heightened alert in the Middle East as the US continues to [evacuate non-essential personnel](#) from Beirut amid nuclear tensions with Iran.

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- The deployment of the first "Radaron" [robotic squads](#) to the Donbas, potentially leading to a new tactical stalemate or a localized Ukrainian breakthrough.
- Finalization of the Special Tribunal's [administrative structure](#), though actual trials of high-level Russian officials remain unlikely without a significant regime shift in Moscow.
- Potential for Mexico to descend into [greater civil unrest](#) as cartels compete for the power vacuum left by El Mencho, impacting US southern border security.

Long Term (1-5 Years)

- A permanent shift in European defense toward "unmanned-first" doctrines, with Lithuania positioning itself as a leader in [robotic warfare technology](#).

- Long-term structural damage to the Russian civilian economy, likely resulting in a [decade-long recovery period](#) post-conflict, assuming a peace agreement is eventually reached.
- Deepening of the "two-speed Europe" where frontline Baltic/Nordic states move toward total defense while [internal spoilers](#) like Hungary remain aligned with Eurasian interests.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy

- Allies must formalize a "European-only" financial mechanism for Ukraine to bypass [US congressional gridlock](#) and internal EU vetoes by Hungary.
- Prioritize the "Robotic Coalition" to provide Ukraine with the [technological edge](#) needed to maintain defensive lines with minimal human exposure.
- Strengthen counter-intelligence cooperation to address the [Chinese espionage](#) threat targeting Baltic security infrastructure.

For Private Sector/Investors

- **Defense Tech Opportunity:** Significant growth potential in companies developing [unmanned ground systems](#) and AI-driven data sorting for legal/military use.
- **Regulatory Risk:** High alert for companies operating in the Baltic real estate market, as new [national security restrictions](#) on non-resident purchases may impact liquidity and valuations.

- **Supply Chain Alert:** Continued volatility in the energy sector as the "Druzhba" pipeline becomes a [geopolitical hostage](#), necessitating alternative sourcing for Central European refineries.
