DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 28, 2026, marks a pivotal moment in global security as the Middle East enters a state of high-intensity conflict following joint military operations by Israel and the United States against Iran. Israel launched what it termed "preemptive strikes" targeting Tehran's military and intelligence infrastructure, prompting immediate Iranian retaliation against U.S. military bases in Bahrain, Qatar, Kuwait, the UAE, and Jordan. This escalation has caused widespread panic in Tehran and Tel Aviv, led to the closure of regional airspaces, and forced the cancellation of numerous international flights, including major routes from Jakarta's Soekarno-Hatta International Airport.

Simultaneously, Indonesia is asserting itself as a significant middle power through President Prabowo Subianto's extensive diplomatic tour of the U.S., UK, Jordan, and the UAE. The tour yielded substantial economic and strategic

gains, including a \$38.4 billion investment deal with the U.S. and a landmark semiconductor partnership with the UK's ARM Limited. Domestically, the government is bracing for the 2026 Lebaran "Mudik" (exodus), with transportation infrastructure facing extreme demand and the Ministry of Public Works rushing to complete road repairs. However, this progress is shadowed by local governance scandals, including public outcry over luxury vehicle procurement in East Kalimantan and protests by athletes in Pasuruan over drastically reduced bonuses.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Regional War in the Middle East

- Israel conducted massive missile strikes on Tehran, targeting the Ministry of Defense, intelligence centers, and areas near the Supreme Leader's residence to disable Iran's nuclear program [preemptive strike](#).
- The United States confirmed direct involvement in "major combat operations" against Iran, leading to Iranian retaliatory strikes on the [U.S. 5th Fleet](#) in Bahrain and Al-Udeid Air Base in Qatar.
- Airspace closures in the Middle East resulted in total flight cancellations for routes involving [Etihad, Qatar Airways, and Garuda Indonesia](#) at Soekarno-Hatta Airport.
- Unconfirmed reports circulated regarding the potential death of high-ranking Iranian officials, including rumors surrounding [Ayatollah Ali Khamenei](#) and IRGC commanders.

President Prabowo's Global Economic Offensive

- Indonesia secured 11 MOUs with U.S. businesses totaling [\\$38.4 billion](#) and a trade agreement providing 0% tariffs for 1,819 sectors, including textiles.
- A strategic partnership with the UK's [ARM Limited](#) was finalized to train 15,000 Indonesian engineers in semiconductor design and AI technology.
- Indonesia was appointed as Vice Commander of the [International Stabilization Force \(ISF\)](#) under the "Board of Peace" framework for Gaza reconstruction.

Domestic Infrastructure and Lebaran Preparation

- PT KAI reported that over [100,000 train tickets](#) (60% of capacity) for the 2026 Lebaran season have already been sold in the Jember region alone.
- The Ministry of Public Works is racing to eliminate [7,000 potholes](#) on the Pantura highway by H-10 of Lebaran.
- Toll roads Japek 2 South and Bocimi Section 3 are slated for [functional opening](#) to handle the anticipated surge in holiday traffic.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Geopolitical Power Dynamics

- The conflict marks a collapse of nuclear negotiations in Geneva, with the U.S. and Israel moving toward [regime decapitation](#) as a perceived necessity for regional security.

- Regional analysts warn of "stroke of humanity" if the UN remains paralyzed by [U.S. vetoes](#) in the Security Council during this aggression.

Technology Policy & Digital Sovereignty

- Indonesia is transitioning from a consumer to a producer in the global supply chain through its [semiconductor deal](#) with ARM Limited, aiming for "technological independence."

Corruption & Governance

- The East Kalimantan Governor faced criticism for an [8.5 billion IDR](#) luxury car purchase, which he defended as necessary to maintain the "dignity" of the province neighboring the new capital (IKN).
- Investigation into the alleged [misuse of eruption relief funds](#) for Mount Ruang involving the Regent of Sitaro Islands.

Domestic Stability & Social Order

- Athletes in Pasuruan staged a viral protest, [trampling award certificates](#) to protest a 66% reduction in gold medal bonuses compared to previous years.
- The murder and mutilation of a spouse in Tanjung Pinang highlighted [domestic violence](#) issues, with the perpetrator being a repeat offender.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Governance activity focused on anti-corruption measures, tax professional regulations, and civil rights protections. Discussions emphasized the need for systemic legal reforms rather than just individual enforcement.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED

- **Limitation of Currency Transactions Act:** Proposed to curb corruption by mandating digital trails for large transactions [discussed with VP Gibran](#).
- **Tax Consultant Law:** The Indonesian Tax Consultants Association (IKPI) is pushing for formal legislation to [strengthen the regulatory framework](#) for tax professionals.
- **Rupiah Redenomination Act:** Advocacy continues for the simplification of the national currency to [improve financial efficiency](#).
- **Presidential Family Candidacy Ban:** A judicial review was filed at the Constitutional Court (MK) seeking to [prohibit family members](#) of a sitting president from running for office.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS

- **Kaltim Procurement Briefing:** Governor Rudi Mas'ud defended the [8.5 billion IDR car](#) procurement as adhering to Ministry of Home Affairs regulations for 3,000cc sedan-type vehicles.
- **LPSK Briefing on Nizam Case:** The Witness and Victim Protection Agency (LPSK) conducted a medical and psychological [threat assessment](#) for the mother of a murdered 12-year-old child who reported receiving threats from the father's family.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

Strategic Non-Alignment vs. Functional Partnership

Indonesia is navigating a complex dual-track foreign policy. While President Prabowo

engages in "Good Neighbor Policy" and "Board of Peace" roles to maintain stability, the nation is simultaneously deepening [military and economic ties](#) with the U.S., evidenced by the \$38 billion in MOUs and the appointment of Indonesia to the International Stabilization Force. This suggests a shift toward a "multi-aligned" strategy where Indonesia leverages its middle-power status to extract high-tech concessions (like the ARM semiconductor deal) while remaining a vocal proponent of Palestinian peace [via Yordania](#).

The Fragility of Global Connectivity

The immediate impact of the Iran-Israel conflict on [civilian aviation](#) highlights the vulnerability of global trade and travel to regional kinetic events. The sudden cancellation of flights at Soekarno-Hatta illustrates that domestic Indonesian interests are now inextricably linked to Middle Eastern security. The reliance on the "Board of Peace" framework suggests that regional powers are desperate for an alternative to traditional Western-led mediation, which is increasingly viewed through a [skeptical, "double standard" lens](#).

Governance Disconnect and Local Unrest

A recurring theme of "governance disconnect" is emerging domestically. While the central government announces multi-billion dollar international deals, local populations are revolting over [bonus cuts for athletes](#) and perceived corruption in disaster relief. The viral footage of athletes in Pasuruan and the controversy over the [Kaltim luxury car](#) reflect a growing public intolerance for fiscal elitism at the local level during a time when the central government is preaching national efficiency.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Expect extreme volatility in global energy markets and continued disruptions in [international flight routes](#) as long as Iranian and U.S. forces remain in a cycle of retaliation.
- Indonesia will likely see increased security at U.S. and Israeli-linked interests domestically following the [retaliatory strikes](#) in the Middle East.
- The Lebaran ticket sell-out will likely lead to a "black market" for transport or increased [emergency transport deployments](#) by the government.

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- The implementation of the U.S.-Indonesia trade deal will face scrutiny as the 90-day [legal process](#) concludes, potentially triggering pushback from domestic agricultural sectors sensitive to U.S. soy and wheat imports.
- The semiconductor training program for 15,000 engineers will begin to shift [FDI interest](#) toward Indonesia's emerging tech ecosystem.

Long Term (1-5 Years)

- If the "Board of Peace" succeeds, Indonesia will cement its role as a [primary mediator](#) in Islamic world conflicts, potentially eclipsing traditional actors.
- Structural changes in the Middle East security architecture may follow if the U.S.-Israeli strikes lead to a [regime collapse](#) or fundamental change in Tehran's leadership.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy

- Monitor Indonesia's role in the [Board of Peace](#) as a leading indicator of a new non-Western diplomatic bloc capable of regional stabilization.
- Prepare for potential Iranian cyber-retaliation against U.S. partners, including [Southeast Asian nations](#) with deep U.S. economic ties.
- Evaluate the impact of the U.S.-Indonesia 0% tariff agreement on [regional textile competition](#), particularly for Vietnam and Bangladesh.

For Private Sector/Investors

- Supply Chain Risk: Diversify logistics routes to avoid the Middle East corridor, as [air freight cancellations](#) are likely to persist.
- Investment Opportunity: The [semiconductor and AI ecosystem](#) in Indonesia is primed for growth following the ARM Limited deal; early-stage tech infrastructure is a high-value target.
- Regulatory Compliance: Investors in East Kalimantan must navigate [increased public scrutiny](#) and potential audits following the luxury procurement scandals and IKN-related spending controversies.
