DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 2, 2026, marks a seismic shift in global geopolitics following the **assassination of Iranian Supreme Leader Ayatollah Khamenei** and former President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad during major combat operations conducted by American and Israeli forces. This decapitation strike has triggered immediate retaliatory missile and drone barrages across the Middle East, specifically targeting U.S. assets in the UAE, Qatar, and Kuwait. Global oil prices have responded with a [violent 10% spike](#), with Brent crude rallying toward the \$100 per barrel mark. This conflict has introduced profound uncertainty into global supply chains, particularly through the Strait of Hormuz, and has forced a realignment of international security priorities as the Trump administration moves toward a "Board of Peace" framework intended to bypass the United Nations.

In Nigeria, the domestic landscape is dominated by the **assent to the Electoral Act 2026**, a contentious piece of legislation that repeals the 2022 framework. While the government promotes the act as a modernization of the democratic process, opposition leaders and civil society organizations warn of "state capture" due to the removal of mandatory real-time electronic transmission of results in favor of manual collation. Simultaneously, the appointment of **Olatsunji Disu as substantive Inspector General of Police** occurs amidst high-profile "lawfare" involving the ICPC's raid on former Governor Nasir El-Rufai's property. The intersection of these events—global energy volatility, a U.S. congressional report alleging Chinese interference in Nigerian minerals, and radical changes to election law—suggests a period of extreme instability for the Nigerian state as it navigates the influence of competing global powers.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Decapitation of Iranian Leadership and Regional Escalation**
 - U.S. and Israeli forces carried out [strikes across Iran](#), killing Supreme Leader Khamenei and top IRGC officials.
 - Retaliatory strikes have hit U.S. bases in Qatar, Bahrain, and the UAE, with [missiles and drones](#) disrupting life in Dubai.
 - The U.S. administration characterizes these as "major combat operations" intended to [eliminate the threat](#) of the Iranian regime.

- **Passage of the Electoral Act 2026**

- President Tinubu signed the [new Electoral Act](#), which introduces mandatory digital party registers but makes manual results primary.
- INEC Chairman Professor Josh Amopitan [promised mock presidential polls](#) to test technology before 2027, despite skepticism regarding "real-time" transmission.
- The opposition ADC has characterized the law as a [fraudulent "state capture"](#) mechanism designed to stifle competition.

- **U.S. Congressional Report on Chinese Interference in Nigeria**

- A U.S. House of Representatives report alleges [China is backing ethnic militias](#) in Nigeria to facilitate illegal mining of critical minerals like lithium.
- The report advocates for **replacing Russian military equipment** with American hardware and suggests the establishment of a U.S. military "watchtower" in Nigeria.

- **Substantive Appointment of IGP Olatsunji Disu**

- The National Police Council confirmed [Olatunji Disu](#) as the substantive Inspector General of Police.
- Disu takes office facing a [trust deficit](#) and a mandate to overhaul internal security, even as the ICPC faces backlash over raids on political figures.

- **Global Financial Realignment: Project Agora vs. BRICS**

- A U.S.-led coalition of seven countries has launched [Project Agora](#), a digitized international trade payment system to counter a potential gold-backed BRICS currency.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security and Economic Volatility

- The Iran conflict has pushed [Brent crude up 7-10%](#), potentially benefiting Nigeria's fiscal revenue but [driving domestic petrol prices](#) toward 1,000 Naira/liter.
- Aviation and manufacturing sectors face "margin compression" due to rising energy costs, with major [flights being disrupted](#) across the Middle East.
- The [Qatar Energy company](#) has paused some LNG production, threatening global gas supplies.

Statecraft and Financial Resilience

- The [implementation of Executive Order 9](#) mandates the direct remittance of all revenues to the Federation Account, a major shift in fiscal management.
- Nigeria is pursuing a [\\$1.3 billion aluminum refinery](#) and a nationwide geoscience mapping exercise to unlock mineral potential with the Africa Finance Corporation.
- The debate over **Stablecoin adoption** and the "cNGN" (Central Bank-backed Naira stablecoin) highlights attempts to [digitize the economy](#) and reduce transaction costs.

Legal Warfare (Lawfare) and Domestic Stability

- The ICPC raid on properties linked to [Nasir El-Rufai](#) allegedly recovered "sophisticated phone tapping equipment," which the family dismisses as "malicious fiction."
- The DSS has [arrested a suspect](#) in connection with the assassination attempt on Peter Obi in Benin City, indicating high levels of political tension.
- Voter apathy remains critical, with [turnout as low as 7-8%](#) in recent FCT council elections, signaling a collapse in public trust.

Food and Water Security

- Northern Ghana and Kenya are seeing [declining rainfall and rising salinity](#) in desert lakes, forcing communities to adopt [solar-powered irrigation](#) and aquaculture.
- In Nigeria, [agritech startups](#) are deploying AI-driven sensors to monitor soil moisture and reduce poultry mortality by up to 0.2%.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The Nigerian legislative landscape is currently defined by a radical overhaul of electoral and fiscal policy, alongside heightened oversight of internal security appointments and judicial independence.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Electoral Act 2026:** Repeals the 2022 Act; [mandates digital party registers](#) 30 days before primaries but prioritizes [manual collation](#) where electronic transmission fails.

- **Special Seats Bill for Women:** A proposed law to [reserve legislative seats](#) for women to correct a 4.5% representation imbalance.
- **Electricity Act 2023 (Ongoing Implementation):** Minister of Power Adebayo Adelabu emphasized [decentralization](#), urging states to take responsibility for power generation.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Citizens Town Hall on Electoral Act 2026:** Stakeholders including [Yarga Africa](#) and INEC debated the transparency of the new law; opposition parties expressed "disappointment" over the [removal of mandatory transmission](#).
- **National Peace Committee Briefing:** Bishop Matthew Kukka and others convened to [reinforce the Peace Accord](#) for 2027, amid concerns that the new law facilitates "state capture."
- **FCT Minister Media Chat:** Nyesom Wike [defended his movements](#) during council elections and dismissed allegations of voter intimidation.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The End of "Real-Time" Transparency

A significant regression in Nigerian electoral governance is evident. Despite technological advancements, the 2026 Electoral Act introduces a "clumsy" secondary role for electronic transmission. Analysts note that while [IREV was designed for transparency](#), the new law effectively [makes manual collation the primary source](#) for results. This trend toward "financial panopticism" poses a risk to Nigeria's digital sovereignty, as it may be forced to choose between Western-led digital ledgers and Eastern-led commodity-backed trade.

Resource Realpolitik and Chinese "Lawfare"

The U.S. is increasingly framing its military intervention in Nigeria through the lens of **counter-Chinese economic warfare**. By alleging that [China funds ethnic militias](#) to secure lithium, the U.S. is positioning itself as a "security guarantor" that requires economic concessions—specifically the [kicking out of Chinese mining firms](#). This suggests that Nigerian internal security is no longer an internal affair but a **proxy battlefield** for critical mineral dominance.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect heightened [security surveillance nationwide](#) following the Iran strikes and domestic protests in Kano. [Petrol prices will likely hike](#) as marketers adjust to the 9% global crude price surge. Continued legal clashes over the [El-Rufai surveillance allegations](#) will likely dominate the domestic news cycle.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The impact of [Executive Order 9](#) will cause friction between the federal government and state-owned enterprises as revenue streams are redirected. The [mock presidential elections](#) by INEC will serve as a critical test for public confidence in the 2026 Act. Inflation is projected to [exceed 15%](#) (rebased) as energy costs permeate the food supply chain.

Long Term (1-5 Years): Nigeria's alliance structure may fundamentally shift toward the U.S. as a [military base/watchtower](#) is established to secure lithium and uranium supplies. The 2027 elections will likely be the most litigated in history, as the "manual primary" clause in the 2026 Act faces constitutional challenges. The success or failure of [Project Agora](#) will determine whether the Naira remains relevant or is absorbed into a Western-led digital "Programmable Code" system.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The U.S. and Israel's decapitation of Iranian leadership necessitates a **revised maritime security protocol** for the Red Sea and Strait of Hormuz, as [20% of global oil](#) is now at immediate risk.
- Diplomats must manage the "strategic ambiguity" of Nigeria's stance, as the [U.S. Congress pressures Nigeria](#) to divest from Chinese and Russian partnerships.
- The transition from the UN to a ["Board of Peace"](#) indicates a breakdown in multilateralism; nations should prepare for **transactional, bilateral diplomacy** as the standard for 2026-2030.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Energy Costs:** Logistics and aviation firms should hedge against [prolonged aviation fuel spikes](#) and possible grounding of regional fleets in the Middle East.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** Mining firms in Nigeria must prepare for [geoscience-linked surveillance](#) and potential sanctions or "de-Chinese" mandates in the lithium sector.
- **Digital Infrastructure:** Investors in fintech should monitor the [adoption of cNGN](#) and Project Agora, as these will likely replace legacy SWIFT systems for cross-border trade.
