





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DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

The geopolitical landscape of Northern South America and the Caribbean is undergoing a fundamental realignment following the January 2026 capture of Nicolás Maduro and Cilia Flores by United States forces. A central theme of the day's coverage is the formal reshuffling of the Venezuelan regime's inner circle, most notably the [resignation of Tarek William Saab](#) as Fiscal General to return to the role of Ombudsman (Defensor del Pueblo). This maneuver, coupled with the appointment of Larry Devoe as interim Fiscal General, suggests a strategic reorganization of legal and human rights oversight as the country navigates a fragile transition under what opposition leaders openly describe as [U.S. tutelage](#). Meanwhile, the "Ley de Amnistía" (Amnesty Law) remains a point of intense friction; while the regime claims hundreds of releases, opposition figures dismiss it as

"chucuta" (incomplete) for failing to include military dissidents or allow for the return of exiles.

Regional stability is further threatened by a sharp escalation in trade tensions between Colombia and Ecuador. Following accusations of security failures along their shared border, President Daniel Noboa of Ecuador has implemented a "security tax" and tariffs, prompting [reciprocal 30% tariffs](#) from Colombia on over 60 products. Business leaders from both nations warn that this "dialogue of the deaf" threatens a decades-long history of deep industrial integration. Simultaneously, internal security in Colombia remains precarious, evidenced by the discovery of an ELN explosives factory in Bogotá producing [plastic-bodied grenades](#) specifically designed for drone delivery, indicating a sophisticated technological evolution in guerrilla tactics.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Reorganization of the Venezuelan State Apparatus:** Tarek William Saab has vacated the Public Ministry to resume the position of Ombudsman, a move seen as consolidating loyalist control over human rights narratives during the post-Maduro transition. [Larry Daniel Devoe](#) has been installed as the interim Fiscal General.
- **The "Maduro Capture" Narrative at the U.S. State of the Union:** President Donald Trump's State of the Union address highlighted the "results" of the January incursion into Venezuela by hosting Enrique Márquez, a recently released political prisoner, rather than María Corina Machado. Analysts suggest this was intended to showcase [immediate humanitarian outcomes](#) of U.S. military action.

- **Colombia-Ecuador Trade Conflict:** A breakdown in diplomatic dialogue regarding border security has led to a full-scale trade spat. Colombia has imposed [national security tariffs](#) of 30% on Ecuadorean goods, threatening supply chains in the agro-industrial and energy sectors.
- **ELN Drone Warfare Evolution:** Intelligence operations in Bogotá dismantled a clandestine workshop producing specialized ordnance for [drones for the ELN](#). The use of plastic casings for grenades increases lethality by allowing drones to carry higher quantities of explosives.
- **Aruban Institutional Negligence and Public Health:** A five-year-old child is in a coma in Colombia after being [forgotten in a daycare van](#) for several hours in San Nicolas, sparking a national outcry regarding childcare regulations and emergency response.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Elite Politics & Leadership Dynamics

- The transition in Venezuela is marked by a "musical chairs" approach to high-level appointments. Tarek William Saab's move back to the Ombudsman role is interpreted by some as a tactical retreat to a position that may offer [better legal protection](#) or influence over upcoming human rights investigations.
- The absence of María Corina Machado at the U.S. State of the Union has sparked speculation about her current standing within the [U.S.-led transition plan](#), with some suggesting the U.S. administration is prioritizing "results-oriented" figures like Enrique Márquez.

National Security & Terrorism

- The neutralization of "Alias Plumilla," an ELN explosives expert, reveals a domestic terrorism threat focused on [disrupting upcoming elections](#) in Colombia. The presence of industrial lathes and plastic grenade molds indicates a shift toward high-tech, localized manufacturing of weapons.
- Cuba-U.S. tensions have spiked following a [deadly shootout](#) involving a Florida-registered vessel and Cuban border guards, leaving four dead, including one American. The U.S. remains skeptical of Havana's "terrorist infiltration" narrative.

Rule of Law & Legal Warfare (Lawfare)

- The Venezuelan Amnesty Law is criticized for its [exclusive nature](#), barring military officers and exiles from its benefits. Opposition leaders argue that reconciliation is impossible without addressing crimes against humanity, which are not subject to amnesty under international law.
- In Mexico, the death of Nemesio "El Mencho" Oseguera Cervantes during a federal raid in Jalisco represents a significant, albeit violent, milestone in the [war against the CJNG](#).

Trade & Economic Security

- The ANDI (Colombia) and the Ecuadorean Business Committee warn that using [tariffs as pressure tools](#) for security issues is "clumsy" and risks permanent damage to the Andean Community (CAN) integration model.

- Aruba is weighing the [reopening of its air border](#) with Venezuela for May or June 2026, contingent on security assessments from the Netherlands and socio-economic stability in Venezuela.

Biosurveillance & Public Health

- Mexico is facing a severe [measles outbreak](#), with over 11,200 confirmed cases and 32 deaths since the beginning of 2025, leading to the deployment of mega-vaccination centers.
- The arrival of [Sahara dust](#) in the Caribbean earlier than usual is creating respiratory risks for vulnerable populations in Aruba and the surrounding region.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislation and policy discussions centered on the "Ley de Amnistía" in Venezuela and the implementation of protective trade tariffs in the Andean region. In the United States, congressional oversight into the Epstein case dominated headlines, emphasizing institutional failures.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Ley de Amnistía (Venezuela):** A government-promulgated law aimed at releasing prisoners; officials claim [4,151 beneficiaries](#), but opposition leaders contend it is a "truncated" law that excludes key figures and does not address the roots of political persecution.
- **National Security Tariffs (Colombia/Ecuador):** Executive decrees in both nations implementing [reciprocal 30% duties](#) on a wide range of industrial and agricultural products, cited as a response to border security failures.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Hillary Clinton Congressional Testimony:** The former Secretary of State testified regarding the [Jeffrey Epstein investigation](#), denying any personal knowledge of his crimes and criticizing the committee for failing to hold public hearings.
- **Juan Pablo Guanipa Interview:** The Venezuelan opposition leader detailed his [recapture and subsequent release](#), highlighting the arbitrary nature of the Venezuelan judicial system under current conditions.
- **Aruba Health Ministry Briefing:** Minister Mervin Wyatt-Ras addressed the [homelessness and addiction crisis](#) in Oranjestad, announcing the formation of a task force and a "start from zero" policy approach.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Architecture of Post-Maduro Venezuela

The transcripts reveal a Venezuela in a state of "supervised transition." While the U.S. has physically removed Maduro, the [existing bureaucratic structure](#) remains largely intact, characterized by the reshuffling of familiar faces like Tarek William Saab. Securitization of Regional Trade

A dangerous trend is emerging in the Andean region where border security failures are being directly translated into protectionist trade policies. The [Colombia-Ecuador tariff war](#) is not merely an economic dispute but a symptom of the breakdown in diplomatic capacity to manage transnational crime. By taxing the "legitimate" economy to punish "illegitimate" security lapses, both governments are paradoxically weakening the very industrial sectors that provide the formal employment necessary for long-term stability.

Technological Leap in Non-State Warfare

The discovery of the ELN's [drone-optimized explosives](#) marks a critical point in regional security. Guerrilla groups are no longer merely adapting commercial technology but are actively manufacturing specialized components (plastic casings) to bypass detection and increase the payload of aerial attacks. This represents a significant challenge for traditional counter-insurgency forces and signals a future where [asymmetric aerial threats](#) become the norm in urban and rural conflict zones.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect heightened friction on the Colombia-Ecuador border as transport sectors react to the tariffs. In Venezuela, the first reporting requirements for conditionally released prisoners will likely lead to [new cycles of arrests](#) if any "activism" is perceived. Public protests in Aruba regarding daycare safety and negligence are

likely to intensify following the coma of the five-year-old child.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The proposed [reopening of the Aruba-Venezuela border](#) in May/June will serve as a bellwether for the region's willingness to re-engage with the post-Maduro administration. If the trade war between Colombia and Ecuador is not resolved via the Andean Community (CAN), expect permanent shifts in supply chains toward Brazilian or North American suppliers.

Long Term (1-5 Years): The Venezuelan transition is likely to be characterized by "hybrid governance" where U.S. military/economic oversight clashes with a deeply embedded [Chavista bureaucracy](#). The success of this model depends on whether a credible electoral path can be established without triggering a full-scale civil war or a total collapse of the state's remaining capacity.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The U.S. must clarify the legal status of its "tutelage" in Venezuela to avoid the perception of an [unending occupation](#), which could undermine the legitimacy of the interim government.
- International mediators (possibly Brazil or the EU) should intervene in the Colombia-Ecuador spat to decouple [trade tariffs](#) from border security issues.
- The OAS and UN must address the [measles crisis in Mexico](#) as a regional biosecurity threat, given the high volume of migrant transit through the country.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- Investors in the Andean region should prepare for [increased logistics costs](#) and potential cargo delays as border controls between Colombia and Ecuador become more politicized.
- The Aruba-Venezuela air border reopening presents an [investment opportunity](#) in the aviation and tourism sectors, but carries high compliance risks regarding U.S. sanctions that may still apply to certain Venezuelan entities.
- Companies in the security and drone-defense sectors should anticipate a surge in demand for [counter-UAS technology](#) among South American governments facing high-tech guerrilla threats.
