PAKISTAN = "MERCENARY STATE" ("Fourth Empire")

AFGHANISTAN-PAKISTAN BORDER WAR ESCALATES AMID REGIONAL CHAOS FOLLOWING ASSASSINATED IRANIAN LEADERSHIP

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 1, 2026, marks a catastrophic escalation in regional instability as the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan (IEA) transitioned from border skirmishes to a declared military campaign against Pakistan, titled "[Operation Rad-ul-Zulm](#)" (Repelling Oppression). Following Pakistani airstrikes that reportedly killed [dozens of Afghan civilians](#) in Khost, Paktika, and Nangarhar, the IEA launched retaliatory drone and ground strikes targeting Pakistani military installations in Miranshah, Spinvam, and even reportedly near Islamabad. The IEA rhetoric has shifted from diplomatic grievance to a narrative of "Holy Jihad" against a "mercenary regime," with state media projecting an image of total national mobilization and predicting the imminent [collapse of the Pakistani state](#).

The internal conflict is mirrored by a massive geopolitical shockwave following reports of the assassination of Iranian Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei and several top military

commanders in a joint [U.S.-Israeli strike](#). This has triggered immediate Iranian retaliation against 27 U.S. bases in the Middle East, placing Afghanistan in a precarious position between a hot war on its eastern border and a collapsing security architecture to its west. The IEA is attempting to maintain domestic order by [shuttering dissenting media outlets](#) and engaging in frantic diplomatic outreach to China, Uzbekistan, and Syria to frame its actions as "legitimate defense" while bracing for a broader regional conflagration.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Execution of Operation Rad-ul-Zulm

- The Ministry of Defense announced large-scale retaliatory operations using [unmanned aerial vehicles \(drones\)](#) and "laser forces" to target Pakistani military centers across the Durand Line. [32 Pakistani personnel](#) were reportedly killed in a single night of strikes.
- IEA forces claim to have [overrun 27 Pakistani military posts](#) and inflicted over 170 casualties (killed and wounded) in the border regions of Khost and Paktia.
- Ground reports indicate the IEA successfully [downed a Pakistani drone](#) in Khost province during the height of the engagements.

Civilian Casualties and Humanitarian Crisis

- Pakistani airstrikes targeted residential areas and [refugee camps in Torkham and Spin Boldak](#), resulting in 52 confirmed deaths and 66 injuries, primarily among women and children.

- The Ministry of Refugees and Repatriation condemned the "blind bombardment" of [returning migrants](#) who were already being forcibly expelled from Pakistan.
- A mosque was reportedly [50% destroyed](#) in Nangarhar by Pakistani artillery, further fueling the religious-nationalist fervor within Afghanistan.

Assassination of Iranian Supreme Leader

- State media confirmed reports that Ali Khamenei was [killed in his office](#) alongside his inner circle, including the head of the IRGC and the Defense Minister.
- The IEA expressed "deep regret" over the strike and called for [diplomatic solutions](#) to prevent a total Middle Eastern war, while Iran declared 40 days of mourning.

Suppression of Internal Dissent

- The IEA ordered the [suspension of Rah-e-Farda TV](#), a station associated with political figure Mohammad Mohaqiq, citing his support for Pakistani actions and criticism of IEA retaliation.
- State officials accused Mohaqiq of [threatening national unity](#) at the behest of foreign provocateurs during a time of national crisis.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

National Security and Security Architecture

- The IEA is pivoting from an insurgent-origin force to a conventional military posture, emphasizing the use of [advanced equipment and drones](#) to strike deep into neighboring territory.

- Training centers in Northern Afghanistan graduated [655 new soldiers](#) this week, specifically trained for "professional military duties" and border defense.
- Military leaders have been instructed to give a ["tooth-breaking" response](#) to any further violations of Afghan airspace or sovereignty.

International Relations and Foreign Policy

- Ambassador Bilal Karimi met with Chinese officials in Beijing to [denounce Pakistani aggression](#) as a violation of territorial integrity, seeking regional backing for the IEA's defensive stance.
- Foreign Minister Amir Khan Muttiqi held emergency calls with [Uzbekistan's Foreign Minister](#) and Syria's leadership to manage the fallout of the regional crisis.
- The IEA is leveraging [international organizations](#) (UN, EU, ICRC) by calling for them to break their silence on Pakistani "war crimes" against civilians.

Domestic Stability and Social Order

- State-organized [mass protests](#) were reported in Balkh, Jawzjan, and Bamyan, where citizens expressed readiness to take up arms alongside the IEA forces.
- The IEA is using the conflict to consolidate [cross-ethnic support](#), with residents in Panjshir and Bamyan (traditionally opposition-leaning areas) reportedly backing the "Islamic system" against foreign aggression.

Economic Security

- The Ministry of Economy claims that the Iran-Israel-US conflict will [not severely damage](#) Afghanistan's economy due to the diversification of trade routes through Central Asia.
- Despite the war, the IEA continues to promote [domestic investment](#), claiming the current security environment (minus the border conflict) is superior to that of regional hubs like Dubai or Turkey.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The IEA governance during this crisis has been characterized by executive decrees and military directives rather than formal legislative sessions, focusing on war-footing policies and the suppression of "traitorous" narratives.

- **Operation Rad-ul-Zulm Directive:** A formal military mandate authorizing [unlimited retaliatory strikes](#) against Pakistani military assets in response to civilian deaths.
- **Media Censorship Decree:** Policy enacted to [shutter broadcast licenses](#) for any outlet deemed to be justifying foreign aggression or undermining military morale.
- **Infrastructure Prioritization:** Despite the war, the Ministry of Rural Development continues to inaugurate [water supply projects](#) to maintain domestic legitimacy.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Narrative of the "Fourth Empire"

A recurring theme in the day's broadcasts is the comparison of Pakistan to the British,

Soviet, and American empires. Analysts on RTA News are explicitly framing Pakistan as a ["mercenary state"](#) doing the bidding of the U.S. (specifically mentioning Donald Trump). There is a concerted effort to portray Pakistan not just as a neighbor in conflict, but as a [collapsing entity](#) that will eventually be "partitioned" like previous invaders. This suggests the IEA is no longer seeking a return to the status quo but is prepared for a long-term destabilization of its eastern neighbor.

Military Modernization and "Laser Forces"

The frequent mention of ["laser units"](#) and "unmanned aerial vehicles" marks a shift in IEA propaganda. While previously emphasizing guerrilla tactics, the state is now highlighting its technical capability to conduct [targeted assassinations](#) of Pakistani officers and precision strikes on infrastructure. This modernization is presented as a "divine" achievement of the 20-year struggle, intended to project a sense of parity with conventional regional militaries.

The "Zionist-American-Pakistani" Nexus

In the wake of the strikes in Iran, IEA-affiliated pundits are increasingly linking Pakistan's actions to a [broader conspiracy](#) involving the U.S. and Israel. By framing the border conflict as part of a global "war against Islam," the IEA is attempting to insulate itself from international criticism and position itself as a [defender of the Ummah](#). This narrative is particularly useful in mobilizing support from religious scholars across the region, including within Pakistan itself.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

Expect continued high-intensity skirmishes along the Durand Line. The IEA is likely to increase [drone incursions](#) into Pakistan's Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Balochistan provinces. Domestically, further arrests of political figures who fail to show sufficient "nationalist" fervor are probable. The humanitarian situation at [border crossings](#) will deteriorate as trade is choked off and refugees are caught in the crossfire.

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

The conflict risks evolving into a proxy war. If the Pakistani state continues to face [internal political fragmentation](#) as predicted, the IEA may embolden groups like the TTP or BLA to create a permanent "buffer zone" inside Pakistan. Diplomatically, Afghanistan will lean heavily on [China and Russia](#) to mediate, using the threat of regional chaos to force concessions on recognition and sanctions relief.

Long Term (1-5 Years)

The assassination of Khamenei and the war with Pakistan could fundamentally redraw the map of South/Central Asia. Afghanistan is positioning itself to be the [dominant ideologically-driven power](#) in the region, seeking to fill the vacuum left by a weakened Iran and a destabilized Pakistan. This could lead to a permanent shift in trade towards the "Northern Route" (Uzbekistan/China), bypassing the [traditional reliance](#) on Karachi.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The international community must urgently address the [violations of international war laws](#) regarding the targeting of civilian returnee camps by Pakistani forces.
- Diplomatic efforts should focus on de-escalation via "Third Parties" such as [Qatar or Uzbekistan](#), as direct Kabul-Islamabad relations are currently non-existent.
- The assassination of Iranian leadership necessitates a total re-evaluation of [regional containment strategies](#), as the IEA may now see an opening to expand its influence westward.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- Supply chains utilizing the Torkham or Spin Boldak crossings are [critically compromised](#); immediate transition to Central Asian rail corridors is advised.
- The IEA's aggressive [media suppression](#) indicates an increasingly volatile regulatory environment for foreign entities or telecommunications providers.
- Despite the conflict, the IEA is prioritizing [extractive industries and infrastructure](#) to fund its war effort; however, the risk of Pakistani sabotage or airstrikes on these assets is at an all-time high.
