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



US AND ISRAEL INITIATE HIGH-STAKES MILITARY INTERVENTION IN IRAN AMIDST LITHUANIAN SOCIAL UNREST AND ENVIRONMENTAL EMERGENCIES

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 28, 2026, marks a pivotal shift in global security as the United States and Israel launched a coordinated, large-scale military campaign against Iran. The operation, characterized by intense bombardment of Tehran and key nuclear facilities, explicitly targets the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) and the highest echelons of the regime. President Donald Trump has framed the intervention as a necessary measure to prevent Iranian nuclear breakout and dismantle its ballistic missile program, while simultaneously calling for the Iranian people to overthrow their government. This escalation has immediately triggered regional retaliation, with Iranian missile strikes hitting US bases and civilian targets in the UAE, Qatar, and Bahrain, raising the specter of a broader regional war that could disrupt global energy supplies and maritime security in the Strait of Hormuz.

Domestically, Lithuania is grappling with a convergence of environmental and social crises. Emergency services are on high alert for significant flooding in the Kaunas and Šilutė regions, driven by rapid snowmelt and ice jams, necessitating large-scale community and military preparation. Simultaneously, a massive industrial fire in Vilnius involving lithium-ion batteries has highlighted the emerging risks of green-tech infrastructure. In the social sector, the education system is under strain as teachers in Alytus continue a high-profile strike against perceived administrative malpractice, a conflict that has now reached the level of the Prime Minister and the Ministry of Education. These domestic challenges are unfolding against a backdrop of geopolitical uncertainty, as evidenced by President Trump's recent expressions of affinity for the Belarusian regime, complicating Lithuania's regional security posture.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **US-Israeli Military Campaign in Iran:** A massive air and missile campaign has targeted Tehran's political and military infrastructure.
 - The US and Israel have vowed to use [all available power](#) over the next 48 hours to neutralize Iranian capabilities.
 - Bombardment has hit the Iranian Parliament, the [Supreme Leader's palace](#), and intelligence centers.
 - President Trump has urged IRGC members to [lay down their arms](#) in exchange for immunity or face "inevitable death."
 - Retaliatory Iranian strikes have caused [civilian casualties in the UAE](#) and targeted US bases in Bahrain and Jordan.
- **Lithuanian Domestic Crisis: The Alytus Teacher Strike:** A localized labor dispute has escalated into a national debate on educator rights and administrative power.
 - Teachers at the Adolfas Ramanauskas-Vanagas Gymnasium are [striking over the dismissal](#) of an ethics teacher, Meilė Platukienė.
 - Prime Minister Ingrida Šimonytė and Education Minister Raminta Popovienė have been [drawn into negotiations](#) to resolve the deadlock.
 - Administrative threats to dismiss striking teachers for [gross misconduct](#) have exacerbated tensions and led to a transition to remote learning.

- **Environmental and Infrastructure Emergencies:** Severe weather and industrial accidents are stretching state capacity.
 - More than 30 municipalities are [preparing for major flooding](#), with the military ready to blast ice jams on the Neris and Nemunas rivers.
 - A 500-square-meter warehouse fire in Vilnius was complicated by [exploding lithium-ion batteries](#) from electric vehicles.
 - The National Crisis Management Center is monitoring [critical water levels](#) in Kaunas, where the risk of sudden flooding is highest.
- **Geopolitical Realignment and Trade:** Significant shifts in international relations and economic blocs.
 - President Trump expressed [respect for Alexander Lukashenko](#), stating he "really likes" the Belarusian leader, contradicting long-standing EU policy.
 - The EU is moving toward [implementing the Mercosur trade agreement](#) even without full parliamentary or court approval to bypass ongoing delays.
 - Vengria and Slovakia are forming a [joint committee](#) to investigate damage to the Druzhba oil pipeline following a drone strike.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Geopolitical Power Dynamics & National Security

- The US executive branch is conducting a [high-risk regime change operation](#) without a formal Congressional declaration of war, leading to domestic legislative friction.

- The US has deployed the [largest naval armada](#) since the 2003 Iraq invasion to the Persian Gulf.
- Lithuanian citizens are being urged to [evacuate Iran immediately](#) and cancel travel to Israel as the conflict intensifies.

Energy Security & Infrastructure

- The [Druzhba pipeline disruption](#) has sparked diplomatic conflict between Ukraine, Slovakia, and Hungary.
- Vilnius is advancing its [green hydrogen plant](#), a €10 million project aimed at diversifying energy sources and decarbonizing the capital.
- Temporary ceasefires around the [Zaporizhzhia Nuclear Power Plant](#) have been reported to allow for critical power line repairs.

Domestic Stability & Labor

- The teacher shortage in Lithuania is becoming acute, particularly for [English, Math, and Lithuanian](#) subjects, as workloads increase and prestige remains low.
- Local municipalities like Jonava are seeing a [construction boom](#), surpassing traditional hotspots like Palanga in residential permits.
- The implementation of [low-emission zones \(LEZ\)](#) in major cities is facing enforcement challenges and public debate over transit fees.

Public Health & Biosurveillance

- The rise in [autism spectrum disorder diagnoses](#) is placing long-term pressure on the healthcare and education systems, with waitlists for ergotherapists reaching one year.

- Cardiovascular disease remains the leading cause of death, with new programs focusing on [preventative diagnostics](#) for citizens over 40.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity today focused on the legality of war powers in the United States and the acceleration of trade agreements in the European Union. In Lithuania, the discourse centered on labor law applications in the education sector and the regulatory framework for urban environmental zones.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Low-Emission Zone (LEZ) Mandate:** Starting in 2025, major Lithuanian cities and resorts [must establish zones](#) restricting older, polluting vehicles to meet EU climate goals.
- **EU-Mercosur Trade Agreement:** The European Commission is moving to apply [provisional implementation](#) of the trade deal, reducing tariffs despite ongoing legal challenges in the European Court of Justice.
- **US War Powers Resolution:** Democratic leaders in the US Senate are calling for a session to [reclaim war powers](#) after the Trump administration bypassed Congress for the Iran strikes.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Jeffrey Epstein Investigation:** Former US President Bill Clinton [testified before a House committee](#) regarding his past ties to the convicted sex offender, denying any knowledge of illegal activity.

- **Trump Press Gaggle (Texas Departure):** President Trump confirmed his [support for Alexander Lukashenko](#) and expressed dissatisfaction with Iranian nuclear negotiations before boarding Air Force One.
- **Alytus Municipal Briefing:** Mayor Nerijus Cesiulis addressed the teacher strike, maintaining that the dismissal of the ethics teacher was a [legal matter](#) for the courts rather than a political negotiation.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Evolution of Hybrid Conflict

The conflict between Pakistan and Afghanistan [resembling open war](#) highlights the failure of the previous "partner" relationship between Islamabad and the Taliban. Pakistan's use of precision airpower against Taliban infrastructure in Kabul and Kandahar represents a shift from border skirmishes to a strategic effort to dismantle a state-sponsored proxy network. This mirrors the US approach to Iran, where kinetic action is being used to force a [regime change](#) through the destruction of economic and military pillars rather than a traditional ground invasion.

The Vulnerability of "Green" Transitions

The Vilnius warehouse fire, fueled by [lithium-ion battery explosions](#), serves as a critical warning for the rapid adoption of electric vehicles and battery storage. Emergency services are currently ill-equipped for the chemical fires and toxic plumes associated with these technologies. This event coincides with Vilnius's push for a [green hydrogen economy](#), suggesting that while the energy transition is accelerating, the safety and

emergency response infrastructure remains a significant step behind.

Diaspora as a Cultural and Political Bridge

Reports from Lithuanian communities in [Paris, Los Angeles, and Norway](#) reveal a growing trend of "revolving door" migration. Individuals like Jurga and Sigita illustrate a pattern where Lithuanians spend decades abroad acquiring skills (hairdressing, yoga, engineering) before returning to [revitalize regional towns](#) like Skuodas and Tauragė. This "reverse brain drain" is becoming a vital component of Lithuania's demographic resilience, even as the country faces a domestic [education crisis](#).

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Global oil prices are expected to spike as the [Strait of Hormuz](#) remains under threat from Iranian naval forces. In Lithuania, the Alytus teacher strike may spark sympathy protests across other municipalities if the government does not appoint a [neutral administrator](#) for the school. Severe flooding is highly likely in the [Šilutė and Kaunas](#) areas as temperatures rise, potentially requiring the declaration of a regional state of emergency.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The US-Iran conflict will likely settle into a war of attrition if [regime change](#) does not occur immediately. Skepticism in Washington about achieving goals [without ground troops](#) will grow, potentially leading to a domestic political crisis for the Trump administration. Lithuania will likely accelerate its hydrogen and renewable energy projects to decouple from any remaining volatile energy links.

Long Term (1-5 Years): The structural relationship between the US and the Baltic states may be tested if the Trump administration continues to [soften its stance](#) on the Belarusian regime. Within Lithuania, the education sector will require a fundamental overhaul of [teacher compensation and workload](#) to prevent a total collapse of the public school system as the current workforce reaches retirement age.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Lithuania must coordinate with EU partners to mitigate the impact of [shifting US policy](#) toward Belarus, ensuring that regional sanctions regimes remain effective.
- The Ministry of Foreign Affairs should prepare for [evacuation contingencies](#) across the entire Persian Gulf region, not just Iran and Israel, as the conflict expands.
- Security services should increase monitoring of [critical infrastructure](#) like pipelines and power plants following the Druzhba drone strike.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- Investors in the logistics and manufacturing sectors should audit [fire safety protocols](#) for lithium-ion and other high-density energy storage to avoid catastrophic losses similar to the Vilnius warehouse fire.
- Real estate developers should look to growing regions like [Jonava](#), which are benefiting from urban spillover and high demand for modern residential units.

- The provisional implementation of the [Mercosur agreement](#) presents immediate opportunities in the agribusiness and automotive sectors, though regulatory volatility remains high due to pending court rulings.
