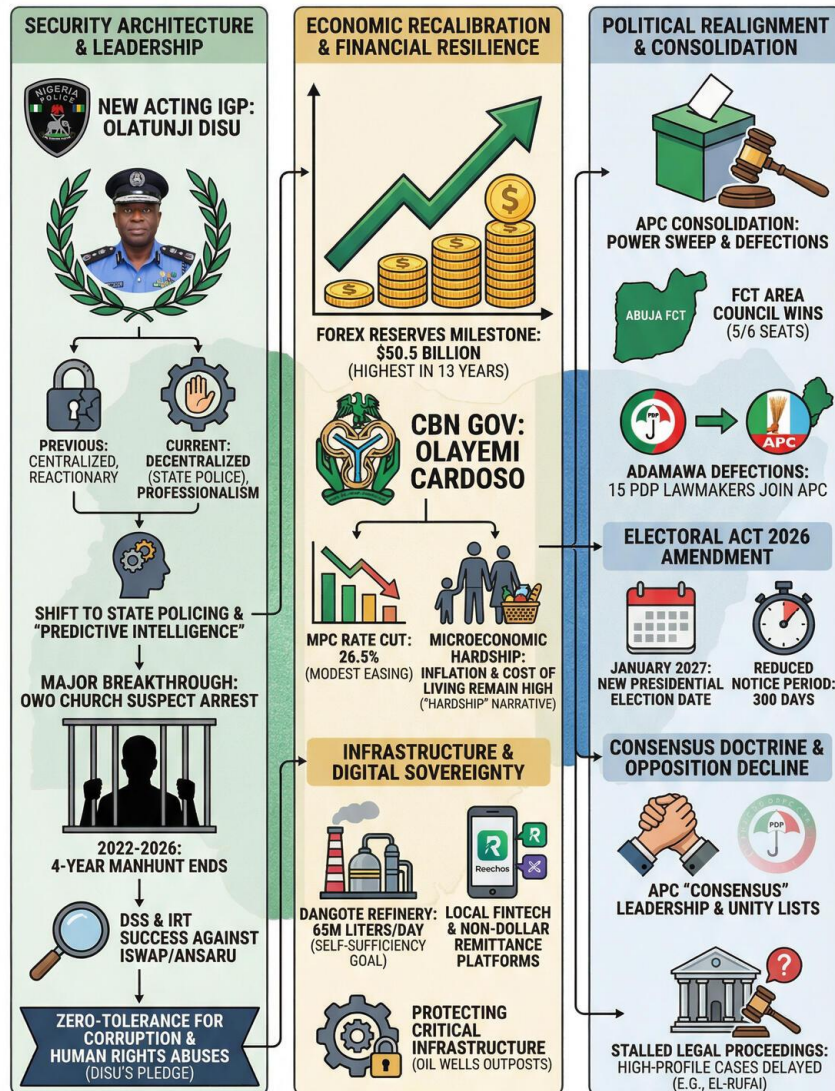

## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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February 25, 2026, marked a pivotal juncture for Nigerian internal security and political architecture. The administration of President Bola Tinubu executed a significant leadership change in the Nigeria Police Force (NPF), appointing [Olatunji Disu](#) as Acting Inspector General of Police (IGP) following the sudden resignation of Kayode Egbetokun. This transition occurs as the government aggressively pivots toward a decentralized [state policing model](#) to address persistent insecurity in rural and remote regions. Simultaneously, security agencies reported a major breakthrough with the arrest of the [sixth suspect](#) involved in the 2022 Owo church massacre, signaling a hardening stance against ISWAP and Ansaru elements.

On the economic front, the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) reported a milestone as gross [foreign exchange reserves](#) climbed to \$50.5 billion, the highest in 13 years. Despite this

macro-level success, the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) opted for a modest rate cut to [26.5%](#), reflecting a cautious "pivot to easing" while remaining wary of election-related inflationary pressures in 2027. The political landscape is witnessing a rapid consolidation of power by the All Progressives Congress (APC), following a near-sweep of [FCT Area Council elections](#) and a massive defection of [15 PDP lawmakers](#) in Adamawa State, effectively hollowing out the opposition ahead of the next general election cycle.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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- **Leadership Change in National Security:** President Tinubu decorated Acting IGP Olatunji Disu, charging him to restore [public confidence](#) and prioritize professionalism. Disu has declared a [zero-tolerance policy](#) for corruption and human rights abuses, acknowledging that the force cannot "perform miracles with nothing."
- **Security Breakthrough in Terrorism Investigation:** The Department of State Services (DSS) arrested Sani Yusuf, an alleged ISWAP commander, in [Edo State](#). Yusuf is linked to the 2022 Owo church massacre and the [Suleja military barracks attack](#), ending a four-year manhunt.
- **Economic Easing and Reserve Growth:** CBN Governor Olayemi Cardoso confirmed that [gross reserves](#) have reached \$50.45 billion. The MPC reduced the Monetary Policy Rate (MPR) by 50 basis points to [26.5%](#), though analysts express concern over the lack of [capital funding](#) for federal projects.

- **Political Realignment and Opposition Decline:** The APC secured five of six [FCT chairmanship seats](#), leading to allegations of voter suppression from the PDP. In Adamawa, [15 PDP lawmakers](#), including the Speaker, resigned from their party, citing internal crises and shifting the legislative balance of power.
- **Stalled Legal Proceedings for High-Profile Figures:** The arraignment of former Kaduna Governor Nasir El-Rufai on [wiretapping charges](#) was delayed until April 23, 2026, due to his absence from court. He is reportedly in the [custody of the ICPC](#), creating a conflict between law enforcement agencies.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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### Security Architecture and State Police:

The administration is formalizing its commitment to [state policing](#) to combat banditry. Acting IGP Disu is viewed as an "operational" leader capable of managing this [tactical shift](#), given his background with the Rapid Response Squad (RRS) model in Lagos.

**Corruption and Fiscal Transparency:** A significant dispute has erupted in Osun State involving [Salitiba Consulting](#) and the state government over an alleged [N13.7 billion payroll fraud](#). While the consultant claims massive savings through biometric audits, the state government maintains the figure is closer to [N47 million](#), leading to mutual accusations of blackmail and litigation.

**Energy Security and Infrastructure:** Efforts to protect [critical infrastructure](#) have intensified, with military troops establishing [permanent outposts](#) at the Adibawa oil wells in Rivers State to curb illegal bunkering. Simultaneously, the [Dangote Refinery](#) is project-

ed to supply 65 million liters of petrol daily, aiming for national self-sufficiency.

### Elite Politics and Succession Planning:

The APC is utilizing "consensus" and "unity lists" to manage internal friction ahead of its [national convention](#). This strategy aims to prevent [factional crises](#) that have traditionally plagued Nigerian political parties, though tensions remain high in [Ondo State](#).

### Digital Sovereignty and Financial Resilience:

The fintech sector is being encouraged toward [local participation](#) to enhance "digital sovereignty." Companies like Reechos are advocating for [intra-Africa remittance](#) platforms that bypass the US dollar to strengthen the Naira's position under AfCFTA.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Legislative activity centered on the implementation of the [2026 Electoral Act amendment](#), which has significantly altered the timeline for the 2027 elections. The National Assembly is also scrutinizing the [renewable energy sector](#), focusing on the domiciliation of foreign grants and green energy investments.

- **2026 Electoral Act Amendment:** The new act reduces the [notice period for elections](#) from 360 to 300 days, effectively moving the presidential election to [January 2027](#).
- **Renewable Energy Probe:** The House Committee on Renewable Energy has mandated the IGP to [arrest and produce](#) officials who failed to account for foreign grants received since 2015.

- **Executive Order on Oil Revenue:** President Tinubu signed an [Executive Order](#) directing that all oil and gas revenues be remitted directly to the [Federation Account](#), stripping the NNPC of its 30% management fee deduction.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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### **The Rise of Hybrid Security Management:**

Nigeria is transitioning from a centralized, reactionary security posture to one focused on "predictive intelligence" and [inter-agency collaboration](#). The appointment of Olatunji Disu—a leader with experience in [international peacekeeping](#) and tactical units—suggests a professionalization of the force intended to reduce reliance on the military for [internal security](#).

**The "Consensus" Doctrine of the APC:** The ruling party is increasingly adopting [consensus-based](#) leadership selection to maintain cohesion. This "guided democracy" or "unity list" approach is a strategic move to project [stability](#) and attract defectors from the fractured PDP, though critics argue it suppresses internal [competition](#).

**Macroeconomic Recovery vs. Microeconomic Hardship:** There is a stark divergence between [macroeconomic indicators](#) (surging reserves, moderate inflation decline) and the "contrasting reality" of hardship in communities like [AjaraBadia](#). This "hardship" narrative is the most popular word in Nigeria today, creating a [political risk](#) if reform benefits do not "percolate" to the urban and rural poor.

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect a flurry of "sheriff in town" operations by Acting IGP

Disu to signal [operational readiness](#). The Nigeria Police Council and Senate will likely move swiftly toward [ratification](#) of his appointment. Social media scrutiny of past official conduct, as seen in the [Simi controversy](#), will continue to influence public perception of public figures.

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** The [recapitalization of 33 banks](#) will be a major fiscal theme, with 13 banks still racing to meet the [minimum capital requirements](#). The APC will likely secure further [defections](#) in state assemblies as the opposition's structural crises deepen ahead of the January 2027 election date.

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** The structural shift toward [state police](#) and local pharmaceutical [manufacturing](#) represents an attempt at true "Renewed Hope" sovereignty. However, the high cost of treatment for basic [rural health-care](#) (e.g., snakebites) and the reliance on [traditional healers](#) remain a long-term threat to state capacity and human capital.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### **For International Policy:**

- The arrest of the Owo church suspect demonstrates [increased surveillance](#) capabilities; Western partners should enhance technical support for the DSS and IRT.
- The \$50B reserve milestone improves Nigeria's [creditworthiness](#), potentially leading to more favorable terms for international bonds.
- The 2026 Electoral Act shifts the political calendar; diplomatic missions must recalibrate [election monitoring](#) missions for a January 2027 window.

## For Private Sector/Investors:

- The [PIV-UHC reform](#) offers a massive opportunity for investors in local [pharmaceutical manufacturing](#) as Nigeria seeks security of supply.
- The automation of [license and permit](#) processes in the automotive sector will reduce [transaction costs](#) for manufacturers like Proforce.
- The MPC's cautious rate cut suggests that [liquidity](#) remains tight; companies should prioritize [treasury management](#) and explore non-dollar trade platforms.
