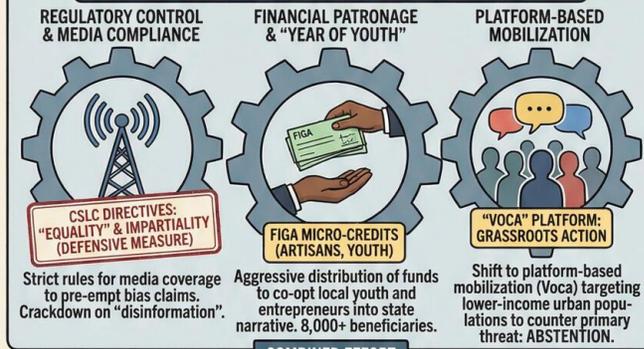

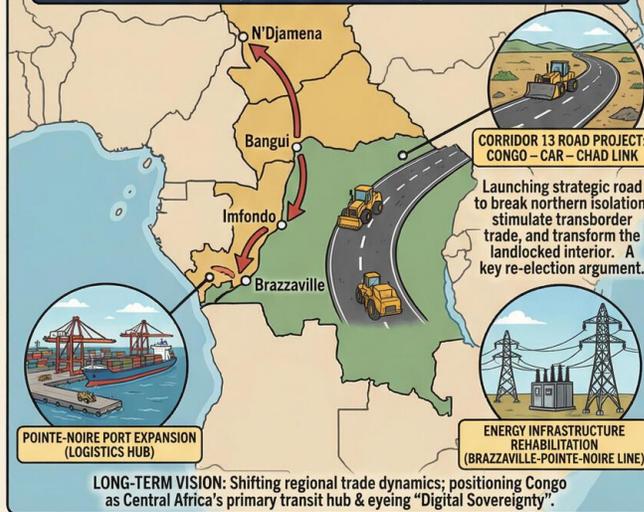

THE REPUBLIC OF CONGO NAVIGATES A CRITICAL JUNCTURE OF ELITE MOURNING AND ELECTORAL MOBILIZATION AS IT LAUNCHES STRATEGIC REGIONAL INFRASTRUCTURE.

The Republic of Congo is currently transitioning through a high-stakes period defined by the loss of a primary power broker, the launch of a multi-national transit corridor, and the final weeks of a presidential campaign. The death of Firmin Ayessa, Minister of State for Civil Service and a key "unifier" within the ruling Parti Congolais du Travail (PCT), has triggered a period of national mourning that doubles as a site for elite consolidation. President Denis Sassou Nguesso has used the funeral proceedings and subsequent travel to the northern Likuala department to project an image of "the tireless builder," emphasizing continuity and stability as the primary arguments for his re-election in March 2026. This narrative is being reinforced through the launch of the Corridor 13 road project, which aims to link Congo with the Central African Republic (CAR) and Chad, potentially transforming the landlocked interior of the sub-region.

Simultaneously, the state is intensifying its regulatory and social engineering efforts. The media regulator (CSLC) has issued strict directives to ensure "equality" in broadcast coverage, likely a defensive measure against claims of electoral bias. In the economic sphere, the government is aggressively distributing micro-credits through the Figa program to co-opt local artisans and youth into the state's developmental narrative. The day's coverage suggests a sophisticated "hybrid" campaign strategy that blends traditional patronage, massive infrastructure promises, and a modernization of the regulatory environment to appeal to both the rural base and international observers.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

The political landscape is dominated by the state funeral of [Firmin Ayessa](#), a pivotal figure in the Sassou Nguesso administration who served as the President's "strategic unifier" and chief of staff during critical constitutional changes. His burial in Makua marks the end of an era for the PCT's old guard, leaving a vacuum in the regime's negotiation apparatus just as the [March 2026 presidential election](#) cycle begins in earnest. The President has moved swiftly from the mourning site to Imfondo to launch [Corridor 13](#), a strategic road project designed to break the isolation of the northern departments and establish Congo as the primary transit hub for Central Africa.

In the background, the government is deploying financial instruments to secure voter loyalty. Minister Jacqueline Lydia Mikolo's tour of the Bouenza department to distribute [micro-credits through Figa](#) illustrates a focus on local entrepreneurship as a tool for social stability. Meanwhile,

intellectual and regulatory circles are debating the [ethics of AI and digital compliance](#), signaling an attempt to align Congolese tech policy with European GDPR standards to attract foreign investment. This convergence of mourning, infrastructure development, and financial patronage suggests a comprehensive state-led effort to minimize the risk of "abstention"—identified by the ruling party as its greatest electoral threat.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Death and Deification of Firmin Ayessa**
 - The state funeral for the Minister of State for Civil Service was attended by the full state apparatus, highlighting his role as a [political strategist and unifier](#) who managed relations with the opposition during the 2015 constitutional shift.
 - The mourning process has been leveraged to reiterate the **continuity of the PCT**, with eulogies framing Ayessa's loyalty as the [standard for the next generation](#) of leaders.
- **Launch of Corridor 13 Infrastructure Project**
 - President Sassou Nguesso arrived in Imfondo to launch construction on a road link connecting [Congo to CAR and Chad](#), a move intended to stimulate transborder trade.
 - The project is framed as the ultimate solution to the [northern "vasière" \(marshlands\)](#) that have historically hindered transport, boosting the President's "builder" credentials.
- **Regulatory Push for Electoral Compliance**
 - The CSLC (Superior Council for Freedom of Communication) issued [strict directives to media outlets](#) regarding the "equality of treatment" for candidates in the upcoming March polls.
 - The council emphasized that [media analyses must not distort](#) the messages of candidates, suggesting a crackdown on perceived "disinformation" or biased commentary.
- **Deployment of the "Colissa Figa" Micro-credit Program**
 - Government ministers distributed checks ranging from 30,000 to 80,000 CFA to [hundreds of artisans in Bouenza](#) to promote self-employment.
 - The program has reached over [8,000 beneficiaries nationwide](#), functioning as a decentralized economic stimulus and a pillar of the 2024 "Year of Youth" initiative.
- **Strategic University and Scientific Cooperation**
 - The University Denis Sassou Nguesso (UDSN) and the [University of Kinshasa \(UNIKIN\)](#) signed an agreement for joint research and doctoral training.
 - This academic alliance between the "two closest capitals in the world" focuses on [science and development](#), signaling a desire for regional intellectual sovereignty.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

• Elite Politics & Leadership Dynamics

- The passing of Ayessa and other senior figures like [Philippe Mvouo](#) (former CSLC president) marks a significant thinning of the old guard.
- President Sassou Nguesso's personal involvement in the burial in Makua serves to [shore up his base](#) in the northern Cuvette region.

• Technology Policy & Digital Sovereignty

- Expert analysis on "Compliance" suggests Congo is eyeing a [GDPR-style regulatory framework](#) to manage data and AI risks.
- The state is warning against the [dangers of ChatGPT](#) in enterprise environments regarding data leaks, while simultaneously promoting "digital schools" as a sign of progress [via fiber optic expansion](#).

• Economic Security & Labor

- The "Year of Youth" continues to be the primary domestic policy vehicle, with projects like [self-employment training in Brazzaville and Pointe-Noire](#) starting in March 2026.
- The government is attempting to pivot youth away from the [civil service toward entrepreneurship](#), citing the richness of the soil as a viable alternative to state employment.

• Energy Security & Infrastructure

- Technical rehabilitation of the [Pointe-Noire to Brazzaville electric line](#) is underway, with new transformers being installed at the Boundji and Mindouli substations.
- The [Mindouli station](#) is seeing civil engineering work to stabilize voltage for industrial and domestic consumers.

• Geopolitical Power Dynamics

- The celebration of Russia's ["Defender of the Fatherland Day"](#) in Brazzaville, involving 400 youths, underscores a growing cultural and security alignment with Moscow.
- Turkey remains a critical partner for high-end medical care, as evidenced by [Ayessa's treatment in Istanbul](#) prior to his death.

• Food & Water Access/Security

- The [first Grand Agricultural Fair \(GFAg\)](#) concluded with a call for "national unity through the land," framing agriculture as the driver of economic diversification.
- The promotion of ["Bio" products from the Sangha department](#) (e.g., cocoa butter) at the fair suggests an emerging focus on value-added exports.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Governance activity focused on regulatory directives for the upcoming election and the

administrative restructuring of development funds for youth and micro-enterprises.

- **BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED**

- **Decree on Electoral Media Coverage:** The CSLC issued formal directives based on [Arrêté No. 225](#) to regulate how the March 2026 election is handled by state and private media.
- **National Development Plan (PND) 2022-2026:** Continued focus on the [acceleration of youth insertion](#) programs as part of the overarching strategic plan.

- **HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS**

- **CSLC Press Conference:** Médard Milandou met with traditional and online media leaders to [enforce impartiality](#) and equal airtime for all candidates.
- **Figa Partnership Signing:** Figa and Nkayi Innovab signed a convention to implement [technical and financial support](#) for artisans in the Bouenza department.
- **Gendarmerie Command Installation:** Colonel Alain Martial Kouébé was installed as the [new commander for the Alima region](#), with a mission to ensure security during the election.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The "Abstention" Battle and Hybrid Mobilization The ruling PCT has identified [abstention as the primary opponent](#) in the March 2026 election. To counter this, they are deploying "hybrid" support platforms like **Voca**, which claims to represent the [voices of neighborhoods](#) and intends to mobilize 73,000 members through a macro-program of field action. This represents a shift from purely top-down party structures to "platform-based"

mobilization aimed at lower-income urban populations.

Infrastructure as Political Redemption

The "Corridor 13" project and the "Corniche" viaducts in Brazzaville are being messaged not just as economic tools, but as [symbols of resilience](#) that have "crossed the valley of doubt." By launching the Likuala corridor just weeks before the vote, the administration is attempting to [concrete its legacy](#) and demonstrate that landlocked regions are finally being integrated into the national economy.

Digital Compliance and Global Alignment

A surprising trend is the sophisticated internal debate regarding **Digital Compliance**. Expert testimony emphasizes that [Congo cannot trust external tech providers](#) blindly and must develop its own experts in data privacy and compliance. This push for "professionalizing" the regulatory environment is likely aimed at making the Congolese market [safer for international fintech](#) and cloud services, while maintaining sovereignty over citizen data.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

- **Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect a surge in [state-led rallies in Pointe-Noire](#) and northern departments as the official campaign launches on February 28. Security forces will likely increase their presence in the Likuala region following the [Corridor 13 launch](#) to protect construction sites and the President during his tour.

- **Medium Term (1-6 Months):** Post-election, the government will likely face pressure to deliver on the [micro-credit promises](#) made during the campaign. Failure to sustain the "Figa" program could lead to localized unrest among the youth who were promised "autonomy." The [rehabilitated power lines](#) between Brazzaville and Pointe-Noire will be a critical test of whether industrial productivity can actually increase as promised.
- **Long Term (1-5 Years):** The successful completion of Corridor 13 could fundamentally shift **trade dynamics in Central Africa**, making Pointe-Noire the de facto port for Bangui and N'Djamena. Structurally, the passing of the "Ayessa generation" will necessitate a [total reshuffling of the PCT elite](#), potentially leading to a more technocratic administration as the state eyes "digital sovereignty."

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

- **For International Policy:**
 - The [Russia-Congo cultural alignment](#) warrants monitoring; sports and "defender" events are precursors to deeper security and youth-focused propaganda partnerships.
 - Corridor 13 offers a major opportunity for [regional stability](#) by providing Chad and CAR with a reliable, non-river-dependent outlet for trade through Brazzaville.
 - The CSLC's focus on "impartiality" in media should be viewed with skepticism, as [compliance with state narratives](#) is often the hidden requirement for broadcast licenses during election cycles.
- **For Private Sector/Investors:**
 - **Infrastructure/Logistics:** The Corridor 13 project and [Pointe-Noire port expansion](#) (despite recent crane accidents) indicate a heavy state commitment to the logistics sector.
 - **Fintech/Compliance:** The government's interest in [GDPR-style data regulation](#) creates a demand for compliance consultants and cybersecurity services as companies are forced to "professionalize" their data management.
 - **Agriculture:** Opportunities exist in the [transformation of raw materials](#) (e.g., cocoa, fruit juices) as the state seeks to move away from imports and promote "Made in Congo" through its productive school initiatives.
