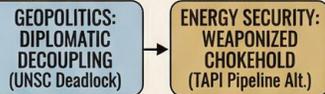
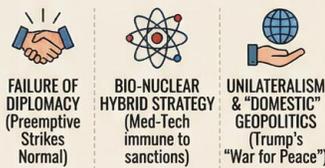

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THE ONSET OF A US-ISRAELI MILITARY CAMPAIGN AGAINST IRAN HAS TRIGGERED A GLOBAL ENERGY CRISIS AND THE CLOSURE OF THE HORMUZ STRAIT, PROVIDING A GEOPOLITICAL VACUUM FOR RUSSIAN TACTICAL ADVANCES AND STRATEGIC TECHNOLOGICAL CONSOLIDATION.

### DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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February 28, 2026, marks a critical inflection point in global security as the United States and Israel launched a massive, coordinated military operation against the Islamic Republic of Iran, dubbed "[Lion's Roar](#)" or "[Epic Fury](#)." The strikes targeted high-value Iranian political and military infrastructure, including the [Presidential Palace](#) and [nuclear facilities](#) in Fordow and Natanz. This escalation followed the apparent collapse of back-channel diplomacy in Geneva, with President Donald Trump asserting that Tehran refused to conclude a [nuclear deal](#). Iran's retaliation was immediate and wide-ranging, striking [fourteen US military bases](#) across the region and effectively [closing the Hormuz Strait](#), a move that has paralyzed a third of

the world's oil transit and sent energy prices toward \$100 per barrel.

Within Russia, the leadership is leveraging the Middle Eastern conflagration to frame the United States and Israel as [unprovoked aggressors](#) while simultaneously intensifying military operations in Ukraine. The Russian Ministry of Foreign Affairs characterized the strikes as a [radiological catastrophe](#) risk and an assault on the sovereign order. Domestically, Moscow is focusing on [internal security](#) ahead of upcoming elections and advancing a "technological sovereignty" agenda, specifically in [nuclear-powered medical devices](#) and bio-engineering. The confluence of these events suggests a Russian strategy of strategic patience—allowing Western resources to be drained in a new Middle Eastern quagmire while consolidating gains in its "near abroad" and securing its own critical infrastructure and economic resilience.

### MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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- **Operation "Epic Fury" and Regional Retaliation:** US and Israeli forces conducted [multiple waves](#) of airstrikes using Tomahawk missiles and fifth-generation fighters against Tehran and nuclear sites. Iran responded with [hypersonic missile](#) strikes on US assets in Bahrain, Qatar, and the UAE, while also launching [missiles into Dubai](#), hitting a hotel on the Palm Jumeirah.
- **Global Energy Chokehold:** The IRGC has [closed the Hormuz Strait](#), halting all tanker movement and prompting the US Department of Transportation to order all vessels to [evacuate the region](#). Experts warn that nations like Saudi Arabia and Qatar lack [alternative routes](#) for their energy exports.

- **Civil Aviation Collapse:** Massive disruptions are reported as [airspace is closed](#) over Iran, Israel, Iraq, Jordan, and the Persian Gulf. Russian airlines, including Aeroflot, have [canceled all flights](#) to the UAE and other regional hubs, leaving an estimated [50,000 Russian tourists](#) stranded.
- **Russian Frontline Gains in Ukraine:** Exploiting the global distraction, Russian forces have reported the [capture of four settlements](#) (Karpovka, Gravskoe, Krasnoznamenka, and Rezdvianka) and have intensified pressure on the [Sumy direction](#).
- **Emergence of Long-Life Nuclear Power:** Russian scientists from Rosatom and FMBA have unveiled [tritium-based "atomic batteries"](#) designed to power medical implants like [cardiac pacemakers](#) for decades without replacement, signaling a breakthrough in autonomous power systems.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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**Geopolitical Power Dynamics** The global security architecture is undergoing a radical stress test as the [US-Israeli tandem](#) pursues a policy of forced regime change in Iran. Russia and China have [jointly requested](#) an emergency UN Security Council meeting, while the [CSTO has called](#) for an immediate return to dialogue. The Russian diplomatic narrative frames this as a betrayal of the [Non-Proliferation Treaty](#), suggesting that Western aggression will force other regional actors to seek [serious means](#) of self-defense.

**Energy Security** The blockade of the Hormuz Strait has turned energy security into a tactical weapon. With [tanker speed at zero](#) in the strait, the global economy faces a supply

shock. Russia is monitoring the situation via [oil price spikes](#) on the Moscow Exchange, which could provide a windfall for Russian exports, provided they can bypass regional conflict zones. Simultaneously, the TAPI pipeline (Turkmenistan-Afghanistan-Pakistan-India) is being [promoted by Turkmenistan](#) as a stabilizing alternative to maritime energy routes.

**National Security & internal Stability** The Russian FSB has held a [high-level collegium](#) where President Putin emphasized the need to protect the [upcoming State Duma elections](#) from foreign interference. Assassination attempts on [GRU officers](#) and terrorist threats like the [Savelyovsky station bombing](#) have heightened the focus on counter-intelligence. In Kyrgyzstan, a major [restructuring of the security services](#) (GKNB) is underway to prevent the politicization of special forces and improve the investment climate.

**Technology Policy & Digital Sovereignty** Russia is aggressively pursuing [bio-economic integration](#), using nuclear industry competencies to develop [universal stem cells](#) and synthetic heart valves. This "bio-economy" is framed as a [new industrial order](#). Conversely, the conflict in Iran has exposed vulnerabilities in Western tech; Russia claims its EW capabilities have [degraded Starlink performance](#) in the region, challenging the "invulnerability" of satellite-based coordination for opposition movements.

**Rule of Law & Corruption** Significant domestic legal warfare (lawfare) is evident in the [arrest of the Kaliningrad Youth Minister](#) for embezzlement of federal subsidies. Furthermore, the [posthumous trial](#) of the alleged killer of "Miss Buryatia" highlights a bizarre application of the Russian legal system where the [dead are adjudicated](#) to

satisfy the demands of survivors for a "full judicial process."

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Russia is introducing a suite of consumer and business protection laws effective March 1, 2026, aimed at standardizing the domestic service economy and tightening oversight on the gig economy. The Federation Council is also moving to reduce administrative burdens on small businesses while closing loopholes in self-employment regulations.

### BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Aviation Passenger Rights Law:** Mandates that [children under 12](#) be seated for free next to parents and formalizes airline obligations for [food and water](#) during delays of over two hours.
- **Hotel Booking Refund Policy:** Requires hotels to [return full prepayments](#) if a booking is canceled at least one day prior to check-in.
- **Russian Language Purity Law:** Requires all commercial [signs and advertisements](#) (e.g., "Sale," "Open") to be in the Russian language starting in March.
- **Self-Employment Reform Bill:** Proposed legislation to [remove from the register](#) self-employed individuals who report no income for 15 months, aimed at preventing "phantom" claims for state support.
- **Experimental Legal Regimes (EPR) Amendment:** Extends the term for [testing AI technologies](#) and drones from three to five years to allow for deeper clinical and operational validation.

## HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Security Council Video Conference:** President Putin convened [permanent members](#) to discuss the strategic implications of the US-Israeli strikes on Iran.
- **Mikhail Mishustin's Government Report:** The Prime Minister reported to the Duma on [social support measures](#), including the indexation of maternity capital and new tax rebates for [low-income families](#).
- **Kyrgyz Parliament (Jogorku Kenesh) Speaker Interview:** Speaker Marlen Mamataliev discussed the [stabilization of the country](#) after recent political unrest and the [GKNB reform](#).
- **Federation Council Fishing Industry Review:** Discussions on [extending investment quotas](#) for shipbuilding due to equipment supply disruptions caused by sanctions.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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**The Failure of Global Diplomatic Theater**  
The most striking theme of the day is the total [decoupling of diplomacy](#) from military action. US and Iranian delegations were reportedly [negotiating in Geneva](#) just 48 hours before the strikes. The Russian MFA has seized on this to argue that the West uses [negotiations as a cover](#) for military preparation—a narrative they previously applied to the Minsk Agreements. This leads to a deep skepticism regarding any future Western diplomatic initiatives, as ["preemptive strikes"](#) are now perceived as the standard US operating procedure.

**Technological Sovereignty as a Bio-Nuclear Hybrid** Russia is moving beyond traditional "import substitution" toward a **bio-nuclear hybrid** strategy. The partnership between [Rosatom and the FMBA](#) suggests that the nuclear industry is being repurposed as the backbone for the medical industry of the future. By using [radioactive isotopes](#) to power long-life batteries for [internal medical devices](#), Russia is creating a niche high-tech sector that is largely immune to traditional Western sanctions on microchips, focusing instead on its strengths in [atomic science](#) and bio-engineering.

**The Law of the Strong and "Domestic" Geopolitics** In the United States, the [address to Congress](#) by Donald Trump and the launch of "[Operation Epic Fury](#)" demonstrate a pivot toward **unabashed unilateralism**. Trump's framing of the conflict—that "[this war will lead to peace](#)"—is a direct appeal to his base's desire for decisive action. Meanwhile, the [resurgence of the Epstein Files](#) in the US Congress serves as a parallel "lawfare" front, used to [discredit the Democratic opposition](#) and legacy political elites (the Clintons) during a period of high military tension.

## **STRATEGIC FORESIGHT**

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**Short Term (1-4 Weeks)** Global oil prices will likely [surpass \\$120 per barrel](#) as the IRGC maintains its blockade of the Hormuz Strait. Civil unrest in Iran is possible, given Trump's [direct appeals](#) to the Iranian public to [seize power](#), but the IRGC's control over [internet infrastructure](#) suggests an imminent, heavy crackdown. Expect a [re-routing of Russian exports](#) through overland Eurasian corridors to avoid the Persian Gulf chaos.

**Medium Term (1-6 Months)** The Middle Eastern conflict will significantly [divert US](#)

[military resources](#) away from Ukraine, potentially allowing Russian forces to [expand their territorial control](#) toward the Dnieper. The Russian domestic economy will adapt to the [March 1 legislative shifts](#), with a likely increase in the cost of [imported consumer goods](#) as logistics chains further deteriorate. Central Asian states like [Kazakhstan and Kyrgyzstan](#) will accelerate their pivot toward [Russia and China](#) as US influence is consumed by the Iran war.

**Long Term (1-5 Years)** Russia may successfully establish itself as a global leader in [nuclear-bio-medical tech](#), providing high-reliability implants to non-Western markets. The [TAPI pipeline](#) and similar projects will likely replace maritime routes as the [primary energy arteries](#) for the Asian market. The US-Israeli action in Iran may lead to a [fragmented Middle East](#), with Tehran's "proxy network" (Hezbollah, Houthis) operating as [decentralized disruptors](#) for years to come.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS**

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### **For International Policy:**

- The total closure of the Hormuz Strait mandates an immediate [overland logistics audit](#) for any state dependent on Persian Gulf energy. [Central Asian corridors](#) (TAPI, Middle Corridor) must be prioritized for regional stability.
- Diplomatic engagement with Russia and China is necessary to prevent the [proliferation of nuclear components](#) to regional non-state actors in the wake of the Iranian state's destabilization.

- Global aviation standards must be updated to handle [mass closure of regional air hubs](#), with a focus on long-term [repatriation protocols](#) for thousands of stranded civilians.

#### **For Private Sector / Investors:**

- **Energy Sector:** Heavy volatility in Brent crude is guaranteed. Investors should look toward [alternative energy providers](#) and infrastructure projects in the [Caspian region](#).
- **Supply Chains:** The Russian [March 1st laws](#) (language, taxes, and self-employment) increase the compliance costs for any remaining international firms in Russia. Localized branding is no longer a choice but [a legal mandate](#).
- **Tech & Healthcare:** The Russian [nuclear-medical breakthrough](#) represents a significant [long-cycle investment opportunity](#) in the "BRICS-plus" healthcare market, especially for devices requiring autonomous, multi-decade power sources.
