## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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February 28, 2026, marks a historic shift in global security as the United States and Israel launched "Operation Epic Fury," a coordinated [preventive military offensive](#) targeting the core of the Iranian regime. The operation has reportedly achieved its primary strategic objective: Israeli sources claim to have [found the body](#) of Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei following strikes on his residence and high-level command bunkers. While Iranian state media initially denied these reports, the massive scale of the bombardment has decapitated several layers of the regime, including the [Minister of Defense](#) and top commanders of the Revolutionary Guard. This escalation follows months of stalled nuclear negotiations and is characterized by the Trump administration as a "mission of

freedom" to ensure Tehran [never obtains a nuclear weapon](#).

The regional fallout was immediate and devastating. Iran and its proxies responded with a "devastating" counter-strike, launching missiles and drones at Israel and [14 US military bases](#) across the Middle East. Impacts were reported in Bahrain, Qatar, the UAE, Kuwait, and Saudi Arabia, effectively turning the Persian Gulf into an active combat zone. European allies, notably the UK and Germany, have distanced themselves from the action, citing a lack of prior consultation and concerns over the [violation of international law](#). Domestically, Portugal is navigating this crisis during a sensitive transition of power, as President Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa concludes his ten-year term, urging national unity around his successor, [António José Seguro](#), who was elected with a record-breaking mandate.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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### The Decapitation of the Iranian State

- US and Israeli forces struck six major Iranian cities, focusing on Teheran, Isfahan, and Fordo, aiming to [obliterate the nuclear program](#) and the regime leadership.
- Israeli intelligence confirms the death of Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei, while US President Donald Trump claims to [know the next leader](#) who will take over once the regime collapses.
- The bombardment hit the Presidential Palace and the [National Security Council](#) in Teheran, causing massive destruction of government infrastructure.

## Regional Retaliation and Conflict Expansion

- Iran launched a "first wave" of massive missile attacks against [Israeli territory](#) and US naval assets in the region.
- Retaliatory strikes hit the [US 5th Fleet](#) headquarters in Bahrain and targets in the UAE, Qatar, and Jordan.
- Houthi and Hezbollah forces have formally [declared war on Israel](#), initiating attacks on northern Israel and Gulf maritime shipping.

## European-American Diplomatic Fracture

- The UK, Germany, and France have [condemned the unilateralism](#) of the strike, with the UK specifically blocking the use of its Diego Garcia base for the operation.
- EU leadership has called for an emergency session of the [UN Security Council](#) to address the illegality of "preventive" strikes under international law.
- Internal divisions within NATO are surfacing as the US utilizes the [Lajes Base in the Azores](#) under disputed interpretations of the 1995 cooperation agreement.

## Portugal's Presidential Succession

- Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa bid farewell to the Armed Forces, calling for [unity around the newly elected](#) President António José Seguro.
- Seguro's upcoming inauguration on March 9 is framed as a pivot toward a more [presidentialist and reformist](#) style of governance.

## Distraction Narratives and Domestic Crises

- Analysts suggest the timing of the strike serves as a [maneuver of distraction](#) for Donald Trump, who is facing fallout from the released Jeffrey Epstein files and declining domestic polling.
- In Portugal, the government of Luís Montenegro is under fire for a [lack of funding](#) for reconstruction one month after the devastating Storm Christine.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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### International Relations & Foreign Policy

- The collapse of the "preventive strike" legal norm: Analysts argue that the US-Israeli action [violates the UN Charter](#), which only authorizes force in response to an actual attack.
- Fracture of the Transatlantic Alliance: Major European powers were [not informed of the strike](#), leading to a significant crisis in trust and intelligence sharing within the Western bloc.

### Domestic Stability & Social Order

- Labor unrest in Portugal: The CGTP union led [massive protests in Lisbon](#) and Porto against new labor laws, threatening a general strike if the "despotic" package is not withdrawn.
- Aging Crisis in Justice: The Portuguese prison system is facing a crisis as the population [over 60 years old](#) reaches record levels, demanding a shift from incarceration to healthcare-focused reintegration.

### Economic Security & Energy

- Immediate closure of Middle Eastern airspace has [cancelled thousands of flights](#), including major routes to Asia and Europe, impacting global trade and tourism.
- Gasoline prices in Portugal are slated for a [sharp increase](#) on March 1, just as the regional conflict threatens global oil supply stability.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Legislative activity in Portugal is currently dominated by the "Labor Package" and regional adaptation of national housing and agricultural laws. Simultaneously, international focus remains on the contested 1995 Cooperation and Defense Agreement between Portugal and the USA.

- **Marcelo's Farewell Address:** The outgoing President's final speech in Braga, [appealing for national unity](#) in a world that is "more dangerous and unstable."

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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### The "Maga" Paradox: From Isolationism to Total War

Analysts are highlighting a profound shift in the Trump administration's foreign policy. While originally elected on a platform of

[ending "forever wars,"](#) the administration has now initiated one of the largest military interventions in modern history. This is being framed not as an expansion of American empire, but as a ["decapitation for freedom,"](#) utilizing the same "pre-emptive" justifications used by the Bush administration in 2003. ### **Strategic Resource Hubs: The Importance of the Atlantic**

The conflict has renewed focus on the Azores as a "bridge" for American power projection. The presence of [15 KC-46 tankers](#) at Lajes underscores that even with a massive Mediterranean fleet, the US requires Atlantic stepping stones to sustain deep-penetration missions. This is forcing Portugal to confront the [ambiguity of its treaties](#)—balancing its loyalty to the US with its commitments to European and UN legal standards.

## **STRATEGIC FORESIGHT**

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**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** The primary concern is the [Iranian power vacuum.](#) If Khamenei's death is confirmed, the IRGC may

struggle to maintain internal order while facing simultaneous external bombardment and civil unrest. Expect a [surge in oil prices](#) as Gulf shipping remains under threat. In Portugal, the inaugural transition to President Seguro will take place under the shadow of a regional war, likely focusing his initial mandate on [security and state defense.](#)

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** A protracted [regional insurgency](#) is likely. Even if the Iranian central government collapses, its proxies (Hezbollah, Houthis, and Iraqi militias) remain intact and have already begun a war of attrition. The [reconstruction of central Portugal](#) will likely face continued budget delays as government attention is diverted to the global security crisis and military readiness.

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** A fundamental restructuring of the [European security architecture](#) may emerge. Disillusionment with US unilateralism could accelerate the push for an independent European military force, as hinted by the friction between Washington and the "big three" (UK, Germany, France). In Iran, the success of a transition to [democratic rule](#) is highly skeptical; historical parallels suggest a high risk of state failure and chronic instability similar to the post-2003 Iraq scenario.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS**

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### **For International Policy:**

- **Reassess Base Agreements:** Portugal and other hosting nations must clarify [authorization protocols](#) for non-NATO operations to prevent being "dragged" into conflicts that violate their own legal standards.

- **Establish Humanitarian Corridors:** With over [200 deaths reported](#) in the first hours and thousands of refugees likely, immediate international coordination for civilian protection is required.
- **Diplomatic De-escalation:** European mediators should focus on [Oman and Qatar](#) as back-channels to prevent the conflict from expanding into a total regional war involving Saudi and Emirati ground forces.

#### **For Private Sector/Investors:**

- **Energy Volatility:** Prepare for sustained disruptions in the [Strait of Hormuz](#). Energy-dependent sectors should seek non-Gulf alternatives immediately.
- **Cybersecurity Threat:** Iranian state actors are expected to retaliate via [asymmetric cyber-warfare](#) against critical infrastructure in the US, Israel, and allied European nations.
- **Logistics Rerouting:** The [closure of regional airspaces](#) and maritime risks require an immediate audit of global supply chains passing through the MENA region.
