DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 28, 2026, marks a critical inflection point in global geopolitics following a massive, coordinated decapitation strike by the United States and Israel against the Iranian regime. Operation "Rick Lava" (or "Midnight Hammer") has reportedly resulted in the death of Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei and dozens of senior officials, an event confirmed by President Donald Trump as a maneuver toward [regime change](#). This action, the second such foreign intervention in two months following the capture of Venezuela's Nicholas Maduro, has triggered immediate Iranian [retaliatory missile strikes](#) across Israel and U.S. military assets in the Persian Gulf, disrupting global energy markets and civil aviation.

Domestically, Serbia is facing an intensifying crisis of state legitimacy as multi-front protests enter their third week. Agrarian workers have radicalized their blockades,

shifting to the [Ibarska highway](#) and demanding the resignation of the cabinet, while a student-led movement in Belgrade has occupied public spaces to protest alleged systemic corruption in urban development projects. These movements are bolstered by a deepening scandal in the judiciary, where the State Prosecutor has admitted to [clandestine intelligence interference](#) in judicial elections. The convergence of these events suggests a fraying of social order in the Balkans, occurring simultaneously with a major regional war in the Middle East.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Decapitation of the Iranian Regime

- The U.S. and Israel conducted high-precision airstrikes targeting [ballistic missile systems](#) and leadership bunkers in Tehran.
- President Trump confirmed the [death of Ayatollah Ali Khamenei](#), describing it as the "single greatest chance" for the Iranian people to reclaim their country.
- Ali Larijani has emerged as the [de facto leader](#) of the Iranian state, with Western analysts describing him as a pragmatic ideologue who may seek negotiations.
- Iran launched a "first wave" of drones and missiles [retaliating against Israel](#) and U.S. bases in Qatar, Bahrain, and Kuwait.

Radicalization of Serbian Agrarian Protests

- Farmers entered their 18th day of blockades, moving from Mrčajevci to [Miločaj](#) to implement a total shutdown of the Kraljevo-Čačak highway.

- Protesters have severed dialogue with the Minister of Agriculture, demanding a [direct meeting](#) with Prime Minister Đuro Macut to address the collapse of the dairy sector.
- The protests are increasingly framed as an [existential struggle](#) against import-dependent policies and the "disrespect" of domestic producers.

Belgrade Student Occupation and Urban Unrest

- Students at the University of Belgrade launched a protest at Park Ušće against a [proposed aquarium](#) project, citing environmental degradation and lack of transparency.
- The protest turned [violent briefly](#), resulting in the arrest of a citizen by riot police using "demonstration suppression" equipment.
- The student movement has linked the Ušće project to broader grievances, including the [Rio Tinto "Jadar" project](#) and the demolition of the Belgrade Fair.

Judicial and Intelligence Scandals

- Republic Public Prosecutor Zagorka Dolovac confirmed that the Security Intelligence Agency (BIA) conducted [unauthorized meetings](#) with prosecutors regarding the High Prosecutorial Council elections.
- In Montenegro, authorities [arrested Aco Đukanović](#), brother of the former president, following a raid that uncovered military-grade equipment and weapons.

Regional Crisis in Healthcare and Industry

- Over 50% of doctors in Bosnia's West Herzegovina Canton [resigned simultaneously](#) after the government failed to meet salary demands, signaling a collapse of the public health system.
- Steel production in Zenica faces [imminent shutdown](#) due to steel import delays, threatening the livelihoods of 1,900 workers.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

International Relations & Foreign Policy

- U.S. unilateralism has reached a new peak with the [major combat operations](#) in Iran, conducted without congressional approval and framed as a "preventive attack."
- Regional allies in the Gulf, including Qatar and Jordan, are [intercepting ballistic missiles](#) as the conflict spills over into neighboring sovereign airspace.

Corruption & Governance

- The Serbian state is accused of "urban parasitism," with protesters claiming public parks are being converted into [private investment vehicles](#) under the guise of public interest (Expo 2027).
- State capture is further evidenced by the [intimidation of veterans](#) in Kraljevo, where former paratroopers have been detained on charges of "undermining the constitutional order."

Technology Policy & Cybersecurity

- A surge in [AI-driven surveillance](#) is reportedly being used by authoritarian regimes to track journalists' physical and digital movements, including biometric gait analysis.
- Journalists are being forced to adopt [AI shields](#) and encrypted communication tools like Signal to protect sources from state-sponsored spyware like Pegasus.

Food & Economic Security

- Balkan farmers warn that the region is becoming [import-dependent](#), as dairy production becomes unprofitable due to low purchase prices (0.44 KM per liter) and high production costs.
- Croatia's entry into the EU has [disadvantaged small producers](#), who now compete with subsidized surpluses from older EU member states.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity centered on emergency measures following the Iran strikes and the ongoing preparation for Serbian local elections. U.S. lawmakers are debating the legality of the presidency's use of force under the War Powers Act, while Serbian authorities continue to process candidates for the March 29 local elections amidst allegations of electoral fraud.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **U.S. War Powers Act:** unilateral force used by the executive without legislative authorization.

- **Polish Social Media Ban:** ban social media for children under 15, citing mental health risks and Big Tech's failure to regulate content.
- **Serbian Agricultural Land Law:** unauthorized use of fertile agricultural land for non-agricultural projects as a violation of existing statutes.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **State of the Union Fallout:** risks of the Iran strike during his recent address.
- **Serbian High Prosecutorial Council Meeting:** intelligence agency pressure on the judiciary.
- **Kula Election Commission:** accepted the "Voice of Youth" list following a public protest over "orthographic errors" initially used to disqualify them.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The "Maduro Model" of Regime Change

The strikes on Iran represent a solidification of the Trump administration's foreign policy doctrine: decapitation followed by a call for popular mobilization. This [regime change strategy](#) relies on air power and intelligence rather than "boots on the ground," attempting to trigger an internal collapse of the security apparatus. However, the presence of a "standing million-man army" in Iran suggests that simple decapitation may lead to a [prolonged power vacuum](#) rather than a clean transition to democracy.

Agrarian Populism and the State-Citizen Divide

In Serbia, the 18th day of blockades reflects a total breakdown in the social contract.

Farmers are no longer seeking policy adjustments; they are seeking [sovereign recognition](#) from the Prime Minister. The use of BIA agents to [monitor and legitimize](#) protesters on the road indicates a securitization of economic grievances. The state's inability to address the ["nokaut" \(knockout\)](#) of the dairy sector has transformed a labor dispute into a broader anti-regime movement.

Systemic Negligence as a Catalyst for Unrest

The "One Heart for Sarajevo" protest and the Ušće park protests share a common thread: [systemic negligence](#). Whether it is a tram accident in Sarajevo or the collapse of a canopy in Novi Sad, citizens across the region are linking [infrastructure failure](#) to corruption. The Belgrade student movement explicitly frames urban construction as an [invasion of the park](#) by investors, suggesting that "development" is now viewed by the public as synonymous with "theft."

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks):

Expect a significant spike in [oil prices](#) and a total suspension of air travel in the Middle East. In Serbia, the agricultural blockades will likely move toward [Belgrade](#) as dialogue fails, potentially coinciding with student occupations of major university buildings. Iranian retaliation will likely shift from ballistic missiles to [proxy-led asymmetric attacks](#) on Western interests in Iraq and Yemen.

Medium Term (1-6 Months):

The Iranian power vacuum will test the loyalty of the Revolutionary Guard (IRGC). If the

IRGC [peacefully merges](#) with protesters, a transition is possible; however, hardline elements are likely to ignite a civil war. In the Balkans, local elections on March 29 will serve as a [lakmus paper](#) for the national government's survival, with the agrarian vote becoming a decisive factor in traditional ruling party bastions.

Long Term (1-5 Years):

A successful regime change in Iran would fundamentally rewrite the security architecture of the Middle East, potentially ending the "ring of fire" and neutralizing Hezbollah and Hamas. However, a failed transition would lead to [regional fragmentation](#). For Serbia, the persistent use of intelligence agencies to manage domestic dissent risks a permanent [erosion of judicial independence](#), pushing the country toward a formal "captured state" status that halts EU integration indefinitely.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Establish immediate [back-channels to Larijani](#) to prevent a full-scale regional war while the IRGC structure remains fractured.
- Monitor Serbian judicial independence closely; the [BIA intervention](#) constitutes a breach of democratic norms that may require diplomatic sanctions.
- Prepare for a massive humanitarian crisis in Bosnia as the [healthcare strike](#) leaves thousands without emergency services.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- Aviation and logistics firms should expect [long-term diversions](#) around the Persian Gulf and potentially the Balkans if highway blockades persist.
- Investors in Serbian real estate or "Expo 2027" projects face [reputational and legal risks](#) as public opposition and claims of non-transparency grow.
- Agricultural tech firms should look for ["niša" \(niche\) opportunities](#) in the Balkan dairy sector, focusing on local branding and direct-to-consumer models as large processing chains fail.
