



DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 28, 2026, marks a pivotal moment of global instability and domestic consolidation. Internationally, the geopolitical landscape has been upended by a massive joint military operation by the United States and Israel against Iran, dubbed "Operation Epic Fury." Reports indicate a high-scale incursion aimed at destroying Iran's nuclear infrastructure, with unconfirmed but widespread reports suggesting the [death of Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei](#). This escalation has triggered immediate Iranian retaliation against US bases in Bahrain, Qatar, Kuwait, and the UAE, while global powers advise citizens to evacuate the region. Simultaneously, tensions rise in the Caribbean as the US administration signals a potential "friendly takeover" of Cuba amid an ongoing energy blockade, and in South Asia, where

Pakistan and Afghanistan engage in lethal border skirmishes.

Domestically, Mexico is navigating a fragile transition following the February 22 capture and death of Nemesio Oseguera Cervantes, "El Mencho," leader of the Jalisco New Generation Cartel (CJNG). While the government promotes the arrival of the 2026 World Cup trophy as a [symbol of international confidence](#), the security reality remains grim, with the military confirming 28 fatalities among its ranks during the operation and its violent aftermath. Amidst this, President Sheinbaum is pushing a radical electoral reform to eliminate proportional representation and the preliminary results system (PREP), moves that critics argue centralize power. Economic narratives are dominated by Pemex's reported debt reduction and the ongoing legal warfare against billionaire Ricardo Salinas Pliego over significant unpaid tax liabilities.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Operation Epic Fury and the Potential Decapitation of the Iranian State**
 - The US and Israel launched a massive military incursion into Iran, targeting the [nuclear program and leadership](#) centers.
 - Rumors of Ayatollah Khamenei's death circulate as the US administration claims the Iranian nuclear program has been [totally destroyed](#).
 - Retaliatory strikes by Iran targeted the [US Fifth Fleet](#) in Bahrain and bases in Qatar and Kuwait.

- **Aftermath of El Mencho's Capture and CJNG Reorganization**

- The Mexican government confirmed the successful neutralization of the CJNG leader but acknowledged the [loss of 28 soldiers](#) in the operation.
- Four regional leaders of the CJNG are currently under investigation as the group undergoes a [forced reorganization](#).
- Public activities in Guadalajara and Jalisco are returning to "normality" under heavy military [presence and patrols](#).

- **Radical Electoral Reform Proposal in Mexico**

- President Sheinbaum has proposed eliminating "plurinominales" (proportional representation) in the Senate and reducing them in the [Chamber of Deputies](#).
- The proposal includes the [elimination of the PREP](#), arguing that direct district counts should provide immediate official results.
- Opposition parties and some analysts view these changes as a threat to [electoral democracy](#) and minority representation.

- **US Escalation Toward Cuba and Regional Interests**

- President Trump suggested a [friendly takeover](#) of Cuba, citing the island's severe economic distress and lack of resources.
- The rhetoric follows an energy blockade and a violent incident involving a [stolen US vessel](#) intercepted by Cuban authorities.

- **Significant Corporate Realignment in Global Media**

- Paramount and Skydance have secured a deal to acquire Warner assets for [110 billion dollars](#) after Netflix withdrew its bid.
- The deal appears influenced by intense [political pressure](#) from the White House against Netflix's leadership.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Geopolitical Power Dynamics & International Relations

The global order is currently characterized by aggressive unilateralism. The US-Israel strike on Iran occurred without [UN Security Council](#) approval, signaling a breakdown in international law. This is echoed in the Caribbean, where the US administration is openly discussing the [annexation or takeover](#) of Cuba under the guise of humanitarian intervention. Regional conflicts are also heating up in South Asia, where [clashes between Afghanistan](#) and Pakistan have resulted in civilian casualties in urban areas.

Security Architecture & Domestic Stability

Mexico is attempting to project an image of stability through the [World Cup trophy tour](#), yet the underlying security architecture is under extreme stress. While homicides in Sinaloa have reportedly [dropped by 50%](#) since the peak following Ismael "El Mayo" Zambada's capture, the state remains a theater for high-profile violence, including the [murder of a búsqedora](#) (searcher) and the disappearance of tourists and miners.

Economic Security & Financial Resilience

The Sheinbaum administration is emphasizing the financial recovery of state entities. Pemex has reportedly reduced its debt to the [lowest level in 11 years](#), reaching 85.2 billion dollars,

aided by government capital injections. Simultaneously, the state is aggressively pursuing tax debts from high-profile elites, notably Ricardo Salinas Pliego, who is embroiled in [32 judicial processes](#) over billions in unpaid taxes.

Labor & Industry In Argentina, the Senate has passed a controversial [labor modernization law](#) under Javier Milei. The reform significantly reduces indemnifications, limits the right to strike, and permits 12-hour workdays, sparking [massive street protests](#) and chants against what demonstrators call "slavery."

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The legislative agenda in Mexico and South America is focused on structural reforms that redefine the relationship between the state, the electorate, and the workforce. In Mexico, the executive is aggressively pursuing electoral changes, while Argentina has successfully moved to deregulate its labor market.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Mexican Electoral Reform Proposal:** A constitutional initiative to eliminate [proportional representation](#) (plurinominales) and the PREP system. It aims to reduce the Senate to 64 members plus "best losers" and mandates that all representatives be directly [voted by citizens](#).
- **Argentine Labor Modernization Law:** Legislation passed by the Senate to [reduce severance pay](#), allow payments in kind, and increase the flexibility of work shifts to 12 hours.

- **Argentine Mining Investment Reform:** A legal change in Argentina to [reduce protected areas](#) and expand mining investment opportunities in previously restricted sites.

- **Sinaloa Security Briefing:** Secretary of Security Omar García Harfuch and President Sheinbaum held a "mañanera" in Culiacán to present [reduction figures](#) in high-impact crimes and the results of the "attention to causes" programs for youth.
- **Gabinete de Seguridad Report:** Updates on the [disappeared miners](#) in Concordia and the arrest of "El Lexus," a Gulf Cartel leader in Tamaulipas.
- **World Cup Reception Ceremony:** Foreign Minister Juan Ramón de la Fuente and US/Canadian diplomats officially [received the FIFA trophy](#), emphasizing Mexico's readiness for the 2026 tournament.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of Corporate Strategy

A burgeoning trend is the direct interference of state leadership in major corporate mergers to ensure ideological alignment. The [withdrawal of Netflix](#) from the Warner acquisition following personal attacks by Donald Trump on board members like Susan Rice suggests that "anti-woke" rhetoric is being used as a regulatory tool to force market consolidation into the hands of "traditional" or politically compliant entities like Paramount.

Soft Power vs. Kinetic Reality Mexico is aggressively using the 2026 World Cup as a

[symbolic shield](#) to deflect international alarm over security. By focusing on the arrival of the trophy and the rehabilitation of 500 soccer fields, the government seeks to counter the narrative of a "failed state" triggered by the [violent reaction](#) to El Mencho's capture. This creates a dichotomy between the "festive" preparations for 2026 and the 28 caskets of soldiers who died in a single week of anti-cartel operations.

State-Led Anti-Elite Populism The Mexican government's focus on the [debts of Salinas Pliego](#) and the reduction of Pemex's debt reflects a trend of "Statecraft as Financial Resilience." By framing the collection of taxes from billionaires as a moral imperative and the cleaning of Pemex's books as "energy sovereignty," the administration is consolidating its base while tightening its control over the [national economy](#).

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

- **Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect extreme volatility in global energy markets as the [conflict in Iran](#) expands. In Mexico, the "Pax Militar" in Jalisco will remain tense as regional CJNG leaders decide whether to splinter or coordinate a counter-offensive. The [Shakira concert](#) in Mexico City will be used as a major public relations event to demonstrate urban safety and "democratization of space."
- **Medium Term (1-6 Months):** The debate over Mexico's [electoral reform](#) will likely lead to significant legislative friction and potentially mass protests from civil society. In Argentina, the implementation of [labor reforms](#) may lead to prolonged general strikes and social unrest, testing the Milei administration's resolve.

- **Long Term (1-5 Years):** If the Iranian regime has indeed been decapitated, the Middle East faces a generational [power vacuum](#) that could lead to widespread civil war or a series of puppet governments. Mexico's 2026 World Cup will serve as the ultimate litmus test for the Sheinbaum administration's ability to maintain "institutional response" in the face of [high-impact criminal violence](#).

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The unilateral nature of "Operation Epic Fury" necessitates a [reevaluation of alliances](#) with the US and Israel, as regional escalation risks global supply chain collapse.
- Diplomatic channels must prepare for a [regime change scenario](#) in Cuba, as the US administration signals a move away from containment toward direct intervention.
- Monitor the "Sinaloa Model" of [arms interdiction](#) (80% from the US) as it will remain a primary point of contention in bilateral security dialogues.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- Energy firms should anticipate continued [import reductions](#) in Mexico as the "Two Mouths" (Dos Bocas) refinery and the transformation of the National Refining System increase domestic gasoline production.
- Media and tech investors must account for [political risk](#) in M&A activity, as US executive pressure is now a tangible factor in cross-border corporate deals.

- Mining interests in Argentina face a more [permissive regulatory environment](#) but must weigh this against the risk of civil unrest and labor disputes following the passage of the "modernization" laws.
