JOINT US-ISRAELI FULL-SCALE
MILITARY INTERVENTION IN IRAN
TRIGGERS REGIONAL ESCALATION
AND SHIFTS GLOBAL FOCUS FROM
EASTERN EUROPE

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 28, 2026, marks a definitive shift in global security architecture as the United States and Israel launched a massive, coordinated military campaign against the Islamic Republic of Iran. Operations **Epic Fury** (USA) and **Lion's Roar** (Israel) began in the early morning hours, targeting over 30 strategic sites including Tehran, Isfahan, and nuclear enrichment facilities. The primary objective is stated as [regime change](#), with high-probability reports circulating that Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei and several top IRGC commanders were killed in precision strikes on leadership compounds. This intervention follows the purported failure of diplomatic efforts in Geneva and represents a significant escalation from the limited "tit-for-tat" strikes seen in 2024 and 2025.

The regional fallout was instantaneous. Iran initiated a multi-front [retaliatory wave](#), utilizing ballistic missiles and drones against

Israel and US-allied neighbors. Significant impacts were reported at the US 5th Fleet headquarters in Bahrain and on civilian infrastructure in the UAE, including a drone strike on the Burj Al Arab in Dubai. The [closure of the Strait of Hormuz](#) and the mass cancellation of flights across the Middle East have sent shockwaves through global energy and aviation markets. Analysts warn that the US is now engaged in a "full-scale war," which risks a prolonged "endless war" scenario that President Trump had previously campaigned against avoiding.

In Poland, the government has entered a state of high alert, focusing on the [safety of citizens](#) in the conflict zone and the broader implications for the Eastern Flank. The domestic political landscape is dominated by the **SAFE program**—a multi-billion euro EU defense loan—which has now reached the desk of President Karol Nawrocki. The geopolitical crisis has added urgency to the debate, with the Tusk administration framing the loan as a [necessity for survival](#) against a backdrop of potential US disengagement from Ukraine. Simultaneously, Poland has taken the controversial step of [withdrawing from the Ottawa Convention](#) to allow for rapid defensive mining of its borders, signaling a shift toward total defense readiness.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Operations Epic Fury and Lion's Roar:** A combined US-Israeli offensive targeted 24 Iranian provinces. US forces focused on [military infrastructure and nuclear sites](#) (Fordo, Natanz), while Israeli forces targeted leadership figures. Unconfirmed reports from Israeli intelligence suggest [Ali Khamenei is dead](#), with his residence in Tehran reduced to ruins.

- **Iranian Retaliatory Strikes:** Iran responded by firing missiles at US bases in Bahrain, Qatar, and Kuwait. Civilian targets were not spared; a drone struck a [luxury hotel in Dubai](#), and shrapnel from intercepted missiles caused at least one fatality in Abu Dhabi.
- **Global Aviation and Energy Paralysis:** Airspace over Iran, Iraq, Israel, Jordan, and most Gulf states was closed. Polish carrier [LOT was forced to turn back](#) aircraft mid-flight. Markets are bracing for a massive oil price spike upon Monday's opening due to threats to the Strait of Hormuz.
- **Poland's Strategic Defensive Shift:** In a major move for border security, the Polish government announced its [exit from the Ottawa Convention](#) (ban on anti-personnel mines), citing the need to mine the eastern border within 48 hours under the "Shield East" program.
- **The SAFE Program Standoff:** The Sejm has passed Senate amendments to the SAFE program, enabling [44 billion euros in loans](#) for rapid arms procurement. President Nawrocki now faces intense pressure to sign the bill despite opposition from the PiS party, which labels the loan a "usurious" German-driven trap.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Elite Politics & Leadership Dynamics The US administration appears divided over the intervention. While Secretary of State Marco Rubio and Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth reportedly [pushed for the attack](#), Vice President JD Vance and DNI Tulsi Gabbard were skeptical, favoring domestic focus. In Poland, the internal friction within the **Law and Justice (PiS)** party has reached a breaking point, with Jarosław Kaczyński referring Mateusz Morawiecki to the [party](#)

[ethics committee](#) following a public spat with Patryk Jaki. This indicates a deep fragmentation of the right-wing opposition ahead of local elections.

Energy Security The conflict has placed approximately [30% of global oil production](#) at risk. The threat of Iran mining the Strait of Hormuz is being treated as an existential risk to global trade. In Poland, there are fears that [fuel prices will skyrocket](#), mirroring the economic shock felt after the 2022 Russian invasion of Ukraine.

Security Architecture Poland is moving toward a "total defense" posture. The government is leveraging the Middle East crisis to argue for the [SAFE program](#), which would fund satellite communications, anti-drone shields, and new ammunition factories. The decision to abandon the Ottawa Convention highlights a [prioritization of territory](#) over international humanitarian norms, reflecting a belief that international law is currently "silent" during hybrid warfare.

International Relations & Foreign Policy The US attack was launched without [Congressional approval](#), sparking a domestic constitutional debate in Washington. European reactions have been notably [muted and cautious](#), with EU leaders calling for "restraint" while admitting they have zero influence over the Trump-Netanyahu strategy. There is significant concern that the [US has "abandoned" Ukraine](#) to focus on Iran, with some analysts suggesting a "global gambit" where Russia is allowed a sphere of influence in Ukraine in exchange for neutrality in the Middle East.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The day's legislative activity focused on securing the legal and financial foundations for Poland's massive military expansion amid the breaking regional war.

• **BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:**

- **The SAFE Program Implementation Act:** This bill enables Poland to access roughly [180 billion PLN in EU loans](#) for arms purchases. The Senate added amendments ensuring the loan isn't paid back directly from the Ministry of Defense's operational budget and [mandating anti-corruption oversight](#) by the ABW and CBA.
- **Shield East (Tarcza Wschód) Funding:** Closely linked to the SAFE program, this covers the physical fortification of the border, including the now-legal [minefields](#) following the Ottawa Convention exit.

• **HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:**

- **Ministry of Defense Technical Briefing:** Generals and industry experts held a conference to [depoliticize the SAFE program](#), arguing that the funds are essential for the Polish arms industry (PGZ) and not merely for foreign purchases.
- **Minister of Foreign Affairs Annual Expoze:** Radosław Sikorski delivered a marathon speech in the Sejm, defining Poland's role as a [key pillar of both NATO and the EU](#). He explicitly warned against "national egoism" and "Polexit" narratives, which he claimed weaken the nation during global instability.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The "Maduro Model" Applied to Iran A recurring theme throughout the day's analysis was the US administration's attempt to replicate its previous success in [capturing Nicolas Maduro](#) in Venezuela. President Trump's direct appeal to the Iranian military—offering [full amnesty for those who surrender](#)—suggests a belief that the Iranian state is a "hollowed-out" shell ready to collapse under precision pressure. However, regional experts are skeptical, noting that the **Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC)** is an [economic-military conglomerate](#) with deep roots, far more resilient than the Venezuelan elite. The potential for a "hidden state" to continue functioning even if the top leadership is decapitated is a high risk for US planners.

The Strategic Vacuum in Ukraine The transcripts reveal a grim realization among European policymakers: the US has shifted its [military and financial aid for Ukraine to zero](#). The narrative suggests a transactional "realpolitik" where the Trump administration may be [trading Ukrainian territory](#) for Russian non-interference in the Iran conflict. This has forced Poland to accelerate its own defense independence, leading to the desperate push for the [SAFE program](#) and the abandonment of international treaties (Ottawa Convention) that are seen as luxuries of a peaceful past.

Information Warfare and AI Content The day was marked by heavy digital interference. Reports emerged of [Iranian state media being hacked](#), with prayer apps displaying the message "Help has arrived." Conversely, there were questions regarding the [authenticity of President Trump's address](#), with some noting

his "unusual calmness," leading to speculation about the use of AI-generated content for diplomatic signaling. In Poland, the government warned of [coordinated disinformation campaigns](#) designed to stoke fear about the country's involvement in the Middle East war.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks):

- Expect intense **market volatility** as oil traders price in the possibility of a total blockade of the [Strait of Hormuz](#).
- The humanitarian crisis in Iran will worsen following [civilian casualties](#) (e.g., the Minab girl's school strike), potentially galvanizing "rally around the flag" sentiment rather than the popular uprising Trump called for.
- In Poland, the **Presidential decision on SAFE** will be the defining domestic moment; a veto would cause a [national security crisis](#) and possibly lead to a government reorganization.

Medium Term (1-6 Months):

- The US enters a **pre-election "endless war"** trap. If the Iranian regime doesn't collapse within weeks, the Trump administration will face immense pressure to either commit ground troops or declare a [premature victory](#).
- Poland will begin the **rapid fortification** of the eastern border, including the deployment of "Blue" mining systems, effectively creating a "hard" iron curtain between NATO and the Russian-Belarusian bloc.

Long Term (1-5 Years):

- A permanent **restructuring of the Middle East**. If the US succeeds, Iran may transition to a military-technocratic state aligned with US interests. If it fails, the region faces decades of [asymmetric warfare](#) and state failure.
- Poland's move away from the [Ottawa Convention](#) could trigger a "treaty domino effect" among other frontline states (Baltics, Finland), signaling the end of the post-Cold War humanitarian disarmament era.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- **Security:** NATO must immediately coordinate on the **Eastern Flank** to prevent a Russian opportunistic strike while US assets are tied down in the Persian Gulf.
- **Diplomatic:** Establish a **successor council** for Iran immediately to prevent a power vacuum that could lead to a Syrian-style civil war.
- **Humanitarian:** Prepare for **massive migration flows** out of Iran and the wider Middle East toward Europe, which could be used by Russia as a [hybrid warfare tool](#).

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Energy Strategy:** Firms must diversify away from Persian Gulf oil immediately; **Brent crude** is expected to surpass \$100/barrel if the Strait of Hormuz closure is verified.

- **Supply Chain:** The [paralysis of Gulf aviation hubs](#) (Dubai, Doha, Abu Dhabi) will disrupt global tech and medical supply chains for weeks.
- **Cybersecurity:** Organizations should prepare for **state-sponsored Iranian cyber-retaliation** against financial and critical infrastructure targets in the US and allied nations, including Poland.
