### DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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March 2, 2026, marks a historic inflection point in global geopolitics as the "Operation Epic Rage" campaign, led by the United States and Israel, resulted in the [liquidation of Iran's Supreme Leader](#) Ali Khamenei and much of the Iranian military-political leadership. This massive escalation has triggered immediate Iranian retaliation across the Persian Gulf, with missile and drone strikes hitting [major investment hubs](#) including Dubai, Abu Dhabi, and Bahrain. The fire at the Burj Khalifa and the suspension of LNG production in Qatar represent a direct assault on the global energy and financial sectors, forcing a re-evaluation of security in the region and causing a 10-15% spike in oil prices. The conflict has momentarily marginalized the Russo-Ukrainian war in the Western media cycle, despite significant developments on the ground.

In Ukraine, the military has achieved its most significant territorial reclamation since the 2024 Kursk operation, recovering approximately [400 square kilometers](#) in the Zaporizhzhia and Dnipro regions. However, this military success contrasts with a complex diplomatic landscape where the Trump administration has signaled a [July 4th deadline](#) for a peace agreement, raising concerns about "peace at any price" and potential territorial concessions. Meanwhile, Ukraine continues to grapple with energy sabotage—allegedly by Russia but blamed on Kyiv by Hungary—and internal political shifts reflected in a decline in President Zelenskyy's trust ratings to parity, while military figures like Valerii Zaluzhnyi maintain overwhelming public support.

The day's events suggest a collapsing "Axis of Evil" as the regimes in Syria, Venezuela, and now Iran face decapitation or severe degradation. Yet, this vacuum creates immense instability. China has emerged as a critical shadow mediator, reportedly [pressuring Iran to reopen](#) the Strait of Hormuz to protect its own energy interests. The convergence of these crises indicates a shift toward a multi-polar world where transactional bilateralism is replacing traditional collective security frameworks, leaving Ukraine to balance its battlefield initiative against the whims of a new American foreign policy doctrine.

### MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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#### Operation Epic Rage and the Fall of the Iranian Leadership

- US and Israeli forces launched a massive strike on Tehran, [killing Supreme Leader](#) Ali Khamenei and multiple high-ranking officials of the IRGC.

- The operation targeted Iran's nuclear infrastructure and missile production facilities to [eliminate the nuclear threat](#) permanently.
- Iran has declared a "Red Flag of Revenge" and [announced a Jihad](#) against US and Israeli interests globally.

### **Persian Gulf Retaliation and Economic Shockwaves**

- Iranian drones and missiles struck [civilian and economic targets](#) in Dubai (Burj Khalifa fire), Abu Dhabi, Riyadh, and Kuwait.
- Qatar [suspended LNG production](#) following strikes on its gas infrastructure, threatening European energy supplies.
- The Strait of Hormuz was briefly closed by the Iranian fleet but began [reopening under Chinese pressure](#).

### **Ukrainian Counter-Offensive in Zaporizhzhia**

- Ukrainian forces liberated [nine settlements](#) and 400 sq km of territory in a month-long silent operation on the Zaporizhzhia-Dnipro border.
- Russian forces are reportedly "bogged down," with propagandists like [Solovyov admitting failure](#) to achieve rapid breakthroughs.
- Ukraine utilized [Flamingo missiles](#) to strike a critical missile plant in Votkinsk, Udmurtia, deep inside Russian territory.

### **Trump Administration's Ukrainian Peace Deadline**

- President Trump has set a [July 4th deadline](#) for a final peace agreement between Russia and Ukraine.

- The administration's "peace through strength" approach appears increasingly transactional, with [John Bolton warning](#) that Trump may accept an agreement regardless of its content to claim a political win.
- Ukraine is seeking firm [security guarantees](#) from the US and Europe to prevent a future Russian invasion.

### **European Energy and Hybrid Warfare Tensions**

- Hungary's Viktor Orban [deployed troops](#) to protect energy sites, accusing Ukraine of planning sabotage following Russian strikes on the Druzhba pipeline.
- Belgium conducted a major [naval operation to seize](#) the "Itera," a Russian shadow fleet tanker operating under a false flag.
- Russia has intensified hybrid attacks in Poland, using [fake social media profiles](#) to incite anti-Ukrainian sentiment among the Polish public.

## **KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS**

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### **Geopolitical Power Dynamics**

- The US is pivoting toward a ["Monroe Doctrine" style](#) focus on the Western Hemisphere while maintaining surgical interventions in the Middle East.
- The "Axis of Evil" partnership between Russia, Iran, and China is being [tested by the Iran strikes](#), with Russia remaining largely silent and unable to provide military aid to Tehran.

## Energy Security

- The Ukrainian Cabinet of Ministers [authorized critical enterprises](#) to establish their own private anti-drone and air defense units.

## Elite Politics and Public Trust

- Ukrainian public trust in President Zelenskyy has [dropped to 48%](#), while trust in Valerii Zaluzhnyi remains at 73% and Kyrylo Budanov at 62%.
- The Iranian government has formed a [temporary council of leaders](#) following the death of Khamenei, signaling a period of high instability and potential internal power struggle.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Ukrainian legislative activity focused on war-time protections and judicial reform, while European institutions debated the terms of Ukraine's future integration and the legal response to Russian "shadow fleet" activities.

## BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Mandatory Child Evacuation Law:** President Zelenskyy signed a [law authorizing the forced removal](#) of minors from active combat zones, even over parental objections.
- **Museum of the Revolution of Dignity Act:** The Verkhovna Rada [passed a bill](#) to simplify procedures for completing the memorial complex, bypassing previous legal hurdles related to investigative seizures.
- **Private Air Defense Authorization:** A new [government decree](#) allowing private corporations to create and fund their own regional air defense groups.

## HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Polish Sejm Speaker's Kyiv Address:** Włodzimierz Czarzasty addressed the Verkhovna Rada, [declaring absolute solidarity](#) and promising Polish support for Ukraine's EU accession.
- **UN General Assembly Resolution:** A resolution for "lasting peace" [received 107 votes](#), but the US and China notably abstained, signaling a shift in American diplomatic alignment.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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**The Fragmentation of the Russian Shadow Fleet and Sanctions Evasion** The Belgian naval operation against the "Itera" marks a significant transition from passive monitoring to [active interdiction](#) of Russia's shadow fleet. For four years, Moscow has utilized a "floating wallet" strategy—tankers with false flags and forged documents—to bypass the G7 price cap. This escalation by

Belgium, supported by France, suggests that EU member states are increasingly willing to [ignore Russian threats](#) of retaliation in favor of cutting off the Kremlin's primary source of hard currency. However, the internal EU resistance from Greece and Malta remains a hurdle for a comprehensive block-wide policy.

**Transactional Peace vs. Existential Security** The Trump administration's focus on a ["deal for the sake of a deal"](#) is creating a rift between Washington and Kyiv. While Trump's team views the war as an expensive line item to be closed by July 4th, Ukrainian leadership views any deal without [firm security guarantees](#) as a temporary pause before a third Russian invasion. The US abstention at the UN and the sidelining of traditional diplomats in favor of "deal-makers" like Kushner and Witkoff suggests a [move away from values-based](#) foreign policy toward a tri-polar world order shared with Moscow and Beijing.

**The Psychology of a Long War** Ukrainian society has entered a "third phase" of [psycho-emotional exhaustion](#). The transition from the high-energy mobilization of 2022 to the current state of selective survival is manifesting in both high trust for "mythologized" military heroes and a [harsh skepticism](#) toward political elites. This "survivalist" mindset is now clashing with the influx of memes and "de-humanizing" humor regarding the Middle East escalation, which some analysts view as a [necessary psychological defense](#) mechanism for a population that has endured four years of terror.

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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### Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Expect a period of [extreme volatility in oil](#) and gas prices as the market digests the extent of damage to Persian Gulf infrastructure.
- Internal power struggles in Tehran are likely to result in [internecine violence](#) or a military coup as the IRGC attempts to maintain control without its supreme spiritual authority.
- Russia will likely launch a "revenge" wave of [strikes on Ukrainian water](#) and energy infrastructure to counter the humiliation of its allies' fall.

### Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- Intense pressure will be applied to the Zelenskyy administration to hold [elections or accept concessions](#) as the July 4th deadline approaches.
- The deployment of [multinational security forces](#) along the current line of contact in Ukraine will be debated as a compromise for NATO membership.
- China will likely consolidate its [economic hegemony over Russia](#), as Moscow loses its secondary partner in Iran and becomes solely dependent on Beijing for technology and markets.

### Long Term (1-5 Years)

- A successful democratic transition in Iran (possibly involving the [return of Prince Reza Pahlavi](#)) could fundamentally realign the Middle East, ending the "Axis" and isolating Russia.

- The EU will likely undergo a "different speeds" [integration process](#), where Ukraine gains partial membership status before 2030.
- The precedent of the US [seizing Maduro](#) and targeting Khamenei may lead to a more aggressive "anti-dictator" interventionist policy globally, despite Trump's isolationist rhetoric.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- Western nations must [harden security guarantees](#) for Ukraine immediately, as the US pivot toward transactionalism leaves Europe vulnerable to Russian future expansionism.
- The IAEA and international monitors should prepare for [uncontrolled nuclear proliferation](#) risks if Iranian scientists attempt to sell technology following the regime's collapse.
- A coordinated [global response to drone warfare](#) is required, using Ukrainian expertise to protect civilian centers in the Gulf and Europe.

### For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Energy Diversification:** Companies must accelerate their [exit from Persian Gulf dependencies](#) as the "safe haven" status of the UAE and Qatar has been shattered by Iranian retaliation.
- **Defense Sector Growth:** Investment in [low-cost mass-produced munitions](#) (like Ukraine's Flamingo or Russia's Item 30) will outpace high-cost legacy systems in the current attrition-based global environment.

- **Supply Chain Resilience:** Shipping routes through the [Strait of Hormuz](#) will remain high-risk for the foreseeable future; logistics should be rerouted to overland or alternative maritime paths despite higher costs.
