

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 28, 2026, marked a seismic shift in global geopolitics as the United States and Israel launched [Operation Epic Fury](#), a massive coordinated aerial campaign against the Islamic Republic of Iran. The operation, which targeted nuclear facilities, ballistic missile sites, and leadership compounds, resulted in the [death of Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei](#). While the Pentagon and Israeli officials characterized the strikes as a preventive measure against an "imminent threat," the explicit stated goal transitioned rapidly into [regime change](#), with President Donald Trump and Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu calling on the Iranian people to seize their government.

The regional fallout was immediate and widespread. Iran's Revolutionary Guard (IRGC) launched retaliatory waves of drones and missiles against [US military bases](#) across Qatar, Bahrain, Kuwait, and the UAE, while

also declaring the [Strait of Hormuz off-limits](#) to international shipping. This blockade immediately spiked oil prices and disrupted global aviation. Simultaneously, a secondary "open war" flared on the Afghan-Pakistan border as [Pakistan bombed Kabul](#) and other cities, accusing the Taliban of harboring militants. These concurrent conflicts highlight a dangerous disintegration of stability across the Middle East and South Asia, pushing international institutions to a breaking point.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Operation Epic Fury and the Death of Ali Khamenei

- The US and Israel conducted [daylight strikes](#) against hundreds of targets, including the high-security "Beit Rahbari" compound in Tehran.
- President Trump confirmed the [death of Khamenei](#), calling it the "single greatest chance" for Iranian freedom.
- Israeli intelligence suggests the timing was chosen to coincide with a [gathering of high-ranking](#) political and military commanders.
- Internal Iranian reports indicate the [Defense Minister](#) and the Secretary of the Supreme National Security Council were also killed.

Regional Retaliation and the Hormuz Blockade

- The IRGC targeted the [US Fifth Fleet](#) in Bahrain and the Al-Udeid airbase in Qatar.
- A civilian was killed in [Abu Dhabi](#) due to falling missile debris during Emirati interceptions.
- Iran issued radio warnings [closing the Strait of Hormuz](#), through which 20% of the world's crude oil flows.

- Major airlines [canceled all flights](#) over Middle Eastern airspace as it became a combat zone.

Pakistan-Afghanistan Conflict Escalation

- Pakistan launched [airstrikes on Kabul](#), Kandahar, and Paktia province in response to cross-border terror attacks.
- Pakistan's Defense Minister declared the situation an [open war](#).
- The Taliban rulers expressed a [willingness to negotiate](#) even as they denied sheltering militants.

US Government Break with Anthropic AI

- President Trump ordered all federal agencies to [stop using Anthropic](#) technology.
- The move follows Anthropic's refusal to grant the Pentagon [unrestricted military use](#) of its models.
- OpenAI moved to [strike a deal](#) with the Pentagon to fill the resulting capability gap.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

National Security & Security Architecture

- The US-Israeli operation relies almost exclusively on [air power](#), raising skepticism among historians about the viability of forced regime change without ground forces.
- The US military has [shifted the USS Abraham Lincoln](#) from the South China Sea to the Arabian Sea, leaving Taiwan potentially more exposed to Chinese aggression.

- NATO allies are convening to discuss the risks of [missile strikes on Europe](#) and chemical weapons proliferation from a collapsing Iranian regime.

AI, Technology Policy & Digital Sovereignty

- The "America First" tech policy has [labeled Anthropic a supply chain risk](#), a designation normally reserved for foreign adversaries like Huawei.
- Europe is pushing for [digital sovereignty](#) to reduce reliance on US tech giants that share data with agencies like ICE for immigration crackdowns.
- India announced [\\$200 billion in investments](#) for data centers and homegrown AI models to assert its influence in the Global South.

Trade and Economic Security

- The EU Commission decided to [provisionally apply the Mercosur](#) free trade deal, pleasing Germany but outraging France.
- German Chancellor Friedrich Merz visited China, attempting a ["charm offensive"](#) to stabilize the German car industry despite growing "China shock" dependencies.
- China maintains a [monopoly on rare earths](#), which Merz admitted could single-handedly stop the rearmament of Europe if exports are cut.

Biosurveillance and Health Governance

- Zimbabwe [rejected a US health deal](#), calling it "lop-sided" for demanding the transfer of biological data and mineral rights in exchange for aid.

- The US administration's "America First Global Health Strategy" uses [transactional bilateral deals](#) to replace its participation in the WHO.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The day was dominated by executive actions and the bypassing of traditional legislative oversight in multiple jurisdictions. US lawmakers, particularly Democrats, expressed outrage over the [lack of congressional briefing](#) prior to the Iran strikes. Meanwhile, European governance faced internal friction as the Commission bypassed parliamentary approval for a major trade agreement.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **US War Powers Act:** Congressional Democrats are seeking votes to [limit Trump's war powers](#) following the unilateral launch of Operation Epic Fury.
- **EU AI Act / Digital Services Act:** Discussion centered on the inability of current regulations to [curb AI-generated misinformation](#) in ongoing elections, such as those in Hungary.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Bill Clinton Testimony:** Former President Clinton testified for six hours before a [congressional committee](#) investigating the Jeffrey Epstein case, denying any wrongdoing.
- **UN Security Council Emergency Meeting:** France and Bahrain initiated an [urgent meeting](#) where Secretary General Guterres warned of a "grave threat to international peace."

- **Geneva Nuclear Talks:** Indirect negotiations between the US and Iran [ended without agreement](#) just 24 hours before the strikes began.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Neoconservative Pivot of "America First"

Despite campaigning on ending "forever wars," the second Trump administration has embraced a [neoconservative military posture](#). This is evidenced by the move from "targeted decapitation" (as seen recently in Venezuela) to a broad [multi-day campaign](#) aimed at total regime collapse in Iran. Analysts note the administration is betting on a "we break it, you own it" strategy, where the [Iranian people](#) are expected to fill the power vacuum—a strategy critics call wishful thinking given the [unarmed nature](#) of the opposition and the resilience of the IRGC.

Transactional Diplomacy and "Data for Aid"

A new trend in US foreign policy is the [explicit coupling](#) of humanitarian aid with national security and economic concessions. Recipient nations like [Kenya and Nigeria](#) have signed deals that may grant the US access to critical minerals and citizens' biological data. Zimbabwe's rejection of these terms signals a growing [sovereignty-based pushback](#) against what some African leaders characterize as a new form of digital and biological colonialism.

Weaponization of Global Supply Chains

The "China shock" has evolved into a strategic stalemate. German Chancellor Merz's trip to China highlighted the [humiliating trade-offs](#) facing European industry: needing China's

market while fearing its dominance in electric vehicles and rare minerals. The US [blacklisting of Anthropic](#) further illustrates how supply chain security is now being used to enforce ideological and military compliance within domestic industries.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

Expect a significant and volatile [surge in oil prices](#) as the Strait of Hormuz remain contested. The IRGC is likely to transition into a [military dictatorship](#) if the clerical leadership remains incapacitated, leading to a bloody suppression of any street celebrations. Internal "rally around the flag" effects may occur if [civilian targets like schools](#) are confirmed to have been hit by Israeli or US munitions.

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

The regional conflict will likely trigger massive [refugee flows](#) toward Europe and neighboring Arab states. In the US, the business environment for tech will remain [chilled](#) by the Anthropic precedent, potentially driving AI innovation toward more compliant firms or offshore jurisdictions. Pakistan's "open war" with Afghanistan could lead to a protracted [insurgency](#) that destabilizes the nuclear-armed state's internal security.

Long Term (1-5 Years)

The [depletion of US naval assets](#) in the Pacific to manage the Middle East may embolden a Chinese move on Taiwan. Europe will be forced to choose between a [US-led security bloc](#) and its economic ties to an increasingly assertive China. The collapse of the Iranian theocracy, if successful, will require a [decades-long nation-building](#) effort that the

current US administration has explicitly refused to lead, suggesting a long period of "controlled chaos" in the region.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- **Security:** Urgent reinforcement of [missile defense systems](#) in NATO-adjacent regions is required to counter potential long-range Iranian retaliation.
- **Diplomatic:** The UN must establish a [clerical succession framework](#) to prevent the IRGC from seizing total power during the current leadership vacuum.
- **Governance:** European nations should accelerate [digital sovereignty projects](#) to ensure critical infrastructure does not rely on US firms subject to sudden executive blacklisting.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain:** Firms must immediately [diversify rare earth sourcing](#) away from China to mitigate risks of political blackmail during the rearmament phase.
- **Energy:** Investors should hedge against long-term [oil price volatility](#) as the Strait of Hormuz may remain a "choke point" for the duration of the Iranian transition.
- **Compliance:** US tech companies must review [defense contract clauses](#) regarding "unrestricted use" to avoid being designated as supply chain risks.
