



- FOR INTERNATIONAL POLICY:**
- De-escalate Hormuz blockade or prepare for "tanker war".

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THE MIDDLE EAST ENTERS A STATE OF TOTAL REGIONAL WAR FOLLOWING MASSIVE US-ISRAELI STRIKES ON IRAN, WHILE RUSSIAN FORCES EXPLOIT TACTICAL BREAKTHROUGHS ON THE POKROVSK-DOBROPILLYA AXIS.

## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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February 28, 2026, marks a catastrophic escalation in global instability as the Middle East descends into a multi-front regional conflict. Following months of tension, the United States and Israel launched a massive coordinated strike against Iranian military, political, and nuclear infrastructure, ostensibly to trigger regime change. This "Epic" operation resulted in high civilian casualties, including a [school strike in Minab](#) claiming over 150 lives. Iran's retaliation was immediate and expansive, targeting US bases across the Persian Gulf, including the [Fifth Fleet headquarters in Bahrain](#), and deploying drones against high-profile tourist targets in Dubai. The closure of the Strait of Hormuz by Tehran threatens 20% of global oil supplies, signaling an imminent global energy crisis.

Simultaneously, the Russian Federation has intensified its offensive operations in Eastern Ukraine, capitalizing on the global distraction. Reports indicate significant breakthroughs toward the [strategic hub of Dobropillya](#), with Russian šturmoviki (assault troops) bypassing Ukrainian defenses in the Donbas. The Russian military-industrial complex is showcasing a rapid transition toward robotic warfare, deploying [automated turrets and remote-controlled platforms](#) like the "Dub" and "Varan" to minimize human exposure on the frontline. This technical evolution is paired with a heavy state-media emphasis on historical parallels, specifically the WWII battles of Velikiye Luki and Shumshu, to cultivate a narrative of inevitable victory and national resilience.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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- **Outbreak of Regional War in the Middle East**
  - The US and Israel launched "Operation Epic," targeting Iranian leadership and nuclear sites; [Aii Khamenei's residence](#) was reportedly destroyed.
  - Iran retaliated with ballistic missiles and drones against US bases in Iraq, UAE, Qatar, Bahrain, Kuwait, Jordan, and Saudi Arabia.
  - An Iranian drone strike hit the [Palm Jumeirah in Dubai](#), wounding tourists and causing the closure of major international airports.
  - Iran has officially [blocked the Strait of Hormuz](#), halting all oil tanker traffic through the critical waterway.

## • Russian Offensive Breakthroughs in Ukraine

- Group "Center" forces have reportedly seized half of Grishino and are advancing on [Pokrovsk and Dobropillya](#), threatening to collapse the Ukrainian western Donbas defense line.
- Russian forces have reached [the Donetsk-Zaporizhzhia highway](#), aiming to sever a critical Ukrainian logistics artery.
- Strategic use of FPV drones on the [Krasnoarmeysk direction](#) continues to disrupt Ukrainian command posts and equipment movements.

## • Technological Shift to Robotic Warfare

- Fielding of the ["Dub" robotic turret](#), which allows machine gunners to operate from cellars or bunkers via remote control.
- Deployment of the ["Varan" UGV platform](#) for evacuation and cargo transport, capable of pulling heavy loads in extreme terrain.
- Innovation in [remote-controlled ATGMs](#) to prevent retaliatory strikes on operators during the firing cycle.

## • Global Financial and Internal Incidents

- A cargo plane carrying [Central Bank currency crashed in Bolivia](#), leading to mass looting and police burning currency to prevent circulation.
- A [gas explosion in a Moscow high-rise](#) on the 15th floor caused significant structural damage and mass evacuations.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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### Energy Security and Maritime Chokepoints

- The blockade of the [Strait of Hormuz](#) represents a maximum-severity threat to global energy stability, with the potential to trigger a 2026 oil shock.
- Russian media is emphasizing the [vulnerability of maritime routes](#) to drone and missile attacks, framing Western intervention as the catalyst for economic ruin.

### International Relations & Bloc Politics

- Russia has positioned itself as a mediator-critic, with Foreign Minister Lavrov [condemning US-Israeli "aggression"](#) as an "unprovoked" attempt to dismantle the Iranian state.
- The failure of the nuclear negotiations in Oman, despite [Iranian concessions on uranium enrichment](#), suggests a pivot by the Trump administration toward a military solution for regime change.
- Yemeni Houthis and Iraqi militias have officially [entered the war](#) on the side of Tehran, expanding the conflict into a "Greater Middle East" war.

### National Security & Tactical Innovation

- The integration of [electronic warfare \(EW\) specialists](#) into standard frontline units is becoming normalized, with "video interception" teams hijacking Ukrainian FPV drone feeds.
- Military journalists like [Vitaly Akinshin](#) are increasingly being integrated as contracted "volunteer corps" members, indicating a fusion of information warfare and combat roles.

## Domestic Stability & Social Order

- The Russian government is leveraging "patriotic culture" and nostalgia for Soviet self-sufficiency, such as [domestic canning traditions](#), to prepare the populace for prolonged economic isolation.
- High-visibility [frontline entertainment brigades](#) are being utilized to maintain morale among troops facing high-intensity urban combat.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Legislative and policy actions are largely focused on wartime mobilization, emergency management of foreign citizens in conflict zones, and the formalization of volunteer military structures.

- **BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:**
  - **Volunteer Corps Integration Policy:** New protocols for journalists and specialists [signing direct contracts](#) with the Ministry of Defense's Volunteer Corps to gain legal combatant status.
  - **Emergency Tourism Protection Measures:** Russian authorities and travel associations are [adjusting flight routes](#) and providing hotel extensions for over 50,000 citizens stranded in the Gulf region.

- **HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:**

- **Ministry of Foreign Affairs Briefing:** Sergey Lavrov conducted [emergency telephone calls](#) with Iranian counterpart Abbas Araghchi, pledging diplomatic support and calling for an urgent UN Security Council meeting.
- **Rosatom Security Update:** Alexey Likhachev reported to President Putin on the [safety of Russian specialists](#) at the Bushehr NPP, emphasizing that nuclear facilities must never be military targets.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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### The Weaponization of History

The transition from engineering "woodworking machines" to "robotic turrets" illustrates a total

mobilization of the civilian tech sector for military ends. The psychological advantage—operators drinking coffee in cellars while [robotic guns strike targets](#) kilometers away—is being heavily promoted to counter Western technological prestige.

## Western "Unpredictability" and the New Global Order

Russian analysis of the Middle East crisis focuses on the perceived "betrayal" of the negotiation process by the US. By launching strikes during [ongoing talks in Oman](#), Washington is being painted as an unreliable actor that prefers "Yugoslavia-style" regime change over diplomatic stability. This narrative serves to solidify the "Global South" alignment against US hegemony, with Russia positioning itself as the [advocate for international law](#) and sovereignty.

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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### • Short Term (1-4 Weeks):

- Expect a massive spike in Brent crude prices as the [Strait of Hormuz blockade](#) takes effect, potentially exceeding \$120-\$150/barrel.
- Iranian-backed proxies (Hezbollah, Houthis) will likely expand kinetic operations against US assets in the Red Sea and Mediterranean to further stretch Western military resources.
- In Ukraine, Russian forces will likely prioritize the [capture of Pokrovsk](#) before the spring thaw, using the Middle East distraction to intensify aerial bombardments.

### • Medium Term (1-6 Months):

- Potential for "grey zone" escalations in the Persian Gulf, with Iranian drones and "ghost fleets" disrupting all non-aligned maritime traffic.
- A likely expansion of Russian military-technical aid to Iran, possibly including [advanced air defense or EW systems](#), in exchange for continued drone technology and regional pressure on the US.
- Increased domestic pressure in the US and Europe as energy-driven inflation impacts political stability during election cycles.

### • Long Term (1-5 Years):

- A permanent shift in global security architecture where "robotized" units become the primary infantry force, fundamentally altering military recruitment and training globally.
- The entrenchment of a bifurcated global trade system, with a Russian-Iranian-Chinese axis controlling critical Eurasian energy corridors and maritime chokepoints.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- **Maritime Security:** Urgent diplomatic efforts are required to de-escalate the [Hormuz blockade](#); failing this, Western nations must prepare for a long-term "tanker war" requiring massive naval escort deployments.

- **Nuclear Proliferation:** The abandonment of the Oman talks suggests the end of the JCPOA framework; a new "post-strike" non-proliferation strategy is needed for a potentially nuclear-capable Iran.
- **Ukraine Focus:** Policy makers must ensure that Middle East escalations do not lead to a [collapse of Ukrainian logistical hubs](#) like Pokrovsk due to diverted attention or resources.

#### **For Private Sector/Investors:**

- **Energy Exposure:** Investors should hedge against long-term energy volatility and explore alternatives as [Gulf-dependent supply chains](#) face unprecedented physical risk.
- **Defense Technology:** The shift toward [low-cost robotic platforms](#) (UGVs and automated turrets) represents a high-growth sector for dual-use technology firms capable of rapid prototyping.
- **Regional Safety:** The [strikes in Dubai](#) indicate that traditional "safe havens" in the UAE are no longer immune to regional spillover; corporate contingency planning for Gulf-based staff is mandatory.
