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THE TARGETED ASSASSINATION OF ALI KHAMENEI IN A JOINT US-ISRAELI STRIKE HAS IGNITED A MULTI-STATE REGIONAL WAR, DESTABILIZING GLOBAL ENERGY CORRIDORS AND CHALLENGING THE LIMITS OF PORTUGUESE SOVEREIGNTY.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 1, 2026, marks a seismic shift in global geopolitics following the confirmed death of Iranian Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei during a coordinated US-Israeli military operation titled "Epic Fury." US President Donald Trump announced the success of the strike, characterizing Khamenei as one of history's [cruellest individuals](#), while concurrently pledging a continuous bombing campaign against Iran for as long as necessary. This decapitation of the Iranian leadership has triggered immediate and massive retaliation, with Iran launching missile and drone swarms against eight regional nations, including Israel, the UAE, Qatar, Kuwait, and Saudi Arabia. The conflict has transitioned from a localized shadow war into a full-scale regional

conflagration with global economic consequences.

Domestically, Portugal is grappling with the strategic implications of its "tacit authorization" for US forces to utilize the Lages Base in the Azores for non-NATO operations. Increased military traffic in the Atlantic suggests the base is serving as a critical [logistical node](#) for the ongoing offensive, prompting sharp criticism regarding national oversight. While the government focuses on tourism promotion at the BTL fair in Lisbon, the underlying reality is one of severe domestic strain, evidenced by the definitive closure of essential healthcare facilities like the [Barreiro maternity ward](#) and a growing debate over the transparency of political party funding. The convergence of an unprecedented Middle Eastern war and a deteriorating domestic social contract creates a high-risk environment for the Portuguese state.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Assassination of Ali Khamenei and Iranian Decapitation**
 - US and Israeli intelligence successfully located and killed the Supreme Leader in a targeted strike on his [office in Tehran](#).
 - The strike also eliminated 30 senior military and intelligence officials, including the Chief of the Armed Forces and the [Minister of Defense](#).
 - Iran's Assembly of Experts has convened to initiate a succession process amidst ongoing [military strikes](#).

- **Regional War and Iranian Retaliation**

- Iran launched 137 missiles and 209 drones against the UAE, hitting a [luxury hotel in Dubai](#) and causing fatalities in Abu Dhabi.
- The Strait of Hormuz has been [officially closed](#) by Iranian authorities, threatening 20% of the world's oil supply.
- Retaliatory strikes hit residential areas in [Tel Aviv](#), resulting in dozens of casualties and significant infrastructure damage.

- **Global Unrest and Diplomatic Polarisation**

- Protesters in Karachi, Pakistan, attempted to storm the US consulate, resulting in [nine deaths](#) during police clashes.
- The UN Security Council met in an emergency session where Russia condemned the strike as [unfounded and illegal](#).
- Exiled Iranians in Paris and Los Angeles have taken to the streets to [celebrate the regime's](#) potential collapse.

- **Strategic Use of Lages Base (Azores)**

- At least 15 US KC-46 tankers have been [stationed at Lages](#) for over ten days, supporting mid-air refueling for the offensive.
- Critics argue the Portuguese government has ceded sovereignty by granting [tacit authorization](#) for non-NATO US military actions.

- **Domestic Healthcare and Labor Crisis**

- The definitive closure of the Barreiro maternity ward has sparked [violent protests](#) and legal challenges by medical unions.
- Labor unions in Madeira and mainland Portugal have mobilized against "labor package" changes perceived as [threatening worker rights](#).

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security and Economic Resilience

- The closure of the Strait of Hormuz has sent oil prices toward [\\$100 per barrel](#), with analysts predicting a massive inflationary spike in Europe.
- Financial markets anticipate a [10% rise](#) in petroleum prices immediately upon Monday's opening.
- France and the UK have deployed naval assets to protect [commercial interests](#) in the Mediterranean and the Gulf.

Succession and Stability (Iran)

- The 88-member Assembly of Experts is tasked with choosing a new Supreme Leader; candidates include [Ali Larijani](#), a hardline former diplomat.
- The Iranian President has declared the assassination a [declaration of war](#) against the Muslim world.
- Internal stability is fractured, with reports of both [clandestine celebrations](#) and state-enforced mourning.

Corruption and Political Finance (Portugal)

- An analysis of party funding reveals the state pays [3.50 Euros](#) per vote received, totaling millions in annual subventions.
- Critics highlight that parties "legislate in their own interest," including the 2018 law allowing [retroactive amnesties](#) for financial irregularities.
- The PCP remains the only party where self-funding through [donations and events](#) exceeds state subsidies.

Digital Sovereignty and "Brainrot" Content

- Public concern is rising over "brainrot" digital content—low-quality, repetitive videos that [impair cognitive development](#) in children.
- Subversive elements are reportedly using these formats to insert [violent political propaganda](#) regarding the Gaza conflict into child-friendly filters.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Governance activity has been split between emergency international crisis management and contentious domestic reforms regarding

the state's role in healthcare and financial oversight.

• **BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:**

- **Reform of the State Commission Proposal:** Proposed by Chega leader André Ventura, recommending [Pedro Passos Coelho](#) to lead a parliamentary commission on structural reforms.
- **Regional Urgency Decree Law:** A contested law centralizing [obstetrics services](#) in Almada, effectively closing regional wards in Barreiro.
- **Labor Legislation Revisions:** Proposed changes to the "labor package" that unions claim will [aggravate worker conditions](#).

• **HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:**

- **UN Security Council Emergency Meeting:** France requested an immediate session where António Guterres condemned the [military escalation](#) and Iranian reprisals.
- **EU Foreign Ministers Meeting:** Called by Kaja Kallas to unify the European response to the [Middle East crisis](#).
- **BTL Tourism Summit:** Regional leaders used the Lisbon tourism fair to demand better [social mobility subsidies](#) and criticize central government neglect.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Collapse of International Norms

The assassination of a sovereign head of state (Khamenei) by the US and Israel represents a definitive break from 20th-century diplomatic conventions. Analysts note that the US appears to be pursuing a "maximum pressure" campaign that favors [leadership decapitation](#)

over negotiated treaties. This move has fundamentally undermined the credibility of US diplomacy, as the strike occurred while [negotiations were supposedly progressing](#) via Oman. This "diplomacy of deception" sets a precedent where military force is used as a primary tool of statecraft, regardless of ongoing diplomatic tracks.

The Vulnerability of the Lusophone Hub

Portugal's role as an "Atlantic logistical hub" is under scrutiny. The heavy use of the Lages Base for a non-NATO, unilateral conflict puts Portugal in a [melindrosa \(delicate\)](#) diplomatic position. Unlike the UK, which [denied Trump's request](#) to use its bases for this attack based on international law, Portugal has relied on "tacit authorization." This highlights a significant trend of "Atlanticism at any cost," where the Portuguese government avoids formalizing its stance to maintain a facade of neutrality while [facilitating the offensive](#).

Social Disintegration and Healthcare Austerity

While the state projects an image of vitality through the BTL tourism fair, the internal reality is one of deteriorating public services. The [closure of maternity wards](#) is viewed not just as a budget measure, but as a failure of the state's basic obligations to its citizens. This is exacerbated by the perception that the political elite is more concerned with [securing party funding](#) and retroactive legal protections than with the collapse of the National Health Service (SNS).

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

- **Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect a severe spike in global energy prices as the Strait of Hormuz remains blocked. In Portugal, the repatriation of citizens from the Gulf will be a high-priority [logistical challenge](#), with at least 18 immediate requests already pending. Further Iranian retaliation against "soft targets" like [residential hotels](#) in the Gulf is highly probable.
- **Medium Term (1-6 Months):** Iran will likely experience a violent internal power struggle between pragmatists and hardline military elements from the [Revolutionary Guard](#). In the US, the assassination will be a central campaign issue; if the conflict drags on and [US military deaths](#) increase, the current 25% domestic support for the war will likely evaporate, creating a political crisis for the Trump administration.
- **Long Term (1-5 Years):** The Middle East is facing a potential "chaos vacuum" similar to post-invasion Iraq. The destruction of the Iranian state hierarchy without a clear ["Day After" plan](#) risks the rise of new transnational terrorist organizations. Portugal may be forced to re-evaluate the Technical Agreement of 1995 regarding the Lages Base as public pressure mounts to [protect national sovereignty](#).

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Reinforce multilateral monitoring of the Strait of Hormuz to prevent a [global depression](#) triggered by a sustained energy blockade.

- Establish clear protocols for "base usage" to ensure that non-NATO operations do not [unilaterally drag](#) smaller European states into major regional conflicts.
- Support the UN's call for a return to [negotiated settlements](#), as the current decapitation strategy has no defined endpoint.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Diversify energy and manufacturing dependencies away from the Gulf immediately. The current conflict could see a [long-term closure](#) of critical shipping lanes.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** Monitor shifting sanctions regimes. As Iran enters a succession crisis, new entities and individuals will likely be [blacklisted by the US/EU](#).
- **Investment Opportunity:** Increasing investment in Portuguese [alternative construction materials](#) like hemp-based "ecoblocks" offers a sustainable hedge against the volatile global commodities market.
